SECTION 1: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND RFP SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. INTRODUCTION

The National Lotteries Commission (The Commission) is a public entity established by Lotteries Act No. 57 of1997, as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the Commission can be divided into two categories, namely "regulation of National Lottery and other Lotteries" and "administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)".

The Distributing Agencies (DA's) who are appointed by the Minister of Trade & Industry are responsible for the adjudication of the funding applications as per the Lotteries Act and applicable Regulations.

2. BACKGROUND

. NLC is looking for the services of an organisation that will enable NLC to optimally improve employee conditions ensure that people develop themselves personally and professionally. This should turn enables organisations to grow and to develop, always.

The organisation should conduct the HR Best Practices Survey with the objective research methodology to assess an organisation's employee conditions mainly HR policies and practices. The survey must be based on an international standard, so participants must be measured against globally applicable best practice. The process should enable NLC to complete the survey in a secure online environment or through HCM interaction.

The survey should seek to benchmark our policies and processes with other top employers. The process should include certification and allow NLC to brand itself as employer of choice.



3. OBJECTIVES

The primary objective of this TOR is to seek a service provider that specialises in the conditions of employment survey and the service provider must provide certification as a way of NLC branding.

4. MANDATE

- To strive to achieve the annual certification with the best HR practices in place to support the organisation as their primary asset.
- It must cover a wide range of HR aspects, including the entire employee journey.
 Often these aspects concern everyday working conditions.
- To ensure that employees remain engaged and have constant opportunities to develop.
- Must provide Certification as employer of choice and give NLC opportunity to improve and optimise the HR policies.
- Ensure access to network of certified organisations to ensure innovative and impactful HR best pratices policies.

The successful bidder will be working in collaboration with existing NLC Human Capital Management.

5. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The service provider will report to Human Capital Management Department. Present to EXCO, HCM Board Committee and NLC Board

6. DURATION OF THE MANDATE

The expected duration of the project is two years after the signing of a Service Level Agreement (SLA).

1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotation (RFQ)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the Commission.
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFP without prior written permission from the Commission.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the Commission.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
 - 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official Commission Purchase Order form hasbeen received.
 - 1.6 This RFP will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system prescribed by the PreferentialProcurement Policy Framework Act of 2000 and PPR of 2022.
- 1.7 Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za.
 - 1.8 Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Summary report) and ensure that their tax matters are compliant.
 - 1.9 All questions regarding this RFP must be forwarded to bids@nlcsa.org.za, no later than within 24 hours of the RFP closing date.
 - 1.10 Any supplier who has reasons to believe that the RFP specification is based on a specific brand mustinform the Commission via the email addressed in 1.9.

2. General rules and instructions

2.1 News and press releases

- 2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFP or the awarding of the sameor any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the Commission.
- 2.2 Precedence of documents
- 2.2.1 This RFQ consists of several sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations, or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFQ and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFQ submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFQ shall take precedence.
- 2.2.2 Where this RFQ is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly

- marked recommendation that the Commission may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by the Commission.
- 2.2.3 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFP. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of the Commission as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of the
 - commission in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.
- 2.3 Preferential procurement reform
- 2.3.1 The commission supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with governmentpolicy, the commission insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B- BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.
- 2.4 National Industrial Participation Programme.
- 2.4.1 The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).
- 2.5 Language
- 2.5.1 Quotations shall be submitted in English.
- 2.6 Gender
- 2.6.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.
- 2.7 Headings
- 2.7.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFQ document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.
- 2.8 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993
- 2.8.1 The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFQ and/ or subsequent agreement, the commission reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to the commission.
- 2.9 Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information
- 2.9.1 All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-

contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFP is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation including the PPPFA and NLC SCM Policy.

The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom the commission is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, the commission is compelled to submit information to National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.

- 2.9.2 All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the commission Data Privacy Policy.
- 2.9.3 The commission will ensure that the rights of the Bidder and of its employees and representatives (i.e., the right of access and the right to rectify) are effectively guaranteed in accordance with the procedures as specified in the commission PAIA manual.
- 2.9.4 In signing this document, the Bidder consents to the use of its Personal Information for the purposes as specified in section 2.9.1 above.

3. National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

- 3.1 Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information.

- 4.2 The Commission reserves all the rights afforded to it by the POPIA in the processing of any of its information as contained in the quotation.
- 4.3 The Bidder acknowledges that it will obtain and have access to personal information of The Commission and agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by the Commission in terms of this bid awardand only for the purposes as detailed in this RFQ and in accordance with any applicable law.
- 4.4 The Bidder shall notify the Commission in writing of any unauthorised access to personal information and the information of a third party, through cybercrimes or suspected cybercrimes, in its knowledge and reportsuch crimes or suspected crimes to the relevant authorities in accordance with applicable laws, after becoming aware of such.

- 5.4 Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

1.2 Bid Formats

Bid submissions must be submitted in a PDF format that is protected from any modifications, deletions, or additions.

Financial/pricing information must be presented in a separate attachment from the Technical/Functional Response information. The onus is on the Bidder to ensure that all mandatory and required documents are included in the electronic submission.

Submissions must be prominently marked with the full details of the tender namely Bidder's Name, Tender No and Tender Title.

Bidders are advised to email electronic submissions at least thirty minutes before the bid closing time to cater for any possible delay in transmission or receipt of the bid. The onus is on bidder to ensure that the bid is submitted on time via email.

Tender submission emails received after submission date and time will be declared late bid submissions and will not be accepted for consideration by the NLC.

Stage 5: Due Diligence

The NLC reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise on the preferred bidder/s as part of a material risk evaluation aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. Such exercise shall be fully documented and may include, but need not be limited to, all or any combination of the following:

- a) Physical inspection of the Bidder's offices, branches or other places
- b) Verification of accuracy, correctness and authenticity of information provided
- c) Validation of extent of compliance to the RFP requirements and evaluation criteria based on what has so far been found by the evaluation team
- d) Inquiry and reference checking with National Treasury Restricted Suppliers
- e) Inquiry and reference checking with previous clients on the performance on on-going or contracts completed, including physical inspections of previous works, as necessary;
- f) Financial Stability Assessments

Stage 6: Contract and Award
