1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

To appoint a service provider for the supply, service and emergency repairs of ethylene generators for the Banana Ripening Centre at the Tshwane Market

2. BACKGROUND

The ripening facility at the Fresh Produce Market has 55 modern ripening rooms and can accommodate and ripen 68 000 boxes (18 kg/box) of bananas to an estimated value of R10 336 000 per week. Bananas are ripened during a seven-day cycle at an average temperature of 14 °C and chillers are used to manage and regulate the temperature throughout the facility.

There are many chemical and physical changes that occur during the growth and development period of bananas. These have an impact on the fruit quality after harvesting. Ripening is normally the final stage in fruit maturation. During ripening, the fruit changes colour, flavour, texture and aroma to optimal eating sensorial and textural properties. The agent that triggers these changes during maturation of bananas is a chemical called Ethylene. Ethylene is a ripening hormone and a chemical substance produced by fruits with the specific biological action of accelerating the normal process of fruit maturation and senescence (dying or going into dormancy).

Ethylene is a naturally produced gas and is used to slow, accelerate or regulate a natural ripening process. Ethylene can be manufactured artificially through a gas generator and has not been found to have harmful effects on human health. Ethylene can promote ripening in tomatoes, bananas, citrus, pineapples, dates, pears, apples, melons, mangoes, avocados and papayas.

Bananas as with other fruits are normally transported over long distances to markets and in order for the bananas to survive the transit time from source to the market it must be picked at 3/4 maturity when they appear green. After arrival at the market a very small, controlled release of artificial ethylene is used to trigger the natural ripening process. The ripening process is therefore controlled and regulated by introducing ethylene artificially through ethylene generators in order to adhere to the demand for a certain period.

Ethylene generators use a catalytic process to produce pure ethylene gas from a solution that is a combination of 90% Ethanol and 10% Ethyl Acetate. The solution (sometimes known as 'ripening fluid') is poured into a reservoir on the ethylene generator where it is slowly fed to an internal heater which vaporises the ethanol which then passes to the catalytic converter. Each litre of solution produces about 0.33-0.4m3 of ethylene gas. For the purposes of risk assessments, the higher figure should be used

The Tshwane Market currently make use of model BRS004 gas generators to produce ethylene gas for the ripening process at the ripening centre. The ripening centre currently has 20 generators to service the 55 ripening rooms on a 7-day ripening cycle. Generators must be serviced, repaired or replaced as and when needed and scheduled to ensure a complete and effective service to the 55 rooms.

3. PROJECT SCOPE

The purpose of the tender is to appoint a service provider for supply, rendering of a preventive maintenance and emerging services/repairs on all ethylene generators and related equipment at the Banana Ripening Centre at the Tshwane Market on an as and when required basis for 12 months.

4 DEFINITIONS

4.1 Service

Routine services will be done on a scheduled basis. In certain cases, it may also be required of the contractor to do services after hours.

4.2 Repair

Repair work on the items concerned as instructed and approved by the Municipality, from time to time.

5. TECHNICAL INFORMATION

The following will be required of the successful contractor:

- a) To keep detail of all repair work of components concerned, as well as part catalogues. The detail catalogues shall have all the necessary technical details required for proper repair and maintenance according to OEM specifications.
- b) To avail all relevant technical information and drawings prior to commencing with any work.
- c) To state the source and part numbers, from where the Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM) spares are bought and make available the prevailing OEM spare parts lists.
- d) To keep all technical information on his premises and the Municipality's representative shall have access to these records and drawings at any time during the contract period.
- e) To keep a copy of all test reports on his premises and the Municipality's representative shall have access to these records at any time during the contract period.

6 SPECIFIC REPAIR REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS

- The quality of workmanship, material applied, preparation and final finish shall be in accordance with the industry standard. All repairs must be done in accordance with OEM specifications. The workshop of the tenderer must comply with The Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 – the recommended bidder will be requested to submit OHS compliance documents before award.
- Tests and certification

Testing and certification of equipment in accordance with the OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT, 1993 (ACT NO. 85 OF 1993), or latest - the recommended bidder will be requested to submit OHS compliance documents before award.

7 **DELIVERY PERIOD**

- 8.1 The service provider must be able to deliver a new ethylene gas generator within three (3) weeks after a purchase order has been issued.
- 7.2 The service provider must further keep a sufficient quantity of ethylene gas generator, as agreed with the market, to prevent any possible delays in the supply thereof.

9 ROUTINE SCHEDULED SERVICES

The following will be required during routine quarterly services, amongst others and where applicable, to be done upon notification for which an official order will be placed:

10.1 QUARTERLY SERVICES

- a) Test all components
- b) Replace the catalyst
- c) Remove the solenoid and connection tube and clean
- d) Clean the tank
- e) Clean the interior of the tank
- f) Fill the tank with solvent and check for leaks
- g) Switch the system on and calibrate the PC board
- h) Leave the system on for at least 12 hours to determine functionality

10.2 GENERATOR COMPONENTS

The ethylene generators consist of the following components and tenderers must tender for each item as set out in the pricing schedule:

11. WARRANTY

It will be required from the tenderer to provide a twelve-month warranty that will cover the following minimum requirements:

- a) A full year's warranty on the new generator supplied and installed
- b) All parts found faulty within the first year must carry a factory warranty
- c) All parts must be covered within the first year including labor to repair the faults

If the tenderer does not agree to a market-related price, the city reserves the right to negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the second highest points, if the tenderer scoring the second highest points does not agree to a market-related price, negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the third highest points.
