- Valid B-BBEE certificate issued by a SANAS accredited verification agency / sworn affidavit /CIPC affidavit.
- Proof of ownership (CIPS documentation) and breakdown of Shareholding information
- Certified ID copies of shareholder(s)
- Proof of Disability (where applicable).

A tenderer failing to documentation for the allocation of preference points will not be disqualified, but;

- ✓ may only score points out of 90/80 for price
- ✓ scores zero points out of 10/20 for specific goals.

A tenderer may not be awarded points for specific goals if the tender documents indicate that the tenderer intends subcontracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other person not qualifying for at least the points that the tenderer qualifies for.

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Section 2: Objective Criteria - May change award from the highest ranked tenderer to another tenderer in **accordance with the requirements of the PPPFA [clause 2(1)(f)]**:

2.1 Designated Sectors: It is applicable as the scope of work contains products/goods, material, components and parts that are designated which means that they have stipulated minimum threshold for Local Production and Content that must be complied with before the Contract is awarded or the Tenderer should obtain an exemption from the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition.

- An EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are youth;
- An EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are women;
- An EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people with disabilities;

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- An EME or QSE which is 51% owned by black people living in rural or underdeveloped areas or townships;
- A cooperative which is at least 51% owned by black people;
- An EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are military veterans;

The above-mentioned Skills are a guide. The actual skills/trade type may be negotiated.

The Tenderers are free to propose any other relevant Skills Development that will be feasible and benefit the previously disadvantaged communities. This may even include Workplace Integrated Learning (WIL) from the TVET Colleges around Nkangala District and Bronkhorstspuit Municipality Areas.

2.4. BBEE Requirements

2.4.1. B-BBEE Certificate:

The Contractor is expected to submit a B-BBEE Certificate or Sworn Affidavit before Contract Award if not submitted for Tender Evaluation at Tender Close.

Tenderer will be provided 5 working days to submit, failing which the Tender may be declared non-responsible and disqualified.

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Section 3: Contractual Requirements - Contractual requirements are not evaluation criteria. They are required to be met and assessed after the evaluation and ranking of the tenders.

3.1. B-BBEE Status

3.1.1. Maintain and/or improve B-BBEE Status:

Awarded Contractor is expected to maintain or improve their B-BBEE Recognition Level for the duration of the contract.

3.2. Job Opportunities and Upskilling of Employees

The Contractor should ensure that all its General Workers, Semi-Skilled Workers and at least 30% of the Skilled Workers are recruited from within Nkangala District and Bronkhorstspuit Local Municipality Areas.

Section 4: SD&L Performance Guarantee

- The Contractor shall submit an SDL&I Performance Guarantee equivalent to 0.25% of the Contract Value and shall only be released to the Contractor upon fulfilment of all SDL&I Obligations.
- The reduction of the percentage and release of the Performance Guarantee in tranches, proportionate to SDL&I's obligations' fulfilment, may be negotiated as an incentive to commit to SDL&I Undertakings mentioned above or that may be suggested by the Contractor.

Section 5: Reporting and Monitoring

- The suppliers shall on a quarterly basis submit a report to Eskom in accordance with Data Collection Template on their compliance with the SDL&I obligations described above.
- Eskom shall review the SDL&I reports submitted by the suppliers within 30 (thirty) days of receipt of the reports and notify the suppliers in writing if their SDL&I obligations have not been met.
- Upon notification by Eskom that the suppliers have not met their SDL&I obligations, the suppliers shall be required to implement corrective measures to meet those SDL&I obligations before the commencement of the following report, failing which Retention clauses shall be invoked.
- Every contract shall be accompanied by the SDL&I Implementation Schedule which must be completed by the suppliers and returned to SDL&I representative for acceptance 28 days after

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
