1.6 LATE BIDS

1.6.1 Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived only one second after 11h00 or any time thereafter. Bids arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances. Bidders are therefore strongly advised to ensure that bids be sent allowing enough time for any unforeseen events that may delay the delivery of the bid.

1.7 NEGOTIATION

- 1.7.1 SASSETA has the right to enter into a negotiation with a prospective service provider.
- 1.7.2 A contract will only be deemed to be concluded when reduced to writing in a contract form signed by the designated responsible person of both parties.

1.8 REASONS FOR REJECTION

- 1.8.1 SASSETA shall reject a bid for the award of a contract if the recommended bidder has committed a proven corrupt or fraudulent act in competing for the particular contract.
- 1.8.2 SASSETA shall disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of itsdirectors:
 - 1.8.2.1 have abused the Supply Chain Management systems of SASSETA.
 - 1.8.2.2 have committed proven fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such systems.
 - 1.8.2.3 have failed to perform on any previous contract and the proof exists.
 - 1.8.2.4 Such actions shall be communicated to the National Treasury.

2. TERMS OF REFERENCE

2.1 INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 2.1.1 SASSETA is one of the twenty-one (21) Sector Education and Training Authorities (SETAs) established in terms of the Skills Development Act (Act 97 of 1998) as amended. SASSETA is among the SETAs that were reestablished in the "New SETA Landscape" by the Minister of Higher Education and Training from 01 April 2020 to 31 March 2030.
- 2.1.2 The ETQA has signed Service Level Agreement (SLA) with Quality Council for Trades and Occupation (QCTO) and needs to embark on the process of appointing Subject Matter Experts (SME) Facilitators that will be working with the different stakeholders to develop and re-align SASSETA Qualifications.

2.2 PURPOSE

- 2.2.1 The purpose of this Request for Proposals is to appoint a pool/panel of ten (10) SME Facilitators to develop new, re-align and review SASSETA legacy qualifications until 31 March 2030.
- 2.2.2 All occupational qualifications and part qualifications, including realigned pre-2009 qualifications and unit standards should comply with the Occupational Qualifications Sub Framework (OQSF) Policy and the Ministerial Determination.
- 2.2.3 Competent and experienced SME Facilitators are needed for the occupational qualification development, the re-alignment and review process to ensure qualifications are submitted to the QCTO for SAQA registration.

2.3 SCOPE OF WORK

- 2.3.1 An SME Facilitator would work in an occupational qualification environment as follows:
 - 2.3.1.1 Develop, re-align and review occupational qualifications and skills programmes
 - 2.3.1.2 Develop, review Qualification Assessment Specification document (QAS) for registered occupationally qualifications with one (1) EISA exemplar
 - 2.3.1.3 Capture and input data from stakeholders,
 - 2.3.1.4 Engage with the Quality Partners
 - 2.3.1.5 Facilitate the process of developing the qualification with the identified Quality Partners and relevant Industry partners/ experts,

2.4 REQUIRED DELIVERABLES

- 2.4.1 The following are the deliverables:
 - 2.4.1.1 Scoping and profiling
 - 2.4.1.2 Module development process
 - 2.4.1.3 Develop and finalise occupational curriculum document on completion of new, realigned or review of a qualification
 - 2.4.1.4 Developed and finalised Qualification document on completion of the re-alignment, development and review of the qualification Development of assessment specification document
 - 2.4.1.5 Finalised Qualification Assessment Specification document (QAS Addendum)

- 2.4.1.6 Develop Recognition of Prior learning (RPL) and accreditation tools.
- 2.4.1.7 Progress report on the new, re-aligned or reviewed of legacy qualifications. Frequency of this report will depend on the qualification in question.

2.5 SKILLS AND EXPIRIENCE OF THE BIDDING COMPANY AND THE TEAM MEMBERS PROPOSED FOR THE ASSIGNMENT

- 2.5.1 The applicants should demonstrate the following skills and experience
 - 2.5.1.1 The SMEF to have experience in the process of facilitation/development of registered qualification/skills programme /re-alignment / review including QAS Addendum. Curriculum vitae (CV) should demonstrate this.
 - 2.5.1.2 The bidding company to submit signed reference letters in the name of the SMEF confirming experience in the facilitation/development of registered qualification/skills programme /re-alignment / review including QAS Addendum. The reference letters must be on the client's letterhead with contact details confirming their satisfaction on the completed assignments.

2.6 TIMEFRAME FOR DELIVERY OF THE WORK

2.6.1 The duration of this contract will be from date of appointment until 31 March 2030.

2.7 PRICING

- 2.7.1 For appointments on this panel, bidders are required to submit their quotation on the scales per population provided on SBD 3.3.
- 2.7.2 The value of this bid is estimated not to exceed R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the 80/20 system shall be applicable.
- 2.7.3 Where the contract requires the successful bidder to travel to a venue different from SASSETA, the following travel and disbursement processes will be undertaken:
 - 2.7.3.1 Claim travel mileage costs applicable to this contract as per the Department of Transport rates
 - 2.7.3.2 Book only economy-class flights
 - 2.7.3.3 Book Group A hire cars, otherwise, Group B are to be used for service Providers outside of Gauteng.
 - 2.7.3.4 Utilise cost-effective mode of transport such as Uber/Taxify/Gautrain or shuttle services when travelling to and from the airport
 - 2.7.3.5 Book only Bed and Breakfast, Hotels, or other equivalent accommodations up to a Rand value of R1 400/ three (3) Star per night per person (including dinner, breakfast and parking).
 - 2.7.3.6 Submit all applicable invoices/receipts for the travel undertaken and a google map of the trip where travel by private car was undertaken for payment.
 - 2.7.3.7 All travel to be approved by SASSETA before being undertaken.

2.8 ACCOUNTABILITY AND REPORTING

2.8.1 The SME Facilitator will report directly to ETQA Manager.

2.9 SUBMISSION OF THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (GCC) (ANNEXURE A)

2.9.1 Bidders are requested to initial each page of the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) annexure A and submit their response to this Request for Proposal. The GCC will form part of the contract with the successful Bidder.

2.10 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

2.10.1 The service provider will be contracting with SASSETA. All data of this project, in whatever format raw or analysed, will be confidential information for utilisation by SASSETA. All information and documents received from SASSETA is to be kept confidential and may not be used or distributed in any format without the written approval of SASSETA. To this end, the service provider will be required to sign a confidentiality agreement within the SLA. protection of personal information act.

2.11 PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT

- 2.11.1 All Service Providers are to take note of the implications of POPI Act and any other data privacy Act applicable that SASSETA complies to. In compliance to the act, please be advised that the following are applicable to the treatment of vendor information:
 - 2.11.1.1 All requested bid information will be solemnly utilized for the purpose of the bid evaluation processes. The vendor hereby consents the information provided as part of this bid will be utilized for supply chain processes of SASSETA and may be subject to multiple processing to enable the evaluation of this bid.
 - 2.11.1.2 The vendor consents that the information collected will be retained for the duration of the evaluation and archived for records management purposes. The information will be disposed as per the SASSETA records management policies as prescribed by the national archives Act.
