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# 1. BACKGROUND

The Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone (TASEZ) is co-owned by the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition (the DTIC), the Gauteng Provincial Government (GPG) and the City of Tshwane Municipality (CoT).

TASEZ is registered in terms of the Companies Act No 71 of 2008 and it is the Operator of the Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone in terms of the Special Economic Zones Act 16 of 2014. TASEZ is situated east of Pretoria City in Silverton. It aims to offer a diversity of appropriate land uses and other economic activities. According to a report to the parliamentary committee on economic development and trade in November 2024, **the dtic** noted that the cumulative investments into South Africa's SEZs exceeded R30-billion and created over 27 000 jobs. The purpose of the SEZ programme is to:

- Expand the strategic industrialisation focus to cover diverse regional development needs and context;
- Provide a clear, predictable and systemic planning framework for the development of a wider array of SEZs to support industrial policy objectives;
- Clarify and strengthen governance arrangements, expand the range and quality of support measure beyond provision of infrastructure; and
- Provide a framework for a predictable financing framework to enable long term planning.

Little is known in the public domain about these instruments of socio-economic change.

The TASEZ Skills Development Team wishes to appoint a service provider for the Health and Safety Trainings to a total of 140 individuals from around TASEZ targeted areas. Duration will be up to 5 days for each intervention, and the training should be conducted before end of Q3 FY2025/26.

#### 2. INIVITATION TO SUBMIT A QUOTATION

TASEZ is a flagship SEZ whose mandate is to stimulate investment in the automotive sector, drive industrial development and create employment. As such it must maintain a cohesive, credible and strategically aligned public profile across traditional and digital communication platforms.

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# 3. SCOPE OF WORK

TASEZ seeks to appoint a competent service provider to provide training for a total of 140 individuals for the different training outlined below: targeting SMMEs and individuals from the TASEZ operational areas. These Training opportunities will also be extended to Tenant's employees at the zone as per their skills gaps.

A total of 7 trainings interventions has been identified, and each training will be conducted to 20 individuals for each training intervention.

- The training should be conducted by a service provider at a Training Centre during the required days.
- The facilitation will be a face-to-face training using workbooks and related practical activities divided into categories of competencies.
- Service provider must provide accredited training programs with QCTO unit standards.

The table below provides training interventions for implementation in Q3. The exact dates for implementation will; be confirmed upon approval and completion of SCM processes.

- e. Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error, or inconsistency in the RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all Bidders without attribution to the Bidders who provided the written notice.
- f. All people (including Bidders) obtaining or receiving the RFQ and any other information in connection with the RFQ must keep the contents of the RFQ and other such information confidential and not disclose or use the information except as required for the purpose of developing a response to the RFQ.

#### 4. LATE SUBMISSION

- a. Late responses to the RFQ will not be accepted.

- c. Any time or date in this RFQ is subject to change at TASEZ's discretion. 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# 1. General Conditions

1.1. The following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

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1.1.1. the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000000 (all applicable taxes included); and

1.1.2. the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

#### 1.2. Price and B-BBEE Points

- 1.2.1. If the value of this bid does not exceed <u>R50 000 000.00</u> (all applicable taxes included), the <u>80/20</u> preference point system shall be applicable; or
- 1.2.2. If the value of this bid exceeds **R50 000 000.00** (all applicable taxes included), the **90/10** preference point system will be applicable.

- 1.5. Failure on the part of a bidder to submit proof of B-BBEE Status level of contributor together with the bid, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE status level of contribution are not claimed.
- 1.6. The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

#### 2. Definitions

- 2.1. "B-BBEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.2. "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

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2.3. "Bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;

- 2.4. "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- 2.5. "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.6. "functionality" means the ability of a Bidder to provide goods or services in accordance with specifications as set out in the tender documents.
- 2.7. "Prices" includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- 2.8. "Proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor" means:
  - 2.8.1. B-BBEE Status level certificate issued by an authorized body or person;
  - 2.8.2. A sworn affidavit as prescribed by the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice;
  - 2.8.3. Any other requirement prescribed in terms of the B-BBEE Act;
- 2.9. "QSE" means a qualifying small business enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.10. "Rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;

# DECLARATION CERTIFICATE FOR LOCAL PRODUCTION AND CONTENT FOR DESIGNATED **SECTORS**

This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids invited. It contains general information and serves as a declaration form for local content (local production and local content are used interchangeably).

Before completing this declaration, Bidder must study the General Conditions, Definitions, Directives applicable in respect of Local Content as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011, the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) approved technical specification number SATS 1286:2011 (Edition 1) and the Guidance on the Calculation of Local Content together with the Local Content Declaration Templates [Annex C (Local Content Declaration: Summary Schedule), D (Imported Content Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annex C) and E (Local Content Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annex C)].

### 1. General Conditions

- 1.1. Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 (Regulation 9) makes provision for the promotion of local production and content.

  - 1.6.2. the bidder fails to declare that the Local Content Declaration Templates (Annex C, D and E) have been audited and certified as correct.

#### 2. Definitions

- "bid" includes written price quotations, advertised competitive bids or proposals;
- 2.2. "bid price" price offered by the bidder, excluding value added tax (VAT);
- 2.3. "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;

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2.4. "designated sector" means a sector, sub-sector or industry that has been designated by the Department of Trade and Industry in line with national development and industrial policies for local production, where only locally produced services, works or goods or locally manufactured goods meet the stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content;

"imported content" means that portion of the bid price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or its Sub-Contractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad (this includes labour or intellectual property costs), plus freight and other direct importation costs, such as landing costs, dock duties, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African port of entry;
