The successful bidder will be responsible for:

3.1. Supply and Installation:

- Providing up to two (2) new, high-quality coffee and tea vending machines.
- Installing the machine at designated workplaces or moving to another building if need be.
- Ensuring proper electrical and water connections.
- Providing user training to designated staff.

3.2. Weekly Stock Replenishment:

- Regularly replenishing all necessary supplies (coffee, tea, milk, sugar, cups, stirrers, etc.).
- Maintaining adequate stock levels to prevent machine downtime.
- Managing stock rotation to ensure freshness.

3.3. Regular Servicing and Maintenance:

- Providing regular preventative maintenance to ensure optimal machine performance.
- Responding promptly to service calls for repairs or troubleshooting.
- Ensuring compliance with all relevant health and safety regulations.
- Providing a service log for machines.

1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.
