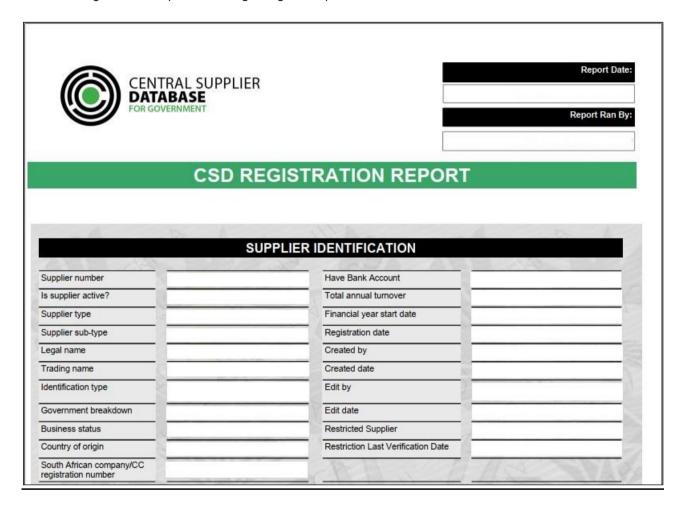

C3: SCPOPE OF WORK FOR THE MOITORING OF PUBLIC TRANSPORT SERVICES

C3.1 INTRODUCTION

C3.1.2 BACKGROUND

eThekwini Municipality, as part of its mandate to provide safe, affordable, and efficient public transport services, has entered contractual arrangements with selected transport operators to deliver scheduled services across the municipal area. To ensure the integrity and effectiveness of these contracts, the Municipality seeks to appoint a Supervising and Monitoring Firm (SMF) with the technical capacity and operational expertise to oversee the performance of the contracted service providers.

The appointed SMF will serve as an independent agent of the Municipality, responsible for verifying compliance with service obligations, validating operational and financial data, identifying and reporting non-compliance, and providing regular feedback to the Municipality to support contract enforcement and service improvement.

The scope of work includes daily operational monitoring, compliance auditing, verification of payment claims, management of fare and trip data, incident reporting, and the preparation of detailed performance reports. The SMF will also serve as a liaison between the Municipality and operators on contract-related performance matters, helping to ensure that the services meet defined standards for reliability, accessibility, safety, and customer satisfaction.

This appointment is part of a broader effort by eThekwini Municipality to strengthen oversight mechanisms, improve accountability, and ensure that public transport services contribute meaningfully to the City's strategic goals for mobility, inclusion, and economic growth

C3.1.2 PURPOSE OF THE DOCUMENT

The purpose of the document is to serve as a comprehensive procurement and contract document for the appointment of a professional service provider to carry out the Monitoring of the Public Transport Services for the eThekwini Municipality under the eThekwini Transport Authority.

C3.2 CITY'S OBJECTIVES

eThekwini Municipality is committed to transforming and modernising its public transport system to provide safe, reliable, affordable, and efficient services for all residents and visitors. In line with the Municipality's Integrated Public Transport Network (IPTN) strategy and broader developmental objectives, this project aims to support the implementation and enforcement of high-quality contracted transport services.

The objectives of the Municipality through the appointment of a Supervising and Monitoring Firm (SMF) are to:

C3.2.1 Ensure Service Delivery Compliance

Monitor and verify that contracted public transport operators deliver services strictly in line with their contractual obligations, including timetables, routes, vehicle specifications, and service quality standards.

C3.2.2 Promote Transparency and Accountability

Establish independent oversight mechanisms to validate operator performance, financial claims, and data reporting, ensuring public funds are used efficiently and appropriately.

C3.2.3 Improve Reliability and Quality of Services

Identify and address service gaps, delays, missed trips, and operator shortcomings through regular performance monitoring and feedback to enhance the commuter experience.

C3.2.4 Support Institutional Capacity

Strengthen the Municipality's ability to manage and enforce complex transport contracts by leveraging the expertise, systems, and technical support of the SMF.

C3.2.5 Protect Commuter Interests

Monitor passenger feedback, complaints, and incidents to ensure that operators are responsive to public concerns and provide safe, accessible and respectful services to all, including people with special mobility needs.

C3.2.6 Enable Data-Driven Decision Making

Generate accurate and timely operational data to support planning, policy decisions, contract adjustments, and the progressive rollout of the City's integrated transport network.

C3.2.7 Support Sustainability and Expansion

Contribute to the long-term sustainability of the contracted public transport model by ensuring that performance standards are met, risks are mitigated, and continuous improvement is embedded in operations.

C3.4 DESCRIPTION OF WORK REQUIRED

The appointed Supervising and Monitoring Firm (SMF) will be required to provide comprehensive oversight and monitoring services for public transport operations delivered under contract within eThekwini Municipality's jurisdiction.

C3.4.1 General Expectations

eThekwini Municipality expects the appointed Supervising and Monitoring Firm (SMF) to operate with the highest standards of professionalism, integrity, technical competence, and impartiality in fulfilling its responsibilities. The following principles and expectations shall apply:

C3.4.1.1 Independence and Objectivity

The SMF shall act independently of the contracted operators and shall avoid any conflict of interest, whether direct or perceived.

All findings, assessments, and recommendations must be based solely on evidence and performance data.

C3.4.1.2 Confidentiality and Data Security

The SMF must treat all operational and financial data, documents, and correspondence related to the Municipality and contracted operators as confidential.

Appropriate measures must be taken to protect electronic systems and databases against unauthorised access or loss.

C3.4.1.3 Responsiveness and Communication

The SMF must maintain open and timely communication with the Municipality, including immediate reporting of critical incidents or breaches.

Queries or requests for clarification from the Municipality must be addressed promptly and professionally.

C3.4.1.4 Capacity and Resource Availability

The SMF must ensure that sufficient staff, systems, vehicles, and equipment are available throughout the contract period to maintain uninterrupted monitoring coverage.

Any changes in key personnel must be approved by the Municipality in writing.

C3.4.1.1.5 Quality and Timeliness of Deliverables

Reports must be submitted on time, using formats and structures agreed upon with the Municipality.

All outputs must be clear, accurate, and supported by evidence (e.g., field data, system reports, inspection records).

C3.4.1.6 Compliance with Laws and Municipal Policies

The SMF must comply with all applicable national legislation, municipal by-laws, transport regulations, and contractual obligations.

The firm must operate in alignment with the Municipality's values, codes of conduct, and ethical standards.

C3.4.1.7 Continuous Improvement

The SMF is expected to proactively identify areas for improvement in both the operator's performance and the Municipality's monitoring framework.

Innovation in data analysis, reporting, or operational oversight is encouraged where it adds value.

C3.4.2 Activities

C3.4.2.1 Operational Oversight

- Conduct daily monitoring of contracted bus services to verify adherence to scheduled routes, departure/arrival times, frequencies, and vehicle assignments.
- Identify and document non-compliant trips (e.g. missed, delayed, early, short-routed) and recommend appropriate remedial actions.
- Monitor fleet availability, driver allocation, and depot-level operations through site visits and real-time tracking.

C3.4.2.2 Performance Monitoring

- Measure operator performance against agreed key performance indicators (KPIs), including reliability, punctuality, safety, vehicle condition, accessibility, and cleanliness.
- Conduct regular inspections and submit structured reports on service quality and contract compliance.

C3.4.2.3 Financial Verification

• Validate operator monthly claims, including fixed and variable costs, against actual service delivery data (e.g. waybills, fare validation records, vehicle logs).

Ensure that only legitimate, contracted kilometres and trips are claimed and that deductions
are made for non-performance where applicable.

C3.4.2.4 Data Management and Systems Integration

- Maintain accurate and auditable records of daily trip logs, inspection results, vehicle compliance, and operator reports.
- Integrate data from electronic fare validation equipment (EFVE), GPS tracking, and operator duty schedules into a secure and standardised monitoring database.
- Support the Municipality in establishing a reliable data platform for decision-making.

C3.4.2.5 Incident and Complaint Tracking

- Log and investigate service-related incidents, commuter complaints, vehicle breakdowns, safety issues, and any violations of service standards.
- Track operator response actions and resolution timelines, and recommend penalties where applicable.
- Produce monthly summaries of incidents and trends.

C3.4.2.5 Reporting and Recommendations

- Submit verified monthly monitoring reports summarising operational findings, financial validations, service anomalies, and improvement actions.
- Produce quarterly and annual performance reviews.
- Recommend penalties or incentives based on contract terms and performance levels.

C3.4.2.5 Support to the Municipality

- Attend monthly review meetings with the Municipality and contracted operators.
- Provide expert advice on performance improvement, contract enforcement, risk mitigation, and compliance matters.

C3.4.2.6 Technical Systems and Tools

- **C3.4.2.6.1** The SMF must have access to and/or deploy the following systems and tools:
 - Data Management Platform: A secure and structured system for collecting, storing, and analysing operational and financial data.
 - **Electronic Fare Equipment Integration Tools**: Ability to interface with or extract data from electronic fare validation and ticketing systems.
 - **GPS Tracking and Analysis Capability**: To assess vehicle movement, trip completion, route adherence, and timetable compliance.
 - **Field Inspection Devices**: Tablets or mobile tools for inspectors to record real-time observations and upload data.

 Secure Document Repository: For confidential reports, waybills, claims data, and correspondence with the Municipality. The SMF must have reliable transport for field inspectors to access depots, stops, and routes across the municipal area daily.

C3.4.2.6.2 Vehicles and Logistics Adequate

 Office space and communications infrastructure must be in place to support coordination, analysis, and reporting functions.

C3.4.2.6.3 Training and Onboarding

- All SMF personnel must be trained on the Municipality's public transport contract terms, performance standards, and applicable legislation within the first month of contract start.
- Refresher training and performance calibration must be conducted at least once every 6 months or as required by the Municipality.

The SMF must operate independently and impartially and must be adequately resourced to carry out continuous monitoring throughout the contract period. All findings, reports, and recommendations must be based on verifiable evidence and align with the Municipality's transport policy, contractual frameworks, and public interest.

F.1.1 Actions

- **F.1.1.1** The employer and each tenderer submitting a tender offer shall comply with these conditions of tender. In their dealings with each other, they shall discharge their duties and obligations as set out in F.2 and F.3, timeously and with integrity, and behave equitably, honestly and transparently, comply with all legal obligations and not engage in anticompetitive practices.
- **F.1.1.2** The employer and the tenderer and all their agents and employees involved in the tender process shall avoid conflicts of interest and where a conflict of interest is perceived or known, declare any such conflict of interest, indicating the nature of such conflict. Tenderers shall declare any potential conflict of interest in their tender submissions. Employees, agents and advisors of the employer shall declare any conflict of interest to whoever is responsible for overseeing the procurement process at the start of any deliberations relating to the procurement process or as soon as they become aware of such conflict, and abstain from any decisions where such conflict exists or recuse themselves from the procurement process, as appropriate.

Note:

- 1) A conflict of interest may arise due to a conflict of rotes which might provide an incentive for improper acts in stans abconsistences. A conflict of interest can create on apparatures of aquapriety that can work mine confidence in the ability of that person to act properly in his or her position even if no improper acts result.
- 2) Conflicts of interest in respect of those engaged in the pronounced process include direct, indirect or family interests in the tender or occurrence of the procurement process and any personal bian, inclination, obligation, allegiance in locally which would in one any affect any decisions taken.
- **F.1.1.3** The employer shall not seek and a tenderer shall not submit a tender without having a firm intention and the capacity to proceed with the contract.

F.1.2 Tender Documents

The documents issued by the employer for the purpose of a tender offer are listed in the tender data.

F.1.3 Interpretation

- F.1.3.1 The tender data and additional requirements contained in the tender schedules that are included in the returnable documents are deemed to be part of these conditions of tender.
- **F.1.3.2** These conditions of tender, the tender data and tender schedules which are only required for tender evaluation purposes, shall not form part of any contract arising from the invitation to tender.
- F.1.3.3 For the purposes of these conditions of tender, the following definitions apply:
- a) conflict of interest means any situation in which:
 - someone in a position of trust has competing professional or personal interests which make it difficult to fulfill his or her duties impartially;
 - an individual or organisation is in a position to exploit a professional or official capacity in some way for their personal or corporate benefit; or
