## **SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE SUPPLY OF COVERALL TWO PIECE GENERAL ASSISTANT GREEN**

### **GENERAL**

1. **General Bid Conditions (GBCs) and General Conditions of Contract (GCC).** The conditions contained in GBCs and the GCC's and all other conditions will apply.
2. **Special conditions on the Award Of Bid.** The South African Air Force (SAAF) reserves the right to award a bid as a whole to one bidder.
3. **Break-out procurement.** The SAAF reserves the right to, in support of government initiative to promote Small Business and in accordance with the National Small Business Act, 1996 (Act no 102 of 1996), consider the breakout of procurement into smaller segments. This implies that the bid can be allocated to more than one contractor, in manageable segments, and according to the predetermined capacity of smaller enterprises. The department will in all cases indicate the intention, elsewhere in the bid document, to apply the breakout procurement principles.

### **STANDARDS**

4. **Capability Report.** It is a condition of this bid that all bidders submit a manufacturing capability report not older than twelve (12) months with the bid documents at the closing date and time of the bid. The full capability report must be issued by an organisation accredited or recognised by the South African National Accreditation System (SANAS) and must indicate whether the bidder/manufacturer has the capability and capacity to manufacture the product(s)/items. The capability report has to address the following requirements.
  - a. Production capacity and capability.
  - b. List of items/products produced in the company.
  - c. Company organisation.

### 9.1 Jackets

#### 9.1.1 Fronts

Fronts to:

- ♦ fasten with a concealed slide fastener

Each front to:

- ♦ have a side patch pocket
- ♦ have a facing
- ♦ have a lapel step of 35 mm

Left front to:

- ♦ have a breast pocket with a flap
- ♦ have an extended front edge, forming a flap that conceals the slide fastener
  - overlap to be of finished width 20 mm (measured from centre front to the outer edge of the overlap)
  - stitched down 30 mm and 35 mm from the front edge respectively

Right front to:

- ♦ have an extended front edge
  - to extend 20 mm beyond centre front

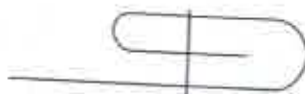

- ♦ be white woven rayon labels that are printed
- ♦ comply with SANS 1309 "Printed labels for textiles"
  - information to be in legible and indelible block letters of height at least 3 mm
- ♦ permanently secured
- ♦ be such that they outlast the garments (including the markings)

### 11.2 Care-labelling






- ♦ Each garment to have a label that is permanently secured
  - to provide appropriate care instructions (in accordance with SANS 10011 "Care-labelling of textile piece-goods, textile articles and clothing" and table 7) in words and symbols
  - to provide the fibre composition of the fabric in accordance with the requirements of SANS 10235 "Fibre content labelling of textiles and textile products"

### 11.3 Marking

- ♦ Each jacket to have, sewn in with the collar at the centre back on the inside, and each trousers to have, sewn in with the waistband lining on the inside, a label that provides the following information:
  - the National Stock Number (see tables 3 and 4)
  - the size designation
  - the manufacturer's name or trade mark or both
  - the year of manufacture
  - the VAT no of the contractor
  - the country of origin, i.e. "Made in RSA"

## 12. Packing and marking of packaging

### 12.1 Packing

#### 12.1.1 The workwear suits shall be:

- delivered in a commercially dry condition
- so packed that they will not be damaged in transit or in storage
- neatly folded and individually packed (jacket and trousers) in a plastics envelope of suitable size and shape
- unless otherwise specified in the order or contract, acceptably packed (in units of 10) for transit in acceptable bulk containers that comply with the requirements of SALM 108, "Corrugated board boxes for clothing"

#### 12.1.2 Workwear suits:

- of the same size designation to be packed together in a bulk container (unless quantities ordered are such that packing together of the same size designation only is not justified)
- of different size designations may also be packed together to accommodate the last part of an order or contract

### 12.2 Marking of packaging

#### 12.2.1 Plastics envelopes:

Each plastics envelope to be clearly marked with the following information:

- the designation, i.e. "Two-piece workwear suit"
- the size designation
- National Stock Number

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### 12.2.2 Bulk containers:

Each bulk container shall have a label securely attached to the outside. This label shall be visible when the containers are stacked and shall provide the following information in legible and indelible block letters:

- the manufacturer's name or trade mark or both
- the designation, i.e. "Two-piece workwear suit"
- the National Stock Number (see table 3)
- the year of manufacture
- the quantity and order number
- the size designation
- the mass of the packed container

### 12.3 Additional marking

When so required by the South African Air Force, suits, trousers, envelopes or containers (or any combination of these) to bear information additional to that specified above.

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## ANNEX A

(Normative)

### Special conditions of tender

#### A-1 GENERAL

- A-1.1** Unless otherwise stated, the South African Bureau of Standards, shall be the inspecting authority.
- A-1.2** Three pre-production sample suits of different size designations shall have been inspected, tested and approved by the inspecting authority before bulk production is commenced. Each one of these samples shall be accompanied by a trim chart containing a sample of each component material (as given in 6) and the relevant certificates. It shall be the duty of the manufacturer to give adequate notice to the inspecting authority of the availability of these samples.
- A-1.3** The suits shall be subject to inspection during the course of manufacture. The inspector shall, during normal working hours, be given all reasonable facilities for carrying out his duties and shall have the right of entry into the contractor's factory and the factory or works of any subcontractor where work on suits supplied to this specification may be in progress.
- A-1.4** The contractor shall inspect the finished suits for compliance with the specification before submitting them to the inspecting authority for final inspection.
- A-1.5** Before acceptance, the suits shall have been inspected and tested by the inspecting authority and found to comply with the requirements of the specification.

#### A-2 DOCUMENTATION

One container of each consignment shall be marked "DOCUMENTS" and in addition to the suits, shall contain the following:

- a) The packaging slip or delivery note;
- b) where applicable the inspection certificate(s);
- c) a copy of the invoice containing the following information:
  - the order number
  - the financial authority number
  - a full description of the consignment, i.e. National stock number, quantity, etc.

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## ANNEX B

(Normative)

### CKS 129 Colours

Due to the fact that colours can change over a period of time, any colour standard which has been registered for a period of SEVEN YEARS or more shall be considered obsolete. These standards shall then be allocated an archived status (as opposed to current status) and re-registration shall be required.

**A. The following scenarios require a submission of three metres of fabric from the successful tenderer:**

1. A colour standard is archived.
2. First time registration is required (CKS 129 colour number does not exist).
3. Colour swatch stock at the SABS is no longer available.

**B. Requirements regarding the submission of fabric as identified in A:**

1. The colour shall be as agreed upon between the South African Air Force and the successful tenderer.
2. The fabric shall be used to make new colour swatches which shall be the responsibility of the SABS.
3. The cost of the three metres of fabric shall be incorporated in the relevant tender submission.
