Excellent racing in Mercedes-Benz Home Run

Another record field and intense racing, especially in the senior men's race, were hallmarks of the Mercedes-Benz 15km Home Run on Saturday morning on the roads of the West Bank overlooking the Buffalo River and harbour. The senior men were particularly impressive over the hills and the twists and turns that abound in the race. Cwenga Nose of Phantane AC in Durban took 23 seconds off his 2025 time, finishing ahead of the

field in 45:37.

He had been chased throughout by top Tyme Bank Langa (Cape Town) runner Yanga Malusi as well as Luyolo Ngcongolo of Powered Up Runners.

Malusi finished second in 46:15, which was nine seconds faster than in 2025, and Ngcongolo was third in 46:45.

He did not run last year but proved his worth yet again with a good time — 55 seconds faster than the 2025 third-placed Sinthemba Jilingsi, who did not run on Saturday.

Liyema Qgabavane of Real Gijimas may be disappointed with his 48:26 fifth position but finished comfortably ahead of the Surfers Challenge winner, Keaton Stansfeld of Boxer, in 49:47.

The top juniors were Brac's Endinako Mpondo in an excellent 50:43, Lizole Vara of Real Gijimas, who finished second in 53:53, and third-placed Gcinikhaya George of Brac in 54:36.

Awonke Bungu was the first 35-39 runner home in 52:31 while Bulelani Mgubo of Overtakers was the top 40+ athlete, followed by the

SAPS Striders duo of Mthobeli Maqhaji and Sandile Tsholoba, who finished together in 59:20.

Siyabulela Madlavana of Nedbank was first in the 50+ category in 56:09 with Wandile Funde second in 58:13 and Chillee Runners' Sandiso Ngxisho third in 59:59.

Makaya Masumpa, a doyen of Border running and founder member of Easy Equities Born2Run, has moved up into the 60+ category and, not surprisingly, won his first outing with a time of 58:49.

Masumpa beat long-time friend and club mate Phillip Quvana into second place with a 63:36. Nedbank's John du Preez was third in 65:14.

The women's race was a case of "welcome back" to two Easy Equities Born2Run runners who have battled injury but are clearly on the road to recovery.

Hanlie Botha won her second race in March in 58:35 while Caryn Lategan was second in 60:49, not far off her time last year of 60:21.

Cindy Nel, in the same club colours and always a banker in races of up to 15km, finished third in 64:28.

The first junior, Bukho Breakfast of Brac, finished fourth overall in 68:12. The next two juniors were Uvive Simon and Image Norayase of Boxer in 70:05 and 75:46 respectively.

The first 35-39-year-old runner was Awiwe Magwanya of Haven Hills in 75:57.

Botha and Lategan led the veteran 40+ runners home with

Kirsten Collins third in 63:03.

Weziwe Dlavana (no club stated) won the 50+ women's race. In second place was Michelle Conroy in 73:36 and Carol Tinhooff of Old Selbornians finished third in 77:42.

The senior citizens in the 60+ race were Annette Mayer of Gonubie Harriers in 81:15, Sharon Bosch of Old Selbornians in 86:06 and Janice McKerry of Komani Runners in 99:47. An impressive 1,391 runners made up the 15km field, while hundreds more tackled the 5km fun run.

Just down the road at Orient Beach, the new parkrun attracted 901 runners from across the city.
