SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

1. RFP INSTRUCTIONS

- 1.1. Respondents are to sign documents [sign and date the bottom of each page] before submitting the proposal document. The person or persons signing the submission must be legally authorised by the respondent to do so.
- **1.2.** Respondents are to note that AEMFC is utilising a two-envelope system for the purpose of receiving this bid. Bidders are required to submit technical/functionality and Commercial and Financial proposals in two separate envelopes.
- **1.3.** Proposals must be submitted in duplicate hard copies [1 original and 1 copy] and the second set must be a copy of the original proposal.
- 1.4. Proposal documents are to be submitted to the address specified in page 1 above, and Bidders must ensure that the original and copies (where applicable) are identical in all respects as AEMFC will not accept any liability for having disqualified a bidder for failing to provide a mandatory returnable document in either the original or the copy of the RFP albeit that it was included in the other.
- **1.5.** Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.
- 1.6. Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. Subject only to paragraph 9 below (Legal Review) and, alterations additions or deletions must not be made by the Respondent to the actual RFP documents.

2. **COMMUNICATION**

- 2.1. Respondents are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.
- 2.2. For specific queries relating to this RFP, Clarification Request should be submitted the name of delegated individual stated in the SBD 1 form before the closing time for clarification queries, which is 10 working days before the deadline for tender/bid submission. In the interest of fairness and transparency, AEMFC 's response to such a query will be published on the e-tender portal and AEMFC website.
- **2.3.** After the closing date of the RFP, a Respondent may only communicate with the name of delegated individual in Compliance, at email lulamam@aemfc.co.za on any matter relating to its RFP Proposal.
- **2.4.** It is prohibited for Respondents to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of AEMFC in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- **2.5.** Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.
- **2.6.** Bidders will be disqualified if the entity or any of its directors is listed on the register of Bid Defaulters in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corruption Activities Act of 2004 as a person prohibited from doing business with the public sector.
- 2.7. AEMFC will publish the outcome of this RFP in the National Treasury e-tender portal and AEMFC website within 10 days after the award has been finalised. Respondents are required to check the National Treasury e-tender Portal and AEMFC website for the results of the tender/bid process. All unsuccessful bidders have a right to request AEMFC to furnish individual reasons for their bid not being successful. 3. VALIDITY PERIOD

- 3.1. Respondents are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bid, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process has not been finalised within the validity period. However, once the adjudication body has approved the process and award of the business to the successful bidder(s), the validity of the successful bidder(s)' bid will be deemed to remain valid until a final contract.
- **3.2.** AEMFC requires a validity period of (**120 days**) from the closing date against this RFP, excluding the first day and including the last day.

4. BROAD-BASED ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO (B-BBEE) ACT

4.1. AEMFC fully endorses and supports the Government's objective of Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment and is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

5. JOINT VENTURES OR CONSORTIUMS

- 5.1. Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If at the time of the bid submission such a JV or consortium agreement has not been concluded, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by AEMFC through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to AEMFC.
- 5.2. If the bidder is a Joint Venture or Consortium, a Joint Venture / Consortium agreement signed by all member entities of the Joint Venture or Consortium must be attached together with the registration document of all members entitled.
- **5.3.** Respondents are to note that for the purpose of Evaluation, a JV will be evaluated based on one consolidated B-BBEE score card (a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level verification certificate) as per the B-BBEE Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022 preference point scoring.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY INFORMATION DISCLOSURE NOTICE

- **6.1.** All information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. - **6.3.** No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this bid, without prior written permission from AEMFC.

- **8.1.** Respondents are hereby advised that AEMFC is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that AEMFC reserves the right in its absolute discretion at any time to:
- 8.1.1. modify the RFP's Goods/Services and request Respondents to re-bid on any such changes;
- **8.1.2.** reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
- **8.1.3.** disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [closing date];
- 8.1.4. award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- **8.1.5.** award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/ Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- **8.1.6.** split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier/Service Provider should it at AEMFC's discretion be more advantageous in terms of amongst others, cost or development considerations;
- 8.1.7. cancel the bid;
- **8.1.8.** validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to AEMFC to do so;

9.1. A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by AEMFC's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business. A material deviation from the Standard terms or conditions could result in disqualification.

10. NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE (CSD) REGISTRATION

- 10.1. Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Respondents must register on the CSD prior to submitting their bids. Business may not be awarded to a Respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

- 10.3. Bidders must submit proof of registration on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

11. TAX COMPLIANCE

- 11.1. Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to AEMFC and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 199);
- **11.2.** It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations;

SECTION 3: BACKGROUND OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF WORK (SOW) SPECIFICATION

13. INTRODUCTION

African Exploration Mining and Finance Corporation (SOC) Ltd ("AEMFC") is a state-owned Mining Company established to secure South Africa's energy supply primarily through the mining and supply of coal for the generation of electricity, as well as securing other resources that will provide energy for the future, including key minerals for beneficiation in the energy and steel value chain. Mine rehabilitation is required in terms of the approved Environment Management Programme (EMPR)

and Water Use License (WUL). Vlakfontein Mine is committed as per the stated approvals to conduct concurrent rehabilitation and report status to authorities.

14. BACKGROUND SCOPE OF WORK (SOW) SPECIFICATION

- **14.1.** As such, AEMFC intends to Appointment of a Service Provider to conduct Mine Rehabilitation Services for a period of thirty-six (36) months.
- **14.2.** Thus, the Service Provider is requested to provide a proposal based on the below Scope of work (SOW).

14.3. OVERVIEW

AEMFC intends to Appoint a suitably Service Provider to Conduct rehabilitation services for African Exploration Mining and Finance Corporation (SOC) LTD ("AEMFC"). AEMFC seeks to benefit from this partnership in the following ways:

- **14.3.1.** AEMFC must receive the reduced cost of acquisition and improved service benefits resulting from the Service Provider economies of scale and streamed service process.
- **14.3.2.** AEMFC must achieve appropriate availability that meets user needs while reducing costs for both AEMFC and the chosen Service Provider.
- **14.3.3.** AMEFC must receive proactive improvements from the Service Provider with respect to the supply/ provision of Services.
- **14.3.4.** AEMFC end-users must be able to rely on the chosen Service Provider. personnel for service enquiries, recommended, and substitutions.
- **14.3.5.** AEMFC must reduce costs by streamlining its acquisition of Services.

15. SCOPE OF WORK (SOW) SPECIFICATION

- **15.1.** The rehabilitation fleet will work for 20 machine hours a day (Actual), 5 days a week, day and night at a minimum of 85% machine availability and utilisation.
- 15.2. The volume of work is shown on the table below which illustrates the amount of volume to be moved by the contractor on a monthly basis. The total annual volumes are shown at the end of the table below:

- **15.3.** The Mine will provide Proximity Detection Devices (PDS) and the two-way radio system however the contractor must ensure the following are installed per equipment.
- **15.4.** The fleet that is used for reshaping is the same fleet that will be used for dressing.
- **15.5.** The objective of the end status is summarized as follows:
 - a) To maintain a free-draining topography across the rehabilitated area
 - b) Maintain arable and grazing land; and
 - c) Create a habitat for plants and animals.

16. OPENCAST REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES

- **16.1.** The following activities should be considered:
 - a) Site Establishment;
 - b) Provide own office space and ablution facilities.
 - c) Construct own hard-park and maintenance facility.

- d) Provide earth moving machinery capacity to move a maximum of 1 680 000 BCM per annum; The Contractor will provide the Bill of Quantities for, 0-500m, 501-1000m, 1001-1500m, and 1501-2000m;
- e) Provide your short-term planning to mine planner or mining engineer;
- f) Ensure Compliance with Mine Health and Safety Act and other relevant Legislation;
- g) Ensure that mining is conducted in line with the provisions of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources
 Development Act (MPRDA);
- h) Have people with the relevant qualification and experience for open cast mine rehabilitation;
- i) Be responsible for effective spontaneous combustion prevention and control;
- j) All vehicles that are used at the mine must be fitted with Proximity Detection Devices (PDS). AEMFC will provide;
- k) AEMFC to provide Diesel and Diesel storage;
- The contractor is to ensure responsible usage of the provided diesel and if negligent is to be found on the contractor, AEMFC reserves the right to charge the contractor for the cost of the lost diesel;
- m) The Contractor is expected to conduct the mining services activities in a safe manner while at the same time achieving BCM targets and optimising costs;
- n) All rehabilitation activities and the costs thereof will be managed on a daily basis by the Contractor and accountable to AEMFC representative Manager.

16.2. CONTRACTORS RESPONSIBILITY

- a) Providing lighting at dump sites and other active working areas as per mine procedures,
- b) Establishment and maintenance of haul roads inclusive of grading, dust control and free drainage as per mine procedures.
- c) Traffic management as per mine approved traffic management rules as per mine procedures.
- Responsible for erection and maintenance of relevant traffic management signs as per traffic management plan and mine procedures.
- e) General maintenance of safety berms and delineators as per mine procedures.
- f) Dump and spoil levelling on dump site as per mine standards.
- g) Working areas must be maintained to acceptable underfoot conditions to reduce the risk of SME related incidents such as truck overturning. No edge tipping will be allowed.
- h) Maintenance and inspection of spoils (dumps) with the said operation and in accordance with the related COP (Code of Practice) will form part of the contractor's day to day activities.

16.3. HOURS OF WORK

- a) The Contractor will be expected to render the Services 24 hours per day, as per the AEMFC Mine Calendar and schedule;
- b) The operation from Monday to Friday; and weekend on clients request and approval.
- AEMFC has obtained a Sunday labour permission and the successful Contractor may be allowed to work on Sundays on request

16.4. AD-HOC WORKS

No day works for activities as stipulated in the contract scope will be allowed. The Contractor will only assist the mine with ad-hoc activities when all the following are in order:

- a) The Change Management Process must be followed;
- b) The work instruction must be signed off prior to the start of the work;
- c) The rates as per day work schedule must be applied;
- d) There must be a purchase order number. Payment will NOT be approved if the above is not complied with; and
- e) Performance of that work shall not relieve the contractor of its other obligations and the contractor shall promptly obtain directions from the mine representative, if any conflict in objectives arises
- f) Survey beacons and set out works. The Contractor will be responsible for the setting out of the works to ensure that rehabilitation will be carried out according to the design. The costs of the survey will be deemed to be included in the rates. No separate payment item is provided for surveying and setting out of the works.
- g) If any such beacons or pegs have been disturbed by the Contractor or his/her employees, the Contractor shall have them replaced by a registered land surveyor at his/her cost. Where survey beacons fall within the works the Contractor will be required to replace these benchmarks with alternative beacons located outside of the affected works area before the clearing of the site.
- h) The Contractor to implement an appropriate Quality Control (QC) system, recorded in a document termed the Quality Control Plan (QCP). The QCP will describe in detail the system that the Contractor will implement, including responsibilities, method statements and inspection checklists for all construction activities. The QCP must be submitted for review and acceptance and will be approved by the Client in writing. An approved QCP must be in place before commencing any rehabilitation activities.

16.5. TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- a) The contractor must ensure that they provide all applicable tools and equipment required to perform the job;
- b) The contractor must ensure compliance with all HSE (Health Safety Environment) requirements applicable to tools and equipment;

Respondent's Signature

- c) These tools and equipment will be inspected accordingly by the responsible appointed engineer or his delegate. The records of the inspections shall be made available monthly as per contractor's pack requirements and upon request by the mine representative;
- d) The Contractor shall provide the necessary equipment, plant and consumables as may be necessary to meet its obligations in terms of the rehabilitation project mining project;
- e) The costs to acquire such equipment, plant and consumables and to maintain and replace the same, shall be at the expense of the Contractor;
- f) Contractor to specify what facilities and equipment it will be bringing on-site and also specify the area measurements required to accommodate such facilities or equipment;
- g) All equipment, including vehicles and machinery used by the Contractor in the execution of its obligation in terms of the rehabilitation activities shall at all times be in good and proper working order and shall comply with the requirements prescribed by any applicable statutory provision or which may be required by any authority or may reasonably be required by AEMFC;
- h) AEMFC shall be entitled to require the Contractor, at its own cost, to remove any equipment or parts thereof and replace same within 3 (three) days or any reasonable period as mutually agreed, of any such demand which does not comply with any requirement of which AEMFC in its reasonable discretion may declare to be faulty or unsafe. This will not be to the detriment of production and the Contractor will ensure by replacement or other acceptable means that production targets are maintained;
- i) In the case that a piece of equipment is standing for longer than 3 working days, a replacement should be made available by the contractor. If the contractor cannot replace an equipment, AEMFC will implement penalties.
- j) The contractor need permission from the mine engineer before any replacement or additional equipment can be deployed on site. It is the contractor's responsibility to update the asset register, and other related documents as and when changes occur to the asset register. The full equipment on boarding procedure need to be followed.
- **k)** Any equipment removed from site for any reason whatsoever will be for the contractor's account in line with the mine's rules and regulations.
- I) The Contractor shall with its tender documents provide to AEMFC a complete list of all equipment which the Contractor will use to carry out its obligation in terms of the opencast mining activities; such list shall specify.

- m) All Yellow machines delivered on site must not have more than 8000 hours;

16.6. CONTRACTORS MACHINERY

- a) The contractor will comply with the mine standard operating procedures where they have the same type of equipment deployed on site. This will include applicable mine pre-use checklists.
- b) Where they have got different equipment, they will adopt the OEM production strategy with any additional requirements as required by the mine. New SOPs and pre-use checklists also need to be developed for activities / applications.
- c) These SOP needs to be approved by the responsible mine official.

- d) The contractor subordinate manager will daily report to the mine mining section manager/ mine overseer (2.6.1) to discuss, planned work and give proof that the required risk assessments (RA), job safety analysis is in place and that the work / tasks are assigned with adequate supervision.
- e) The contractor rehabilitation plan will be aligned with the mine production planning cycles and the contractor site manager (2.6.1) will slot in with the planning meetings on site.
- f) The rehabilitation plan compliance will be included in the monthly Service Level Agreement (SLA) meeting to monitor compliance with the mine production plan.

16.7. MATERIAL AND SPARES

The contractor must ensure that they provide all the materials and spares required to perform the job. The Contractor must ensure compliance with all HSEC compliance requirements applicable for the materials and spares. The mine will inspect all materials and spares accordingly. Where chemicals are used, MSDS data sheets should be provided and listed as per the HSEC contractor pack requirements. Any chemicals used by the contractor that is not included in the Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) data sheet should be approved by the HSEC Manager.

16.8. PERSONNEL REQUIRED

- a) Site Manager
- b) Safety Officer
- c) Supervisor per shift
- d) Machine operators
- e) Maintenance Supervisor
- f) Maintenance team for maintaining the machinery
- g) Any person required by the contractor for effective discharge of the contract objectives (e.g. Surveyor, Contractor administrator etc.)

17. RISK ASSESSMENT, STANDARD AND OPERATING PROCEDURES

17.1. The contractor will submit a pre-emptive Baseline Risk Assessment covering activities that will be performed on site and once the contractor is on site the Pre-emptive Baseline Risk Assessment will be updated and changed to the Operational Baseline Risk Assessment and the risk level of the contractor will be determined based on the risk associated with operational and maintenance activities that will be conducted on-site.

- **17.2.** An Issue baseline risk assessment will be submitted by the contractor covering the type of activities performed on-site.
- 17.3. The contractor will utilise the AEMFC Standard Operating Procedures (SOP's) and should supply their own SOP's for activities not covered. A list of AEMFC SOP's will be supplied to the appointed contractor.
- **17.4.** It is the responsibility of the contractor to ensure that all activity procedures are complied with. The contractor must ensure that all employees are continuously trained and fully understand all relevant procedures and standards of AEMFC.

18. RISK ASSESSMENT, STANDARD, AND OPERATING PROCEDURES

- **18.1.** Safety files and documentation
- 18.2. Weekly / Monthly safety meetings
- 18.3. HSE requirements (medicals, induction, training, and machine operator licencing)
- 18.4. Vehicles to company & mining specifications
 - a) Contractor Light Delivery Vehicles (LDV) must be according to the mine standard.
 - b) Contractor machines should be Fatal Risk Control (FRC) compliant. (See Annexure A "Pre-Start Checklists")
- **18.5.** Execute and document an Issue Base Risk Assessment and SOP's on the contractor machine fleet planned activities on site from a production and maintenance perspective taking fatal risks into account
- **18.6.** Pre-delivery inspection of the TMM equipment prior to delivery to ensure the progress quality, legal compliance of the TMM equipment and the mine's machine safety standards (Also referred to as RFCS) are adhered to as well as to the tendered specifications.

19. CONTRACTOR MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS

- **19.1.** The successful contractor should provide its own maintenance team and equipment to maintain the machines.
- 19.2. Contractor equipment on boarding to be approval by the Mine Engineer.
- 19.3. On boarding required
 - a) OEM recommended maintenance strategy
 - b) Maintenance Manual.
 - c) Parts Manual.

- d) Operators Manual.
- e) OEM machine brakes specifications and OEM brake test certificates or SIMRET brake test certificates conducted.
- f) A copy of the OEM brake testing procedure for all the different brakes fitted to the machine, Park brake, emergency brake, service brake and retarder brake where applicable.
- g) Maximum inclines and declines that the machine is designed to operate on including limitations for example haul trucks being loaded when going up and down inclines and declines. (All machinery brake related information needs to be updated in the mine TMM COP and machinery brake testing SOP's)
- h) OEM machine risk assessment.
- i) Weekly maintenance schedule.
- j) Weekly tyre surveys and report.
- k) Pre-checklist capturing and daily defect report.
- l) Illumination tests
- m) Automated fire suppression testing and reports (OEM recommendation)
- n) Fatal risk standard compliance file.
- Any other relevant documentation as required by the mine onboarding standard operating procedure and readily available for inspection.

20. CONTRACTOR MAINTENANCE AND MAJOR REPAIRS

- **20.1.** The contractor will adopt with the mine maintenance strategy in terms of maintenance where they have the same equipment deployed on site
- **20.2.** The contractor maintenance supervision will daily report to the mine engineer to discuss planned work and make adequate supervision for the tasks.
- 20.3. Contractor tyre management:
 - a) Contractor tyre management will comply with the mine tyre management SOP.
 - b) Tyres to be repaired off site.
 - c) Tyre handler model and type required.
 - d) Tyre stands, and tools required,
 - e) Tyre supervisor training qualifications and tyre specific training required same as mine tyre supervisor.
 - f) Tyre fitters' minimum qualifications and tyre specific training required.
- 20.4. A list with Critical Tasks List (CTL) that can be performed on site will be reviewed and approved by the Mine Engineer for approval. The approval will be based on risk exposure and maintenance facilities available on site.
- **20.5.** No major repairs (for example machine overhauls) will be permitted on-site. Work permitted on site will be stipulated in the approved CTL and approved by the Mine Engineer.

- **20.6.** Should the contractor require clarification regarding the definition of minor and major repairs, the responsible engineer should be consulted:
 - a) For any work / tasks not detailed in the CTL the responsible engineer needs to be consulted and he can consider giving exemption and approval to conduct the work / task on site after consultation with the maintenance manager and provided that the necessary controls and supervision is put in place to conduct the work safely.
 - b) The contractor must ensure machines are well maintained.
 - c) Proof of competency to be kept with training records and in the contractor's pack.

21. CONTRACTOR MEDICAL

- **21.1.** All contractor employees deployed on site will be required to undergo a medical examination and need to be declared fit for work for the type of work that the contractor employee will execute on site.
- 21.2. The medical examination shall be conducted at Clinic Plus in Witbank.
- **21.3.** Medical certificates issued from the recognise mine clinic will be valid on the mine for a period of one year.
- **21.4.** All employees with comorbidity need to be screened by the mine clinic monthly.
- **21.5.** Only certificates issued by the recognise mine clinic will be accepted.
- **21.6.** A valid medical certificate, issued by the recognise mine clinic, is a prerequisite for attending the induction training.
- **21.7.** The contractor will also ensure that all personnel undergo exit medicals when they leave the contractor employment or at the completion of the contract period.

21.8. Contractor labour training requirements

- a) All contractor employees deployed on site will undergo safety induction training, as well as any onthe-job required inductions, aligned with the tasks to be performed on site. Mine SOP training will form part of the employee induction training.
- Relevant personnel, production and maintenance to provide proof of OEM training.
- c) Personnel trained and licensed to operate equipment safely.
- d) Personnel trained to maintain equipment safely.
- e) Proof of competency to be kept with training records.
- f) Maintenance and repairs will be scheduled, conducted by qualified Artisans or Technicians.

g) All contract labour qualifications need to be verified through an accredited service provider before it will be accepted. This action will be by the contractor for his account. Machine specific training will be required as a minimum.

22. CONTRACTOR MEDICAL

- **22.1.** The contractor will be required to comply with requirement of the mine security management procedures.
- 22.2. The contractor will be responsible for security installations and maintenance to safeguard his mobile offices, storage containers, contractor equipment and contractor vehicles at the contractor site and pit area. This will include alarms (If required), security cameras (If required), safety doors, burglar bars and locking devices. The mine will not be responsible for malicious damage to or theft of contractor equipment.
- 22.3. Should the contractor require any additional security measures at his site; it would need to be in accordance with the mine's security procedures and standards. The contractor will obtain approval from the site security manager and arrange, at no additional cost to the mine, any additional security measures that he may require.
- **22.4.** All small tools and construction equipment belonging to the contractor must be clearly identified as such. Tools, including personal tools, are subject to inspection at the security gate on arrival and must be accompanied by a waybill on departure.
- 22.5. All equipment, materials, supplies and tools leaving the mine shall be accompanied by a waybill.
- **22.6.** The contractor will be responsible for security infrastructure at the contractor site as per the mine standard.
- 22.7. All equipment, materials, supplies and tools leaving the mine shall be accompanied by a waybill.

23. CONTRACTOR SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

- **23.1.** The contractor will be required to comply with requirement of the mine security management procedures.
- 23.2. The contractor will be responsible for security installations and maintenance to safeguard his mobile offices, storage containers, contractor equipment and contractor vehicles at the contractor site and pit area. This will include alarms (If required), security cameras (If required), safety doors, burglar bars and locking devices. The mine will not be responsible for malicious damage to or theft of contractor equipment.

- **23.3.** Should the contractor require any additional security measures at his site; it would need to be in accordance with the mine's security procedures and standards. The contractor will obtain approval from the site security manager and arrange, at no additional cost to the mine, any additional security measures that he may require.
- **23.4.** All small tools and construction equipment belonging to the contractor must be clearly identified as such. Tools, including personal tools, are subject to inspection at the security gate on arrival and must be accompanied by a waybill on departure.
- 23.5. All equipment, materials, supplies and tools leaving the mine shall be accompanied by a waybill.
- **23.6.** The contractor will be responsible for security infrastructure at the contractor site as per the mine standard.
- 23.7. All equipment, materials, supplies and tools leaving the mine shall be accompanied by a waybill.
- 23.8. Lockable Battery and Diesel theft prevention systems must be installed on all equipment.

24. RSERVICES AND INFRASTUCTURE TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CONTRACTOR

24.1. Contractor Portable Water

a) The contractor shall make arrangements concerning the supply of potable water and all other services. No direct payment will be made for the provision of electricity, water and other services. The cost thereof shall be deemed to be included in the rates and amounts tendered for the various items of work for which these services are required, or in the Contractor's preliminary and general items.

24.2. Electrical Power to Contractor Site

- a) The contractor shall make arrangements concerning the supply of electrical power, water, and all other services. No direct payment will be made for the provision of electricity, water ,and other services. The cost thereof shall be deemed to be included in the rates and amounts tendered for the various items of work for which these services are required, or in the Contractor's preliminary and general items.
- b) The contractor shall be responsible for the distribution of this electrical power supply point. The contractor shall also be responsible for the maintenance of all electrical reticulation from this supply point as per relevant mine COPs and SOPs.
- c) All electrical installations will be required to be constructed in accordance with the applicable SANS standards and a certificate of compliance will be required before the power supply will be switched on. All electrical installations will require a Certificate Of Compliance (COC)

- d) Maintenance strategy aligned with the mine maintenance strategy for electrical installations will be adopted and maintenance and repair work can only be conducted by electricians suitably qualified and authorised by the maintenance manager.
- e) Maintenance and repairs will be scheduled, conducted by qualified artisans and included in the maintenance task list.

24.3. Contractor Site Waste Disposal

- a) The removal of waste as per the waste management plan or as per standard. The contractor must provide wheelie bins for general and hazardous waste.
- b) All waste will be removed from the mine area and the contractor site by the Contractor.

24.4. Contractor Maintenance Work Areas

- a) Where the mine does not have workshop facilities available on site they need to consider other options to enable maintenance. Equipment to be transported off-site for major work – to be detailed in the critical task list:
 - Consider a dedicated area, compacted/concreted slab with the necessary oil trays and oil spill
 kits where the contractor can conduct basic repairs and maintenance, to be detailed in the
 critical task list.
 - ii. For the last option drainage, maintenance, and environmental contamination need to be considered and costed.

24.5. Change House Facilities

a) Supplier to provide suitable and adequate change house and ablution facilities. The cost thereof shall be deemed to be included in the rates and amounts tendered for the various items of work for which these services are required, or in the Contractor's preliminary and general items.

24.6. Contractor's Mobile Offices

- a) For the duration of this contract, the contractor shall provide and maintain adequate mobile offices on site.
- b) The location, sizes, quantity and types of structures shall be subject to review and approval by the Mine Engineer prior to any construction activities taking place.

Respondent's Signature

c) Maintenance and repairs will be scheduled, conducted by qualified artisans and included in the maintenance Critical Task List (CTL).

24.7. Contractor Site Transport

- a) The contractor shall be responsible for the transport of all contractor's labour, equipment, and contractor's materials to and from the contractor site and around the opencast mining area as necessary.
- b) Only vehicles approved and compliant with the mine safety standard will be allowed on site. These vehicles need to be included in the contractor maintenance plan and need to be maintained, inspected on a regular basis as detailed in the mine COPs and SOPs.

24.8. Contractor On Site Compressed Air

- a) The mine will not supply compressed air for use by the contractor. Where compressed air is required, the contractor need to provide the necessary compressors that need to be operated and maintained according to the mine standards and producers.
- b) Maintenance and repairs will be scheduled, and conducted by qualified artisans, pressure test done by an accredited vendor and included in the maintenance CTL.

24.9. Key Performance

- a) This contract will be subject to monthly measurement against Key Performance Indicators (KPl's) that will be formulated, discussed and agreed by all parties.
- b) Performance against the contractually agreed KPI's as per a Service Level Agreement (SLA) will be a crucial. The Supplier's performance will be measured against the HSEC, Production KPI's and Maintenance KPI's on a monthly basis. These will be agreed with the Supplier.

24.10. Contractor To Use Local Labour

- a) The contractor needs to make provisions for the use of local labour. Local labour to include a mix of unskilled, semi-skilled and skilled personnel, where applicable or appropriate, and in line with the client's Enterprise and Supplier Development (ESD) philosophy.
- b) The tendering companies are encouraged to identify areas of the contract where local suppliers can provide ancillary back up services, equipment or machinery that is suitable and in good standing.
- c) Any activities and operations identified will be carried out to the required mine standards and procedures.

25. FINANCIALS

- 25.1. The contractor will supply the Client with 3 years Audited financial statements;
- **25.2.** Site Establishment The site establishment and costs thereof must include all costs, e.g. site office, medical examinations, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) clothing, security clearance etc
- 25.3. The Contractor will give a complete cost breakdown and will clearly indicate fixed costs and variable;
- **25.4.** The Contractor will be responsible for any omissions from the final cost and no increase in pricing will be accepted after adjudication for negligence by the Contractor;
- 25.5. The Contractor will provide the full service as per the tender document;
- 25.6. The contract will be reviewed annually on the anniversary date for escalation.
