<p>Good Morning Thabang Hope you are well?</p> <p>I have a clarification request on the evaluation criteria of <u>stream 1</u> (TO APPOINT VARIOUS CONTRACTORS TO PROVIDE NETWORK INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS ON DISTRIBUTION, PUBLIC LIGHTING & SERVICE CONNECTION ON AN AS AND WHEN REQUIRED BASIS)</p> <p>The criteria stipulates: <u>3 x Team Leaders</u> minimum requirement: Minimum certified copy of Electrical Engineering N6 Certificate or higher Electrical engineering Qualification, Valid ORHVS Certificate (Module 1- 10), certified copy of Electrical Trade Test Certificate, certified copy of ID, certified copy of Valid Driver's Licence.</p> <p>My concern with the above is, that you are requesting information of an Engineer, and that such Engineer should have a Trade Test, and an ORHVS Certificate (which is normally a site supervisor with such a ORHVS qualification) So we don't think there are engineers out there, which have Trade Tests (Which is applicable to an Electrician) and an ORHVS Certificate. Please advise if we can submit a ORHVS Site supervisor without an Engineering qualification to gain these points? Or can we just put in an Engineer with a N6? According to us, the wording or prerequisites are not applicable to this scope.</p> <p><u>3 x Project Coordinator</u> minimum requirement: Minimum certified copy of National Electrical Diploma Certificate (NQF Level 6) or higher Electrical engineering Qualification; certified copy of Project Management Certificate; certified copy of ID; Valid Driver's Licence.</p>	<p><u>Team Leader:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The minimum requirements for a team leader are as follows: N6 certificate in Electrical Engineering or higher, Valid ORHVS certificate (Module 1 – 10), Electrical Trade Test Certificate, copy of ID & valid driver's licence (There's no requirement for an Electrical Engineer) <p><u>Project Coordinator:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The minimum requirement for project coordinator are as follows: National Electrical Diploma certificate (NQF level 6) or higher Electrical Engineering certificate <p><u>Experience:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The reference letter/s should indicate number of years and scope of work should cover either Network Distribution or Public Lighting or Service Connection related work

<p>My concern is, in Stream 2 the requirement is easier (National Diploma NGF 6) – Can Stream 1 not also be the same requirement?</p> <p><u>Experience</u> 5 years and more – reference letters, how do you want the reference letters to be to indicate the 5 years' experience? As the reference letters in stream 2 asks for 5 projects, and this stream asks for 5 years</p>

It's not allowed because it's collusion and it has to be reported to Competition Commission

Network Infrastructure – Item 4 of the evaluation criteria – Is the experience based on years or the number of projects? 2. Turnkey Solution – Item 5 of the evaluation criteria – with regards to the bakkies, will 1 Ton bakkies/Nissan NP200 be allowed? 3. Upgrade and construction of substations – Item 6 of the evaluation criteria – 1 x Mobile crane (160-300 tons with boom reaching) is it 5 or 50 metres? <p>Thank you.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The experience is based on number of years for stream 1 2. 1 Ton bakkies/Nissan NP200 will be allowed 3. Mobile crane (160 – 300 tons with boom reaching 50 metres)
