Successful voter registration exercise a good signal

The second voter registration exercise held by the Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) nationally on 03 and 04 February 2024 has been a good barometer to determine whether or not the coming elections will sway the stakes with voluminous numbers.

In the region there was a clear indication that people are determined to vote and that apathy is not in their lingo this time around. There are numerous factors in this self-driven phenomenon. People just want change. As dissatisfaction keeps mounting, the ballot box becomes the alternative answer.

A random visit to various registration points where many people went for either verification or entering a new registration to cast a vote around Kuruman has given an insight if not, an electoral hypothesis. A few questions were posed to a few people who manned the registration points and had a myriad of reasons why it was necessary to vote this time around.

Analytically and summarily all answers were pointing at the empty stomach, lack of employment and of course, lack of service delivery. The visible parties that wanted to have an idea of their members in the ward one constituency were the African National Congress, the Economic Freedom Fighters and the Democratic Alliance. Interestingly, party banners had a good story to tell too.

The ANC used a mere non-descript plastic banner showing no life in the marketing arena, the EFF only had a table covered with a material displaying the party emblem, without a gazebo in the severe heat and the DA had a full kit that was requisite to the marketer. Despite some of the sorry banners, loyal members of the various parties were not shunned in the belief that all that glitters was not gold. They kept trickling in for registration. All three parties hinted at the numbers by midday and as is the obvious case, the DA had better numbers and the attendance was visibly evident.

Speaking to Willie Aucamp, a DA member of parliament and a delegate to the National Council of Provinces, he coincidentally arrived to monitor his party's progress and said that his party is all over the region and that he was on his way to Bankara Bodulong, Mothibstad, Wrenchville and other villages. He was clear that the party had no buffer zones in the country.

Speaking to the Regional Manager of the Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) Mr Olibile Gaobepi, by Sunday midday he expressed positivity in the exercise. He gave synthesised registration figures for both those verifying and new entrants of the subregions between Saturday and midday Sunday. Ga-Segonyana sub-region 2378 (595 new) Gama-gara 1248 (366 new) and Joe Morolong 3970 (786 new).
