Z1 Cession delegation and assignment

- Z1.1 The *Supplier* does not cede, delegate or assign any of its rights or obligations to any person without the written consent of the *Purchaser*.
- Z1.2 Notwithstanding the above, the *Purchaser* may on written notice to the *Supplier* cede and delegate its rights and obligations under this contract to any of its subsidiaries or any of its present divisions or operations which may be converted into separate legal entities as a result of the restructuring of the Electricity Supply Industry.

Z2 Joint ventures

- Z2.1 If the *Supplier* constitutes a joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons or organisations then these persons or organisations are deemed to be jointly and severally liable to the *Purchaser* for the performance of this contract.
- Z2.2 Unless already notified to the *Purchaser*, the persons or organisations notify the *Supply Manager* within two weeks of the Contract Date of the key person who has the authority to bind the *Supplier* on their behalf.
- Z2.3 The *Supplier* does not alter the composition of the joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons without the consent of the *Purchaser* having been given to the *Supplier* in writing.

Z3 Change of Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status

- Z3.1 Where a change in the *Supplier's* legal status, ownership or any other change to his business composition or business dealings results in a change to the *Supplier's* B-BBEE status, the *Supplier* notifies the *Purchaser* within seven days of the change.
- Z3.2 The *Supplier* is required to submit an updated verification certificate and necessary supporting documentation confirming the change in his B-BBEE status to the *Supply Manager* within thirty days of the notification or as otherwise instructed by the *Supply Manager*.
- Z3.3 Where, as a result, the *Supplier's* B-BBEE status has decreased since the Contract Date the *Purchaser* may either re-negotiate this contract or alternatively, terminate the *Supplier's* obligation to Provide the *Goods* and *Services*.
- Z3.4 Failure by the *Supplier* to notify the *Purchaser* of a change in its B-BBEE status may constitute

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a reason for termination. If the *Purchaser* terminates in terms of this clause, the procedures on termination are P1, P2 and P3 as stated in clause 92, and the amount due is A1 and A3 as stated in clause 93.

Z4 Confidentiality

- Z4.1 The *Supplier* does not disclose or make any information arising from or in connection with this contract available to Others. This undertaking does not, however, apply to information which at the time of disclosure or thereafter, without default on the part of the *Supplier*, enters the public domain or to information which was already in the possession of the *Supplier* at the time of disclosure (evidenced by written records in existence at that time). Should the *Supplier* disclose information to Others in terms of clause 23.1, the *Supplier* ensures that the provisions of this clause are complied with by the recipient.
- Z4.2 If the *Supplier* is uncertain about whether any such information is confidential, it is to be regarded as such until notified otherwise by the *Supply Manager*.
- Z4.3 In the event that the *Supplier* is, at any time, required by law to disclose any such information which is required to be kept confidential, the *Supplier*, to the extent permitted by law prior to disclosure, notifies the *Purchaser* so that an appropriate protection order and/or any other action can be taken if possible, prior to any disclosure. In the event that such protective order is not, or cannot, be obtained, then the *Supplier* may disclose that portion of the information which it is required to be disclosed by law and uses reasonable efforts to obtain assurances that confidential treatment will be afforded to the information so disclosed.
- Z4.4 The taking of images (whether photographs, video footage or otherwise) of the *goods* or any portion thereof, in the course of Providing the *Goods* and *Services* and after Delivery, requires the prior written consent of the *Supply Manager*. All rights in and to all such images vests exclusively in the *Purchaser*.
- Z4.5 The *Supplier* ensures that all his subcontractors abide by the undertakings in this clause.

Z5 Waiver and estoppel: Add to core clause 12.3:

- Z5.1 Any extension, concession, waiver or relaxation of any action stated in this contract by the Parties, the *Supply Manager* or the *Adjudicator* does not constitute a waiver of rights, and does not give rise to an estoppel unless the Parties agree otherwise and confirm such agreement in writing.

Z6 Health, safety and the environment: Add to core clause 25.4

- Z6.1 The *Supplier* undertakes to take all reasonable precautions to maintain the health and safety of persons in and about the provision of the *goods* and execution of the *services*.

Without limitation the *Supplier*:

- warrants that the total of the Prices as at the Contract Date includes a sufficient amount for proper compliance with all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and the health and safety rules, guidelines and procedures provided for in this contract and generally for the proper maintenance of health & safety in and about the execution of supply and
- undertakes, in and about the execution of the supply, to comply with all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Supplier's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.

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- Z6.2 The *Supplier*, in and about the execution of the supply, complies with all applicable environmental laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Supplier's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.

Z7 Provision of a Tax Invoice and interest. Add to core clause 51

- Z7.1 Within one week of receiving a payment certificate from the *Supply Manager* in terms of core clause 51.1, the *Supplier* provides the *Purchaser* with a tax invoice in accordance with the *Purchaser's* procedures stated in the *Goods* Information, showing the amount due for payment equal to that stated in the payment certificate.
- Z7.2 If the *Supplier* does not provide a tax invoice in the form and by the time required by this contract, the time by when the *Purchaser* is to make a payment is extended by a period equal in time to the delayed submission of the correct tax invoice. Interest due by the *Purchaser* in terms of core clause 51.2 is then calculated from the delayed date by when payment is to be made.
- Z7.3 The *Supplier* (if registered in South Africa in terms of the companies Act) is required to comply with the requirements of the Value Added Tax Act, no 89 of 1991 (as amended) and to include the *Purchaser's* VAT number 4740101508 on each invoice he submits for payment.

Z8 Notifying compensation events

- Z8.1 Delete from the last sentence in core clause 61.3 the words, "unless the event arises from the *Supply Manager* giving an instruction, changing an earlier decision or correcting an assumption".

Z9 Purchaser's limitation of liability

- Z9.1 The *Purchaser's* liability to the *Supplier* for the *Supplier's* indirect or consequential loss is limited to R0.00 (zero Rand)
- Z9.2 The *Supplier's* entitlement under the indemnity in 83.1 is provided for in 60.1(12) and the *Purchaser's* liability under the indemnity is limited.

Z10 Termination: Add to core clause 91.1, at the second main bullet point, fourth sub-bullet point, after the words "against it":

- Z10.1 or had a business rescue order granted against it.

Z11 Addition to secondary Option X7 Delay damages (if applicable in this contract)

- Z11.1 If the amount due for the *Supplier's* payment of delay damages reaches the limits stated in this Contract Data for Option X7, the *Purchaser* may terminate the *Supplier's* obligation to Provide the *Goods* and Services using the same procedures and payment on termination as those applied for reasons R1 to R15 or R18 stated in the Termination Table.

Z12 Ethics

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For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

Affected Party	means, as the context requires, any party, irrespective of whether it is the <i>Supplier</i> or a third party, such party's employees, agents, or Subcontractors or Subcontractor's employees, or any one or more of all of these parties' relatives or friends,
Coercive Action	means to harm or threaten to harm, directly or indirectly, an Affected Party or the property of an Affected Party, or to otherwise influence or attempt to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,
Collusive Action	means where two or more parties co-operate to achieve an unlawful or illegal purpose, including to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,
Committing Party	means, as the context requires, the <i>Supplier</i> , or any member thereof in the case of a joint venture, or its employees, agents, or Subcontractors or the Subcontractor's employees,
Corrupt Action	means the offering, giving, taking, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of a good or service to unlawfully or illegally influence the actions of an Affected Party,
Fraudulent Action	means any unlawfully or illegally intentional act or omission that misleads, or attempts to mislead, an Affected Party, in order to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation or incurring an obligation,
Obstructive Action	means a Committing Party unlawfully or illegally destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing information or making false statements to materially impede an investigation into allegations of Prohibited Action, and
Prohibited Action	means any one or more of a Coercive Action, Collusive Action Corrupt Action, Fraudulent Action or Obstructive Action.

- Z12.1 A Committing Party may not take any Prohibited Action during the course of the procurement of this contract or in execution thereof.
- Z12.2 The *Purchaser* may terminate the *Supplier's* obligation to Provide the Services if a Committing Party has taken such Prohibited Action and the *Supplier* did not take timely and appropriate action to prevent or remedy the situation, without limiting any other rights or remedies the *Purchaser* has. It is not required that the Committing Party had to have been found guilty, in court or in any other similar process, of such Prohibited Action before the *Purchaser* can terminate the *Supplier's* obligation to Provide the Services for this reason.
- Z12.3 If the *Purchaser* terminates the *Supplier's* obligation to Provide the Services for this reason, the amounts due on termination are those intended in core clauses 92.1 and 92.2.
- Z12.4 A Committing Party co-operates fully with any investigation pursuant to alleged Prohibited Action. Where the *Purchaser* does not have a contractual bond with the Committing Party, the *Supplier* ensures that the Committing Party co-operates fully with an investigation.

Z14 Nuclear Liability

- Z14.1 The *Purchaser* is the operator of the Koeberg Nuclear Power Station (KNPS), a nuclear installation, as designated by the National Nuclear Regulator of the Republic of South Africa and is the holder of a nuclear licence in respect of the KNPS.
- Z14.2 The *Purchaser* is solely responsible for and indemnifies the *Supplier* or any other person against any and all liabilities which the *Supplier* or any person may incur arising out of or resulting from nuclear damage, as defined in Act 47 of 1999, save to the extent that any liabilities are incurred due to the unlawful intent of the *Supplier* or any other person or the presence of the *Supplier* or that person or any property of the *Supplier* or such person at or in the KNPS or on the KNPS site, without the permission of the *Purchaser* or of a person acting on behalf of the *Purchaser*.
- Z14.3 Subject to clause Z14.4 below, the *Purchaser* waives all rights of recourse, arising from the aforesaid, save to the extent that any claims arise or liability is incurred due or attributable to the unlawful intent of the *Supplier* or any other person, or the presence of the *Supplier* or that person or any property of the *Supplier* or such person at or in the KNPS or on the KNPS site, without the permission of the *Purchaser* or of a person acting on behalf of the *Purchaser*.
- Z14.4 The *Purchaser* does not waive its rights provided for in section 30 (7) of Act 47 of 1999, or any replacement section dealing with the same subject matter.
- Z14.5 The protection afforded by the provisions hereof shall be in effect until the KNPS is decommissioned.

Z15 Asbestos

For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

AAIA	means approved asbestos inspection authority.
ACM	means asbestos containing materials.
AL	means action level, i.e. a level of 50% of the OEL, i.e. 0.1 regulated asbestos fibres per ml of air measured over a 4 hour period. The value at which proactive actions is required in order to control asbestos exposure to prevent exceeding the OEL.
Ambient Air	means breathable air in area of work with specific reference to breathing zone, which is defined to be a virtual area within a radius of approximately 30cm from the nose inlet.
Compliance Monitoring	means compliance sampling used to assess whether or not the personal exposure of workers to regulated asbestos fibres is in compliance with the Standard's requirements for safe processing, handling, storing, disposal and phase-out of asbestos and asbestos containing material, equipment and articles.

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OEL	means occupational exposure limit.
Parallel Measurements	means measurements performed in parallel, yet separately, to existing measurements to verify validity of results.
Safe Levels	means airborne asbestos exposure levels conforming to the Standard's requirements for safe processing, handling, storing, disposal and phase-out of asbestos and asbestos containing material, equipment and articles.
Standard	means the <i>Purchaser's</i> Asbestos Standard 32-303: Requirements for Safe Processing, Handling, Storing, Disposal and Phase-out of Asbestos and Asbestos Containing Material, Equipment and Articles.
SANAS	means the South African National Accreditation System.
TWA	means the average exposure, within a given workplace, to airborne asbestos fibres, normalised to the baseline of a 4-hour continuous period, also applicable to short term exposures, i.e. 10-minute TWA.

- Z15.1 The *Purchaser* ensures that the Ambient Air in the area where the *Supplier* will Provide the Services conforms to the acceptable prescribed South African standard for asbestos, as per the regulations published in GNR 155 of 10 February 2002, under the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) ("Asbestos Regulations"). The OEL for asbestos is 0.2 regulated asbestos fibres per millilitre of air as a 4-hour TWA, averaged over any continuous period of four hours, and the short-term exposure limit of 0.6 regulated asbestos fibres per millilitre of air as a 10-minute TWA, averaged over any 10 minutes, measured in accordance with HSG248 and monitored according to HSG173 and OESSM.
- Z15.2 Upon written request by the *Supplier*, the *Purchaser* certifies that these conditions prevail. All measurements and reporting are affected by an independent, competent, and certified occupational hygiene inspection body, i.e. a SANAS accredited, and Department of Employment and Labour approved AAIA. The *Supplier* may perform Parallel Measurements and related control measures at the *Supplier's* expense. For the purposes of compliance, the results generated from Parallel Measurements are evaluated only against South African statutory limits as detailed in clause Z15.1. Control measures conform to the requirements stipulated in the AAIA-approved asbestos work plan.
- Z15.3 The *Purchaser* manages asbestos and ACM according to the Standard.
- Z15.4 In the event that any asbestos is identified while Providing the Services, a risk assessment is conducted and if so required, with reference to possible exposure to an airborne concentration of above the AL for asbestos, immediate control measures are implemented and relevant air monitoring conducted in order to declare the area safe.
- Z15.5 The *Supplier's* personnel are entitled to stop working and leave the contaminated area forthwith until such time that the area of concern is declared safe by either Compliance Monitoring or an AAIA approved control measure intervention, for example, per the emergency asbestos work plan, if applicable.
- Z15.6 The *Supplier* continues to Provide the Services, without additional control measures presented, on presentation of Safe Levels. The contractually agreed dates to Provide the Services, including the Completion Date, are adjusted accordingly. The contractually agreed dates are extended by the notification periods required by regulations 3 and 21 of the Asbestos Regulations.
- Z15.7 Any removal and disposal of asbestos, asbestos containing materials and waste, is done by a registered asbestos contractor, instructed by the *Purchaser* at the *Purchaser's* expense, and conducted in line with South African legislation

Clause 53.1 states: "Information in the Price Schedule is not *Goods* Information". This confirms that instructions to do work or how it is to be done are not included in the Price Schedule but in the *Goods* Information. This is further confirmed by Clause 20.1 which states, "The *Supplier* Provides the *Goods* and *Services* in accordance with the *Goods* Information". Hence the *Supplier* does **not** Provide the *Goods* and *Services* in accordance with the Price Schedule. The Price Schedule is only a pricing document.

Preparing the *price schedule*

Items in the *price schedule* may have been inserted by the *Purchaser* and the tendering *Supplier* should insert any additional items which he considers necessary. Whichever party provides the items in the *price schedule* the total of the Prices is assumed to be fully inclusive of everything necessary to Provide the *Goods* and *Services* as described at the time of entering into this contract.

It will be assumed that the tendering *Supplier* has

- Read Pages 8, 11, 12 and Appendix 5 of the SC3 Guidance Notes before preparing the *price schedule*;

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- Included in his Prices and rates for correction of Defects(core clause 43.1) as there is no compensation event for this unless the Defect is due to a *Supplier's* risk;
- Spread the cost of doing work he chooses not to list as separate items in the *price schedule* across other Prices and rates in order to fulfil the obligation to Provide the *Goods* and Services for the tendered total of the Prices;
- Understood that there is no adjustment to lump sum prices in the *price schedule* if the amount, or quantity, of work within that lump sum item later turns out to be different to that which the *Supplier* estimated at time of tender. The only basis for a change to the Prices is as a result of a compensation event per clause 60.1;
- Understood that the *Supplier* does not have to allow in his Prices and rates for matters that may arise as a result of a compensation event.

1 Overview and purpose of the goods and services

The listed motors are a direct replacement for existing motors in Tutuka Power Station and must be mechanically and electrically interchangeable. *The Supplier* shall provide skilled labour, engineering knowledge and management experienced in fulfilling the requirements for such electric machinery.

The technical, quality and workmanship requirements are described according to the Eskom standard 240-50237155 Rev-4 for Induction motors provided by Eskom and in quality control procedures (QCPs) provided by the Supplier and accepted by Eskom before work is conducted.

2 Specification and description of the goods

The technical requirements are for the Supplier to design, manufacture, test and witness installation of new Induction motors listed in Table 1 for Tutuka Eskom End-users according to the Eskom standard 240-50237155 Rev-4 for Induction motors.

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2.1 Purchaser's design

2.2 Procedure for submission and acceptance of *Supplier's* design

- *The Supplier* shall provide outline drawings, technical schedule B, performance and protection curves, Interchangeability report, QCPs and other design information stated in Eskom standard 240-50237155 for New Induction motors Section 3.3.3
- Eskom Engineering shall conduct technical evaluation during tender phase and detail design freeze before manufacturing to ensure technical assurance. The supplier shall visit the site to confirm interchangeability and provide report before design freeze acceptance.

2.3 Other requirements of the *Supplier's* design

- Other requirements shall be in accordance with the Eskom standard 240-50237155 Rev-4 for Induction motors.

2.4 Use of *Supplier's* design

- The Purchaser may use and copy the Supplier's design and use the services for any purpose connected with use or alteration of the goods and services unless otherwise stated in the Goods Information and for other purposes as stated in the Goods Information.
- The *Purchaser* shall use the supplied motors for driving applications listed in Table 1.

2.5 Manufacture & fabrication

- Manufacturing shall only commence after Tutuka power station engineering has accepted the detail design and QCPs/ITPs. The manufacturing shall be done in accordance with the design and construction requirements stated in the Eskom standard 240-50237155 for New Induction motor Section 3.4.
- Eskom Engineering shall conduct manufacturing inspection were necessary as part of technical assurance during manufacturing.

2.6 Factory acceptance testing (FAT)

- The motors shall be tested in accordance with the testing requirements stated in the Eskom standard 240-50237155 for New Induction motors Section 3.5.
- Performance/Type test shall also be conducted and witnessed per motor design to validate the design and manufacturing process. Each motor shall have routine test conducted and witnessed before dispatched to site. Final dispatch inspection shall be conducted by power station personnel. New motors shall not be accepted on site without manufacturing and testing documents.
- Motor delivery to site shall be as defined in the contract.

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2.7 Other tests and inspections and commissioning in place of use

- Requirements for installation and commissioning at Site shall be conducted by Eskom in accordance with the Eskom standard 240-50237155 Rev-4 for Induction motors, Commissioning Work Instruction 240-100457684 and other site-specific procedures. The *Supplier* is required to witness Site installation and commissioning as requested by the *Purchaser*.

2.8 Operating manuals and maintenance schedules

- Requirements for operating manuals and maintenance shall be in accordance with the Eskom standard 240-50237155 Rev-4 for Induction motors.

3 Supply Requirements

- a) The supply of **Medium Voltage Induction Motors** is on once off order
- b) Requests for delivery will be made on a contract release order starting with an Order number.
- c) All equipment / spares must be on time of required order date.
- d) Transported by road on *Supplier's* costs and transport.
- e) End user to be informed when delivery will be done at least 2 days upfront.
- f) No deliveries to be done on a Weekend or public holiday except on an emergency basis indicated by the *Purchaser*.
- g) The *Supplier* must deliver the spares between 08:30 to 15:30 Mondays to Thursdays and 8:30 to 11:30 on Fridays. No deliveries to be done on weekends unless prior arrangements done with the *Supplier*, *Purchaser* and stores.
- h) Pallets to convey the batch must be strong enough to carry and transport load at any time.
- i) Batches to be clearly marked and packed according to the required specifications.
- j) The *Supplier* will ensure that the correct motor is supplied and will replace or be liable for damage at his/her cost if the incorrect or defective motors is supplied. The costs may include, but not limited to, repairs and/or replacement as a result of a defective or incorrect motor.
- k) The *Purchaser's* (i.e., Eskom Holdings SOC) acceptance of delivered motors does not absolve the *Suppliers* of the liability to supply the correct and/or defect free motor.
- l) The *Supplier* may, at the *Purchaser* discretion, be given access to the plant to verify the information of the installed spare.
- m) The motors must be exactly the same (i.e., same Part Number) as specified on this works information and the part number will also be used to perform quality control checks. Notwithstanding the stipulated condition that the *Supplier* is responsible for verifying the correctness of motor information provided by the *Purchaser* in relation to the existing installed motor. This may include the *Supplier* consulting the original *Supplier* of the motor to ensure correctness of information provided by the *Purchaser*.
- n) The *Purchaser* may at his/her discretion make the *Purchaser's* Engineer or employees or others available to the *Supplier* for the purpose of soliciting additional information or verifying information as the need arises.
- o) The *Supplier* will supply any additional information such as brochure, general arrangement drawing, certificates, detailed specification, etc.
- p) The *Supplier* provides the *Purchaser* with additional motor information and verifies information required in the attached data capturing forms (DCF) at least three months after order placement or conclusion of the contract or (where lead time is less than three months) a week before delivery of respective motor.
- q) The *Supplier* shall supply preservation and storage procedure/s, where applicable.
- r) The motor Procurement limit over three (year) period, indicated by the *Purchaser* in the attached table as one of the subheadings, is the maximum number the *Purchaser* may require the Supplier to supply over the contract period. However, the *Supplier* may only supply the quantity as specified by the *Purchaser* in the individual order instruction and does not imply that the *Supplier* is entitled to supply the total number indicated.

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- s) The *Purchaser* reserves the right to exclude the supply of some motors included in the contract with the *Supplier* should the *Purchaser* become aware that National Supply Contract exists or is placed by the *Purchaser* with Others in respect to those specific spare's items.
- t) If deemed necessary, the *Purchaser* may subject the *Supplier* to a quality assurance assessment at the *Supplier's* or sub-Supplier's premises as part of the technical evaluation or before the contract placement or at any time during the contract period.
- u) Where the spare requires testing, the *Supplier* will inform the *Purchaser* to invite or make available the *Purchaser's* System Engineer to witness the tests.
- v) Should the *Purchaser* be dissatisfied with all or certain aspects relating to a specific spare test (including but not limited to suspected inferior quality or non-compliance) the *Supplier* will make good, rectify the faults or supply a new motor at his/her cost.
- w) Spares will be opened for inspection, counting and quality control check at the *Purchaser* stores.
- x) The *Supplier* shall test motors before delivery.

Packaging

All supplied motors shall be packaged in such a manner that they will be transported and stored without damage. This includes preventing damage due to moisture ingress, dust and foreign objects. The *Suppliers* procedure shall be used Transportation and Storage.

Different motor types shall be packaged separately such that each motor type can be stored separately. Packaging shall be such that the motor can be identified without opening the packaging. Packaging shall be of material that will not be damaged, to an extent possible, by harsh weather conditions during transportation. If that is not possible, then the packaging shall be protected against such conditions.

Where possible, packaging to be such that procured motors can be positively identified through the packaging. Where this is not possible, the packaging to be such that it allows opening and closing of packaging and still maintain the packaging integrity thereafter.

Security / Criminal Clearance Check

- a) *Supplier* on site must supply a SAPS clearance certificate to the *Purchaser* before contract start and every 12 months thereafter for all *Supplier* employees to ensure continued access to site. This will also be handed in to security for *Supplier* to obtain access permits.
- b) Acceptance of this tender is subject to the condition that both the contracting company's management and its employees will provide Eskom with a clear criminal record not older than thirty (30) days from a reputable screening company. If the principal *Supplier* appoints a subcontractor, the same provisions and measures will apply to the subcontractor. Acceptance of the tender is also subject to the condition that the *Supplier* will implement all such security measures for the safe performance of the work as required in the scope of the contract.
- c) *Suppliers* are to submit proof of verification record(s) (Security clearance) from SAPS or accredited supplier linked to SAPS AFIS system not older than thirty (30) days, as part of Risk Management process in order to curb any threats against the Installation. It is compulsory for these documents to be submitted to Security for verification before access to site is granted. Only individuals with clear criminal records will be considered.
- d) *Supplier* are required to submit the SAPS Clearance Certificate obtained by the employee along with a copy of his/her Identity Document or Passport to the site Security Manager. The Security Manager is required to verify the authenticity of the CRC Certificate with SAPS and to cross reference the

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employee seeking access against known HR databases and site databases to determine if the employee in question has in the past participated in disruptive labor actions and if the individual was dismissed from Eskom and the reason for such dismissal. Every employee applying for access must be evaluated as an individual and subsequent finding recorded. A risk analysis of the employee profile indicating whether the employee is a risk to the installation must be completed. Any risk rating allocated above a level III will be deemed unsuitable.

- e) The process shall be repeated every 12 months for low-risk employees (Risk Rating 5, 4) and every 6 months for medium to high-risk employees.

Delivery to Site

The *Supplier* shall be responsible for the transportation of all **Medium Voltage Induction motors** supply delivered to Tutuka Power Station – Main stores.

4 Specification of the services to be provided.

- a) Access to site to be arranged before delivery date.
- b) No Delivery will be accepted without an official contract release order.
- c) *Supplier* delivery note must indicate partial delivery if partial delivery is made.
- d) The stock number, quantity and material short description must be stated on the delivery note.
- e) Each delivery to be recorded on receiving register and each delivery note must have unique number.
- f) Spares must be well packaged and safely transported.

5 Constraints on how the *Supplier* Provides the Goods

5.1 Programming constraints

- a) All motors must be delivered as per the required order date.
- b) Purchaser to be informed when delivery will be done at least 2 days upfront to allow for access and offloading arrangements
- c) Lead time to be negotiated upfront to ensure that *Purchaser* will receive motors in time. No adherence to lead times.
- d) All vehicles to be roadworthy.
- e) The *Supplier* will be responsible for the safe transportation of all motors from the *Supplier's* site to the *Purchaser* offloading point and liable for any damages or stolen motors.
- f) Programme not submitted within agreed time.
- g) Late deliveries due to transportation or labour strikes
- h) Motors not packed or stored correctly.
- i) Provision to be made for delays that may be caused owing to items being sourced from outside The Republic of South Africa.

5.2 Work to be done by the Delivery Date

- a) The Purchaser to acknowledge receipt of goods by stamping and signing the delivery note of the Supplier upon delivery, rejected items to be communicated after the official quality inspection is done on site by the end user of the spares rejected must be collected and corrected by the supplier at the supplier's cost
- b) Only spares specified will be accepted. Any spares that do not meet the specifications will be rejected.
- c) QC to be conducted prior to acceptance of goods, no incorrect, damaged, or faulty spares will be accepted
- d) Ensure that the delivered goods are signed for.

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- e) All the spares will be inspected and accepted by Purchaser QC and / or Engineering before payment could be processed

5.3 Marking the goods

Batches to be clearly mark and packed according to the required specifications as follows:

- d) Quantity delivered.
- e) And each Component must have a unique identification linked to the relevant *Supplier*.

- i) Physical address of Tutuka Power Station and the *Supplier*
- j) Contact details of the *Supplier*
- k) Delivery note number

5.4 Constraints at the delivery place and place of use

- a) The Supplier applies for temporary access permits (Contractor's Permit) at the Security gate, prior to the Possession Date.
- b) The Supplier's personnel are required to be always in possession of Permit.
- c) All Supplier's personnel are issued with a temporary access permit which contains the following information:
 - Name
 - ID Number
 - Company
 - Validity date
- d) No unauthorised vehicles are allowed on site.

5.5 Cooperating with Others

- a) The Supplier cooperates with the store's personnel during Delivery.
- b) The Supplier co-operates with the Purchaser's team in ensuring that the goods are delivered in accordance with all requirements.

5.6 Services & other things to be provided by the *Purchaser* or *Supplier*

- a) The *Purchaser* will determine the offloading point at time.
- b) The *Purchaser* will provide resources to offload the motors being delivered (Forklift and cranes)
- c) The *Supplier* will offload small motors.
- d) *Purchaser* to ensure access to site for deliveries during normal hours.
- e) *Purchaser* to arrange induction.
- f) *Supplier* to provide proper transportation for motors.
- g) Forklift/ overhead crane with driver will be supplied by *Purchaser* for offloading.

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5.7 Management meetings

Regular meetings of a general nature may be convened and chaired by the *Supply Manager* as follows:

Meetings of a specialist nature may be convened as specified elsewhere in this *Goods* Information or if not so specified by persons and at times and locations to suit the Parties, the nature and the progress of the manufacture of the *goods*. Records of these meetings shall be submitted to the *Supply Manager* by the person convening the meeting within five days of the meeting.

All meetings shall be recorded using minutes or a register prepared and circulated by the person who convened the meeting. Such minutes or register shall not be used for the purpose of confirming actions or instructions under the contract as these shall be done separately by the person identified in the *conditions of contract* to carry out such actions or instructions.

Attendance of meetings as required by *Purchaser* Such as: -

- a) Any meeting requested by the *Purchaser* or *Supplier*

5.8 Documentation control

- a. Each instruction, certificate, submission, proposal, record, acceptance, notification, reply and other communication which this contract requires is communicated in a form which can be read, copied and recorded.
- b. Writing is in the Language of this contract.
- c. All reports to be discussed, compiled and handed in to the *Purchaser*.
- d. All communications must be printed and filed in the *Purchaser* file.
- e. The information for motors to be provided will either be in electronic format or hard copy. Other information provided with each spare to be either in electronic format or hard copy. Information provided to be documented in such a manner that the information for each motor will be easily identifiable. All documentation supplied shall bear the OEM's official name and logo.
- f. The final design documents, manufacturing certificates, testing certificates, operating and maintenance manuals shall be delivered with motors in accordance with the Eskom standard 240-50237155 for New Induction motors Section 3.3.
- g. In addition to General Documentation requirements in 240-50237155 Rev-4 and 240-97049386 Rev-1, all documents, manuals, drawings are to have the serial number of the relevant motor, the Power Station name and description as either on the price list or revised during task order execution.
- h. All documents, manuals and drawings are to be provided in the required number of hard copies per motor. An electronic copy shall be available with the drawings, manuals and documents in PDF format.

5.9 Health and safety risk management

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The *Supplier* shall comply with the health and safety requirements contained in Annexure SHE Specification 14RISK SRM – 084 to this Service Information.

- a) All The *Purchaser's* health and safety procedures and regulations to be adhered to by the *Supplier*

SHEQ Policy

Eskom SHEQ Policy

The *Purchaser* has made a commitment to conduct business with respect and care for people, the environment and assets and that no operating condition or urgency of service justifies exposing anyone to negative risks arising from the *Purchaser* business.

Compliance with the *Purchaser's* SHEQ Policy and applicable regulations is the responsibility of every employee and *Supplier*

Supplier's SHEQ Policy

All *Contractors* shall have an OHS policy signed by the CEO of the *Supplier* and prominently displayed where employees normally report for duty.

Signed copy of the OHS policy shall form part of the SHEQ file.

SHE PLAN REQUIREMENTS:-

- a) Principal *Contractors* shall develop a suitable and sufficiently documented site specific SHE plans, based on the scope of work and client SHEQ specification.
- b) The SHE plans must be pre-approved by the client for implementation. The principal *Supplier/ Supplier* has a responsibility to send the SHE plans to the client for approval prior to commencement of work.

Health and Safety Arrangements

The *Supplier* ensures that all his personnel attend a Health and Safety Induction Course prior to contract starting date, and annual re- induction. The Induction Course is presented by the *Employer's* Safety Risk Department at the *Employer*. Arrangements are made with Safety Risk Management, by the *Contractor*.

The *Employer's* Safety Risk Manager visits and inspects the *Contractor's* workplace or site yard and the working areas to ensure that tools; machinery and Equipment comply with the minimum safety requirements.

The *Supply Manager* may instruct the *Supplier* to stop work, where the *Contractor's* personnel fail to conform to safety standards or contravene health and safety regulations. Such stop-work order is not a compensation event. The *Supply Manager* may instruct the *Supplier* to discipline his employees and to submit a disciplinary action report to the *Supply Manager*. The *Supplier* implements additional health and safety precautions where necessary.

Safety risk management

"Standard for health and safety at Tutuka Power Station - requirements to be met by *Contractors*".

Vehicle and driver safety

All drivers, passengers and pedestrians must obey vehicle safety requirements in terms of the National Road Traffic Act, Act No 93 of 1996, as amended, including other relevant provincial or local requirements.

Speed Limit

All vehicles must be driven with due consideration for personnel and property. All speed limits will be adhered to on the premises at all times.

Transportation of passengers: open LDV's:

With effect from 31 May 2006 no *purchaser's* employee or *Supplier* would be allowed to transport passengers on the back of open light delivery vehicles (LDV's). It is a legal requirement to provide safe transportation of the *purchasers* and *Supplier* employees – therefore the following will be enforced:

The *Employer's* Life Saving Rules:

Five Life Saving Rules have been developed that will apply to all the *Employer's* employees, agents, Consultants and Contractors.

- a) Rule 1: Open, Isolate, Test, Earth, Bond, And / Or insulate before touch - that is any plant operating above 1 000 V.
- b) Rule 2: Hook up at heights - no person may work at height where there is a risk of falling.
- c) Rule 3: Buckle up – no person may drive any vehicle for the *Employer's* business and/or on the *Employer's* premises: unless the driver and all passengers are wearing seat belts.

The *Purchaser* takes a "ZERO TOLERANCE" attitude to drivers and passengers who do not wear safety belts when driving in a vehicle for the *Employer's* Business and / or on the *Employer's* premises. The violation of this very important safety rule as well as any safety rule while performing work for or on behalf of the *Purchaser* may result in the *Purchaser* terminating your obligation to perform work in terms of your contract with the *Employer*.

All occupants must wear their safety belts properly and must never put the shoulder belt under their arm or behind their backs. Drivers and all passengers must buckle-up at all times for the sake of themselves and their families.

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- d) Rule 4: Be sober (no person is allowed to work under the influence of drugs and Alcohol.
- e) Rule 5: Use a permit to work – where an authorization limitation exists, no person shall work without the required permit to work.

The *Supplier* acknowledges that it is fully aware of the requirements of all the above and undertakes to employ only people who have been duly authorised in terms thereof and who have received sufficient safety training to ensure that they can comply therewith.

The *Supplier* undertakes not to do, or not to allow anything to be done which will contravene any of the provisions of the Act, Regulations or Safety and Operating Procedures.

The *Supplier* shall appoint a person who will liaise with the *Purchaser's* Safety Officer responsible for the premises relevant to this contract.

Do safety audits at the *Contractor's* premises, its workplaces and on its employees;

Refuse any employee, sub-*Supplier* or agent of the *Supplier* access to its premises if such person has been found to commit any unlawful act or any unsafe working practice or is found to be not authorised or qualifies in terms of the OHSACT;

Issue the *Supplier* with a work stop order or a compliance order should *Purchaser* become aware of any unsafe working procedures or conditions or any non-compliance with the Act, Regulations and Procedures by the *Supplier* or any of its employees, sub-Contractors or agents.

The *Contractors* Health and safety file is to be submitted for approval to the *Purchaser's* Safety Officer before contract commencement.

All work stoppages called by the *Purchaser* to be adhered to

Supplier's Responsible to ensure that his Letter of Good standing is valid at all times as stipulated in the construction regulations point 7 (C) (iv) and she specifications 2.5.2 (iv) and 3.10 *Supplier* will not be allowed on site if his letter of good standing is not valid

Security, fire protection and safety

The *Supplier* shall be responsible for ensuring the security of the works, and of his plant, equipment and materials. To that end he shall make adequate provision for access control, lighting and watchman to the works where required.

Fire protection

The provision of the *Employer's* standard NWS 1494 "Fire Prevention and Protection of *Contractor's* premises at New Works sites" shall be applicable.

Safety and incident prevention

The *Supplier* shall implement and maintain an active Site Safety and Accident Prevention Programme in accordance with the the *Puchaser's* SHEQ Specifications. The overriding regulations will however be the Occupational Health and Safety Act.
