DETAILED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

1. BACKGROUND

The underground tanks are located at the TVOB parking and at the back gate, Wash Bay section. Both dousers have not been in operation for over 20 years and have since accumulated rust over this period. The existence and condition of these tanks is non-compliant with the Occupational Health and Safety Act and Building Regulations, hence this request to decommission them appropriately.

Furthermore, the Region has previous audit findings on the old underground tanks; therefore, it is highly recommended that this project be executed successfully to eliminate another finding in the next Financial Year.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

Appointment of a competent company to decommission the petroleum underground tanks.

- Obtain permission from the Local Authority to decommission the tanks and piping.
- Both underground tanks to be filled with concrete slurry.
- Once the decommission is complete then submit a signed confirmation to the Local Authority.
- decommissioning of two underground petrol and diesel tanks, as per SANS10089-3.
- Backfilling material accordance to SANS 10089-3:2010 Clean, sieved subsoil or sand specified grading
- Disposal of corroded dousers, piping, and removal of rubble away from site.
- Clearing of the site.
- Disposal certificate is required

2.1 Health and Safety

The supplier will be required to provide health and safety file including insurance and proof of workers compensation letter (letter of good standing with DoL), workers educational certificates (i.e., trade tests, etc) and experience, risk assessment(s), and method statement(s), legal appointments, etc.

As part of the project the contractor must include environmental impact assessment before and after the execution of the project.

• The work will be strictly executed as per OHS Act requirements, H&S regulations applicable to the Construction Industry, and SABC H&S policy and specifications.

2.2 Un-Interrupted Work

- The Contractor is required to work continuously on the Contract Works throughout the duration of such works, based on a five-day working week. Permission may be obtained from the SABC representative to work weekends subject to SABC's approval.
- All labour and any other cost incurred in connection with such weekend work will be for the Contractor's account.

One nominated SABC representative will give instructions for stop-page of noisy work only. In such instances, work will proceed on activities that will not disturb the environment. The instruction to stop noisy work will only be given by the authorized SABC appointee. The site supervisor will be responsible to schedule work accordingly. The stoppage will be recorded in the site book.

3. CONTRACT DOCUMENTATION

3.1. This contract is a once off project.

4. LOCATION OF SITE

4.1. The Contract site is at SABC Durban, KZN

6. CONTRACT WORKS AREA

- **6.1** The Contractor shall confine his activities to the Contract Works site and the access route to this site.
- **6.2** A list of names of working staff and ID proof will be submitted to the SABC. Workers will wear clothing clearly identifying the identity of the supplier.
- **6.3** The site area is inside a broadcasting environment; therefore, care should be taken to reduce noise and dust when executing the work

7. COSTING

The quotation must reflect a detailed cost breakdown, and any indirect costs with the rendering of the service.

8. EVALUATION CRITERIA

8.1. BBBEE and Price

• The RFQ responses will be evaluated on the 80/20-point system.

8.2. Technical Evaluation

- The tender submission will be technically evaluated out of a maximum of 90.
- A threshold of 45 out of the 90 has been set.
- All bidders achieving less than the set threshold will be declared non-responsive.

8.3. Objective Criteria

 SABC further reserve the right not to award this RFQ to any bidder based on the proven poor record of accomplishment of the bidder in previous projects within the SABC.

9. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 9.1. The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder.
- 9.2. Preference points shall be calculated after process has been brought to a comparative basis considering all factors of non-firm prices.
- 9.3. In the event that two or more bids have scored equal pints, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.

- 9.4. However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 9.5. Should two or more bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

- 10.1. Bidders who qualify as EME's in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by a verification Agency accredited by SANAS for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates or DTI Affidavit.
- 10.2. Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status levels verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a verification agency accredited by SANAS.
- 10.3. A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.

- 10.4. A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 10.5. Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 10.6. A tenderer will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended Sub-contractor is an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 10.7. A tenderer awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.

11. COMMUNICATION

Respondents are warned that a response will be disqualified should any attempt be made by a tenderer either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer(s) or employees of SABC in respect of a tender, between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.

- 12.1.  - (b) geographical area where product or service will be rendered (market allocation)
 - (c) methods, factors or formulas used to calculate prices;
 - (d) the intention or decision to submit or not to submit, a bid;
 - (e) the submission of a bid which does not meet the specifications and conditions of the bid; or
 - (f) bidding with the intention not to win the bid.
- 8. In addition, there have been no consultations, communications, agreements or arrangements with any competitor regarding the quality, quantity, specifications and conditions or delivery particulars of the products or services to which this bid invitation relates.
- 9. The terms of the accompanying bid have not been, and will not be, disclosed by the bidder, directly or indirectly, to any competitor, prior to the date and time of the official bid opening or of the awarding of the contract.
