DETAILED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

1. COMPANY OVERVIEW

South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC) is a Public Entity founded in August 1936 and listed in terms of Schedule 2 of the Public Finance Management Act, Act No. 1 of 1999, as a public broadcaster in South Africa, and provides 19 radio stations as well as five television broadcasts to the general public.

2. BACKGROUND

SABC Transport department administers shuttle services for the clients. The clients consist of SABC employees and guests that conduct business with the SABC. Some clients may travel after working hours between 19h00 and 4h00 and these late trips are ad hoc. The late trips are determined by production schedules and/or timing of the flights.

To ensure reliable and safe transportation of clients, it is necessary to acquire shuttle services to transport employees and SABC guests.

The SABC seeks to appoint a service provider to render shuttle service as and when required.

3. REQUIREMENTS

This RFQ calls for quotations to provide the shuttle services for SABC clients on and ad hoc basis for a period of three years.

The scope of works as stated below:

The service provider must have access to

- One vehicle with 14-to-28-seater (Crew bus).
- One Sedan vehicle with big boot
- Roadworthy vehicles with safety features i.e valid license disc, tyres with good threads, no damages to the body of the vehicle
- Provide valid copy of the RC1 for each vehicle (code 3 not acceptable).
- Vehicles must have mileage less than 80 000 kilometres and less than 5 years old at commencement of the agreement.
- Branded vehicle
- Qualified driver with more than three years' driving experience and ability to read maps.
- Valid professional driver permit (PrDP) for each driver
- Valid driver's license for each driver
- Uniformed drivers
- Contactable drivers
- Passenger liability insurance cover]
- Available in 30 minutes for any emergency requests

- Bill SABC per trip and consolidated on a monthly invoice.
- The supplier must be at the pick-up point 15 minutes before call time for all pre-planned trips.
- The supplier must provide vehicle insurance cover for business if the vehicle does not have passenger liability cover.
- The supplier must be within Gauteng borders however trips will be crossing to other provinces i.e Sun City or Mpumalanga
- Google Maps will be utilized to calculate the distance of the trip from pick up point to drop off point (Shortest route as per Google Maps will be utilized)

3.1 Phase One: Mandatory Requirements

All bid respondents must submit mandatory documents that comply with all mandatory requirements. Bids that do not fully comply with the mandatory requirements will be disqualified and will not be considered for further evaluation.

3.2 Phase two: Functionality Criteria

Bidders should note that only bidders who met the mandatory documents of the bid will be evaluated further using a predetermined set of evaluation criteria. The evaluation criteria are designed to reflect the SABC's requirements in terms of identifying a suitable service provider and ensure the selection process is transparent and afford all the bidders a fair opportunity for evaluation and selection.

3.3 Phase three: Site Visit

Bidders should note that only bidders who met the functionality criteria will be evaluated under phase three.

3.4 Specific Goals

Bidders should note that only bidders who met the site inspection will be evaluated on Specific Goals (Price and BBEE).

3.5 Objective Criteria

The SABC further reserve the right not to award this RFQ to any bidder based on the proven poor record of accomplishment of the bidder in previous projects within the SABC.

Bidders who are blacklisted or have committed other acts of fraud and misrepresentation of facts e.g., tax compliance, BBEE, company financials, etc. will be eliminated from the bid process.

8. CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED WHEN TENDERING

8.1.1 The Corporation does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, nor shall it be responsible for or pay any expenses or losses which may be incurred by the Tenderer in the preparation and delivery of his tender. The Corporation reserves the right to accept a separate tender or separate tenders for any one or more of the sections of a specification. The corporation also reserves the right to withdraw the tender at any stage.

8.1.2 No tender shall be deemed to have been accepted unless and until a formal contract / letter of intent is prepared and executed.

8.1.3 The Corporation reserves the right to:

Not evaluate and award submissions that do not comply strictly with his RFQ document.

Make a selection solely on the information received in the submissions and

8.1.4 Enter into negotiations with any one or more of preferred bidder(s) based on the criteria specified in the evaluation of this tender.

8.1.5 Contact any bidder during the evaluation process, in order to clarify any information, without informing any other bidders. During the evaluation process, no change in the content of the RFQ shall be sought, offered or permitted.

2 SUB-CONTRACTING

- 2.1 A person awarded a contract may only enter into a subcontracting arrangement with the approval of the organ of state.
- 2.2 A person awarded a contract in relation to a designated sector, may not subcontract in such a manner that the local production and content of the overall value of the contract is reduced to below the stipulated minimum threshold.
