1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this RFQ is to appoint a suitable service provider to **Supply, Install Steel Cage Generator Room** at Golden Gate Highlands National Park, Clarens, Free State.

2. BACKGROUND

South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003); with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: public entities.

SANParks' operations are totally guided by its vision statement and mission statement. As a public entity, the organisation is committed to act in pursuance of transformation of South Africa's society in support of entrenching South Africa's democracy. In this regard, the organisation has adopted a transformation mission to guide its efforts accordingly.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The service provider will be responsible **Supply, Install Steel Cage Structure Generator Room** as per or equivalent to the below description:

4. Deliverables

- 4.1. Supply and Install x2 steel cage structure generator room

5. The Service provider shall demonstrate the following competencies

- 5.1. Ability to deliver the required products within the specified period.
- 5.2. Must be registered with CIDB for 1ME Class or Higher.
- 5.3. Must comply with the requirements of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act (COIDA) (As Amended)

6. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 6.1. Only locally produced or locally manufactured steel products and components for construction with the stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content will be considered.
- 6.2. If the quantity of steel products and components for construction required cannot be wholly sourced from South African based manufacturers and/or at the designated local content threshold as stipulated in a scope of work, bidders and or producing entities should obtain written approval from **the DTIC**. **The DTIC**, in consultation with the procuring organ of state and the local industry, will consider the exemption applications on a case-by-case basis- and will consider the following:
 - Required volumes in the particular bid;
 - Available collective SA industry manufacturing capacity at that time; delivery times;
 - Availability of input materials and components;
 - Technical considerations including operating conditions;

- Materials of construction; and
- Security of supply

- 6.3. Bidders must clearly indicate in their bids the quantities to be supplied and the level of local content for each product.
- 6.4. The exchange rate to be used for the calculation of local production and content must be the exchange rate published by the South African Reserve Bank (SARB) at 12:00 on the date of advertisement of the bid; and
- 6.5. Only the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) approved technical specification number SATS 1286:2011 must be used to calculate local content
- 6.6. The local content (LC) expressed as a percentage of the bid price must be calculated in accordance with the SABS approved technical specification number SATS 1286: 2011 as follows:

$$LC = [1 - x / y] * 100$$

Where x: is the imported content in Rand
y: is the bid price in Rand excluding value added tax (VAT)

(in the case of turnkey products/projects x and y will only refer to the value to steel products and components in the project)

Prices referred to in the determination of x must be converted to Rand (ZAR) by using the exchange rate published by the SARB at 12:00 on the date of advertisement of the bid.

- 6.7. SABS approved technical specification number SATS 1286:2011 and the Guidance on calculation of Local Content together with the Local Content Declaration Templates i.e. Annexure C for Local Content Declaration: Summary Schedule, Annexure D for Imported Content Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annexure C, Annexure E for Local Content Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annexure C. - 6.8. The Declaration Annexures for Local Production and Content (Annexures C, D and E) must be completed, duly signed and submitted by the bidder at the closing date and time of the bid.
- 6.9. Bidders must submit a certificate from a registered auditor confirming that the Local Content Declaration Templates have been audited and certified a correct; and
- 6.10. The rates of exchanged quoted by the bidder in the Declaration Annexures will be verified for accuracy.
- 6.11. A bid may be disqualified if
- 6.11.1. the bidder fails to achieve the stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content unless written exemption has been granted to the bidder by the DTIC to bid at a lower local content level; and
- 6.11.2. the Declaration Annexures for Local Content and the registered auditors' certificate referred to in paragraph 6.9 are not submitted as part of the bid documentation.

4.1 In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:

4.2 In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

- a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
- b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,
- then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.
