### Bay unemployment rate lowest since 2015

A downward trend in the unemployment rate in Nelson Mandela Bay continues, marking the lowest since 2015 with joblessness down to 24.5% in the third quarter of 2024.

This marks a decrease of 6.4 percentage points from the previous quarter when the unemployment rate stood at 30.9%.

Job increases in the city were recorded in the formal sector.

This is according to Stats SA's quarterly labour force survey released yesterday.

It showed the Eastern Cape had recorded an increase of 83,000 jobs.

The official unemployment rate in the province dropped to 37.2% in the third quarter from 41%.

Construction, agriculture, community and social services recorded the most gains while finance and private houses showed decreases.

The expanded unemployment rate dropped to 47.4% — down 7.5 percentage points

The largest decreases were recorded in North West (4.5 percentage points), followed by the Eastern Cape (3.8 percentage points) and Western Cape (2.6 percentage points).

Increases in the unemployment rate were recorded in Limpopo (1.2 percentage points) and KwaZulu-Natal (0.1 of a percentage point).

Business chamber chief executive Denise van Huyssteen said the survey results for Nelson Mandela Bay presented a surprisingly optimistic reduction in the official unemployment rate.

"This is the lowest unemployment rate since 2015," Van Huyssteen said.

"There were no major economic developments in the last quarter which would have reduced the unemployment rate by over 6 percentage points."

"In fact, the local manufacturing sector is under severe pressure, and as a result of volume reductions has in some instances placed employees on short time and/or undertaken job reductions."

"Considering the very seri-
