GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. Definitions

1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.

1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.

1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.

1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.

1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.

1.7 "Day" means calendar day.

1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.

1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.

1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.

1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.

1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.

1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.

1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.

1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight

and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.

1.17 “Local content” means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.

1.18 “Manufacture” means the production of products in a factory using labor, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.

1.19 “Order” means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.

1.20 “Project site,” where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.

1.21 “Purchaser” means the organization purchasing the goods.

1.22 “Republic” means the Republic of South Africa.

1.23 “SCC” means the Special Conditions of Contract.

1.24 “Services” means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.

1.25 “Written” or “in writing” means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.

2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.

2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.

3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. Standards

4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser’s prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a

person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause except for purposes of performing the contract.

5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.

5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. Performance security

7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.

7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.

7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:

- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
- (b) A cashier's or certified cheque

7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.

8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by or preventative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.

8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.

8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.

8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.

8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.

8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove the m immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.

10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:

- (a) Performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
- (b) Furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
- (c) Furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
- (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) Training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

14.1 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) In the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) Following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty /Guarantee

15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any actor omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.

15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.

15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.

15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

15.6 The service provider should indicate if there is a services plan.

16. Payment

16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.

16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.

16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.

16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17. Prices

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Contract amendments

18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.

21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department or a local authority.

21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.

21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

(a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;

(b) If the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or

(c) If the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail

to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer /Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority ,also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.

23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

- (i) The name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
- (ii) The date of commencement of the restriction
- (iii) The period of restriction; and
- (iv)The reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name been endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favorable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security ,damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify he purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably

practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter maybe commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.

27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,

(a) The parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and

(b) The purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. Limitation of liability

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

(a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

(b) The aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing language

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

31. Notices

31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice

31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.

32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder.

This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.

33. National Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme

33.1 NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34. Prohibition of Restrictive practices

34.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding (or bid rigging).

34.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may Refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.

34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.

10. COMPLETION OF SPECIFICATION

Where specifications are designed in such a way that responses would be required from the bidders, these forms **must** be completed and submitted as part of the bid document.

11. COMPLETENESS OF BID

Bid offers will be considered if correctly completed and accompanied by all relevant certificates and other necessary applicable information.

12. CONDITIONS OF BID

- a. The successful contractor must be in a position to assume duty on the date stipulated in the letter of acceptance and/ or as agreed with ADA.
- b. No offers received by telegram, telefax, or facsimile will be considered.

- c. It shall be noted that the ADA is under no obligation to accept the lowest or any bid.
- d. The offer shall be made strictly according to the specification.
- e. By the submission of the bid, the successful bidder undertakes to appoint a supervisor for the purpose of receiving instructions relating to the provision of the service and accepting responsibility for the execution of such instructions.
- f. Bidders must provide the following particulars about themselves as part of the bid:
 - (i) Name, address and contact details of bankers together with their bank account number
 - (ii) The names, identity numbers and physical addresses of all partners in cases where persons, a partnership, or a firm consists of a partnership.
 - (iii) Proof and references where works of similar nature was performed.

13. CONTRACT PERIOD

- a. The contract period shall remain in force as determined by the contractual agreement.
- b. The commencement date shall be from the date of inception meeting and/ or as per contractual agreement.
- c. The ADA reserves the right to terminate the contract with any contractor should the contractor fail to fulfil his/ her contractual obligation in terms of the contract.

14. EQUAL BIDS

In the event that two or more bid offers have equal total points, the highest ranking bidder will be the one scoring the highest number of points in terms of B-BBEE level of contribution.

Should two or more bid offers be equal in all respects, the adjudication shall be decided by selecting a bidder with the highest points on functionality, should the bidders have equal points on functionality, the adjudication shall be decided by drawing of lots.

15. JOINT VENTURE

- 15.1 Any bid submitted by a Joint Venture / Consortium must be accompanied by a certified copy of the Joint Venture Agreement. Such agreement must specify the percentage of the bid/ contract to be undertaken by each participating entity.
- 15.2 Project execution plan signed by both parties must be submitted and the following should be considered:

- magnitude of the contract to be executed
- nature of service to be rendered

15.3 Any joint venture/ consortium wishing to claim for preference points must submit a B-BBEE level of contribution certificate issued by Verification entity accredited by SANAS or relevant body.

16. EXECUTION CAPACITY

The bidder will be required to provide an efficient and effective service. Therefore, the bidder is required to submit proof that s/he had the required capacity to execute the contract tendered for successfully. The bidder must supply references or state his/ her experience as a company to undertake the contract. References of past experience of owners/ employees of new entities must accompany the bid document, therefore bidders are required to complete and submit (Annexure A) in detail.

17. GENERAL APPROACH

A service provider may not recruit or shall not attempt to recruit an employee of the principal for purposes of preparation of the bid or for the duration of the execution of this contract or any part thereof. Such attempt will lead to a contract being terminated or may result in the rejection of the bid.

18. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Bidders are requested to provide professional, objective and impartial advice/ service and at all times hold the client's interests paramount, without any consideration for future work and strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own corporate interests. Bidders should not perform any assignment that would be in conflict with their prior or current obligations to other clients, or that may place them in a position of not being able to carry out the assignment in the best interest of the Agency. Without limitation on the generality of this rule, bidders would not be hired under the following circumstances:

- A firm, which has been engaged by the Accounting Officer/Authority to provide goods or works for a project and any of its affiliates, would not be eligible to provide consulting services for the same project. Similarly, a firm hired to provide consulting services for the preparation or implementation of a project and any of its affiliates, would be disqualified from subsequently providing goods or works or services related to the initial assignment (other than a continuation of the firm's earlier consulting services) for the same project, unless the various firms

(consultants, contractors, or suppliers) are performing the contractor's obligations under turnkey or design and build contract.

- Consultants or any of their affiliates would not be hired for any assignment which, by its nature, may be in conflict with another assignment of the consultants.

19. MENTORSHIP/ TRANSFER OF SKILLS

The bidders should ensure that there is transfer of skills to ADA and its stakeholders whilst being contracted by the agency.

20. ELIGIBILITY OF BIDDER

- The bidder shall comply with the Private Security Industry Regulatory Act No. 56 of 2001 and Regulation of 2002 and proof must be submitted with the quotation, the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993, and the conditions of employment as contained in Government Basic conditions of Employment Act No. 75 of 1997, as amended in the Government and any subsequent amendments thereafter.
- The bidder must possess and submit the required qualifications, certificates, etc. and as stipulated on the Terms of Reference in order to be eligible to bid.

21. IRREGULARITIES

Companies are encouraged to advise the ADA timeously of any possible irregularities which might come to their notice in connection with this or other contracts.

22. LATE SUBMISSION OF BIDS

Bid offers are late if they are received at the address indicated in the bid document after the stipulated closing date and time.

A late bid documents will not be considered.

23. NOTIFICATION OF ADJUDICATION OF BID

Notification of the adjudication of bid shall be in published in the media where the invitation to bid was advertised and ADA website.

24. TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE

- a) A Valid Tax Clearance Certificate/ Valid Tax Compliance Status Pin Document obtainable from SARS must be submitted with the bid before the closing date and time of the bid.
- b) Each party in the Joint Venture/ Consortium must submit an original valid Tax Clearance Certificate or Valid Tax Compliance Status Pin together with the bid before the closing date and time of bid.

25. UNSATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE

Unsatisfactory performance occurs when performance is not in accordance with the contract conditions.

Before any action is taken, the ADA shall warn the contractor by the registered/ certified mail that action will be taken in accordance with the contract conditions unless the contractor complies with the contract conditions and delivers satisfactory service within the specified reasonable time (7 days minimum). If the contractor does not perform satisfactorily despite the warning the ADA will:

- (i) Take action in terms of its delegated powers
- (ii) Make a recommendation for cancellation of the contract.

26. VALIDITY PERIOD AND EXTENSION THEREOF

The validity period for the offer / quotation must be 120 days from close of bid. However, circumstances may arise whereby the ADA may request the bidders to extend the validity period. Should this occur, the ADA will request bidders to extend the validity period under the same terms and conditions as originally tendered by the bidders. This request will be done before the expiry of the original validity period.

27. VALUE ADDED TAX (VAT)

Bid prices must be inclusive of VAT.

28. PAYMENT AND INVOICING

- a) Only upon receipt and verification of the invoice by an appropriately authorized official, will payment be effected. The invoice shall be original.
- b) Payment shall be made to the contracted bidder/ service provider **only**. Any deviations (e.g. a cession of contract) will only be accepted after relevant approval has been granted.
- c) Each order must be invoiced separately, clearly quoting the relevant order number. Supporting documents with details of such as accommodation, car hire expenses must accompany the invoice. Full details of the service rendered and reimbursable costs must be presented in the invoice or as an annexure thereto.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. OBJECTIVE

The Agribusiness Development Agency (ADA) seeks to appoint a CONTRACTOR for rendering security services for a period of thirty-six (36) months.

2. SCOPE

2.1 The Contractor will be required to guard all assets at the Makhathini Irrigation Scheme offices and Premises.

2.2 The premises mentioned in 2.1 above refers to the following work sites:

2.2.1 Main Offices (section 2) - Offices for the Manager: Operations, Infrastructure and Farmer Development Units including entrance (access) control at gates.

2.2.2 Section 1 and Section 2 premises, including the central pump station and entrance (access) control at gates.

2.2.3 Five (05) Pump Stations: P1, P4, P12, P14, Block 6, 7 and 8, including entrance (access) control at gates.

2.2.4 Inputs store premises including entrance (access) control at gates; AND

2.2.5 Infrastructure workshop including entrance (access) control at gates.

2.3 The total number of security officers required is eighteen (18):

- **Six (6) armed (firearm with ammunition) Security Officers for day shift**
 - **Twelve (12) armed (firearm with ammunition) Security Officers for night shift**
- ADA reserves the right to increase or decrease the listed quantities, as and when required, in which case a variation order to add or omit will be issued and the total quoted price will be amended accordingly. This will be negotiated with the appointed bidder should a need arise.**

2.4 A security company is required to provide ADA with security officers who have attended and passed the requisite security courses at one of the official training centers recognised by the Department of Labour. The responsibility of these security officers will be to ensure the safety of property and personnel from burglary, theft, vandalism, or threat of any nature, including armed robbery.

2.5 It is recommended that the security company must be based or have a branch office in and around the area where ADA Mjindi Makhathini Irrigation Scheme is situated.

Furthermore, the security company must be vetted and obtain security clearance from the relevant authorities on submission of bid/quotation. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the transportation of his staff to and from the different sites.

- 2.6 The CONTRACTOR is required to tender the total amount to be charged and be inclusive of VAT. There will be no price adjustment for this Contract. Only Statutory increases in the minimum wage and/or VAT may be considered. Monthly payment will be made on submission of a valid tax invoice and upon settlement of any outstanding liability owed to ADA.
- 2.7 The CONTRACTOR is required to take an insurance cover of R1, 000, 000.00 to reimburse Mjindi on losses resulting from theft during the contract period. CONTRACTOR will be required to provide proof that the insurance is active every three months. Proof of insurance will be verified with the Insurance Company by Mjindi.
- 2.8 The CONTRACTOR is required to submit certified copies of the SAPS Clearance Certificates for Directors and the Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority (PSIRA) certificate for the company.
- 2.9 The CONTRACTOR is required to submit at least **twelve (12)** firearm licenses and firearm competency certificates for all the eighteen (18) security guards to be utilized for the contract.
- All the officers must comply with the Security Industries minimum standard of education. They must also have attended and passed a security course and firearm competency course at one of the official training centers recognized by the Department of Labour.
- 2.10 The CONTRACTOR shall comply with the Private Security Industry Regulatory Act No. 56 of 2001 and Regulation of 2002 and proof must be submitted with the quotation, the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993, and the conditions of employment as contained in Government Basic conditions of Employment Act No. 75 of 1997, as amended in the Government and any subsequent amendments thereafter.
- 2.11 The CONTRACTOR shall have extensive knowledge of and experience in the operation and functions of the security services.
- 2.12 The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the provision of adequate, effective two-

way radios and batteries, Working Torch (for patrols), batons, handcuffs, firearms and ammunition, boots and uniforms, and identification cards, gun safe, detective device, occurrence books, incoming and outgoing registers, pocket books. The two-way radios are to be in direct contact with the CONTRACTORS control room at all times during the shift to ensure safe working conditions for security staff.

- 2.13 The CONTRACTOR shall provide ADA with the monthly duty roster of security officers on duty, before the beginning of each month.
- 2.14 The CONTRACTOR shall provide ADA with the firearm register of each fire arm to be used at site each month indicating license numbers.
- 2.15 The security officers shall be appropriately dressed in uniform at all times while on duty. The conduct and appearance of security officers is to reflect discipline, neatness and efficiency.
- 2.16 The security officers shall hold valid competency certificate in handling firearms.
- 2.17 All vehicles or persons entering and leaving the premises shall sign the Security Control Sheet. Deviations shall only apply to the MECs (Members of Executive Committee), Head of Departments (HODs) and deemed relevant persons entering and leaving premises.
- 2.18 Roving patrols of the premises shall be undertaken by all the Grade C security officers on a continuous basis with record of such.
- 2.19 The Contractor shall further ensure vehicle/s are available on premises at all times for use in transporting officers to their posts, emergencies and routine patrols.
- 2.20 Searches of all vehicles and personnel entering and leaving the premises are to be undertaken, and any armaments or unusual items are to be reported and are not allowed to enter the premises.
- 2.21 Inspections of office door handles for locks and window handles to be undertaken by the Security Officers during roving patrols.
- 2.22 In terms of Act 56 of 2001 the CONTRACTOR shall have authority to arrest any person

found committing an offence on, or in respect of the premises or any part thereof.

- 2.23 The CONTRACTOR shall supply ADA, at least a week in advance, a list of changed names of the security officers who will be performing duties at the premises.
- 2.24 The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for ensuring that security guards are on duty timeously and are present at all times for the duration of their shift.
- 2.25 Security officers must be properly seated, standing or roving when on duty. The practice of leaning against buildings or against motor vehicles, or sitting/lying on the floor will not be accepted. Security officers may not smoke, eat, or drink in view of the general public. Security officers will be at all times make use of appropriate toilet facilities for the performance and completion of their ablutions. Urination and defecation in any other area - behind buildings and alongside main access roads used by the public, will not be tolerated or accepted.

3. BREACH

- 3.1 In the event of the CONTRACTOR failing to comply with its obligations under this contract for which no specific remedy has been provided, Agribusiness Development Agency may by a written notice addressed to the CONTRACTOR, require the CONTRACTOR to remedy its breach within 5 (five) business days of the date of such notice. If the CONTRACTOR fails to remedy its breach within the aforesaid period ADA may, without prejudice to any other rights it may otherwise have against the CONTRACTOR, to exercise all or any number of the following rights either—
- 3.1.1 to suspend further payments to the CONTRACTOR;
- 3.1.2 to appoint any other person or persons to complete the execution of the project, in which event the CONTRACTOR shall be held liable for the costs incurred in the appointment of such person or persons as well as reasonable costs related to the delay in the project;
- 3.1.3 claim specific performance of the obligations of the CONTRACTOR, or
- 3.1.4 cancel this contract and recover damages for breach of contract, from the CONTRACTOR.
- 3.2 Notwithstanding clause 3.1, if the CONTRACTOR commits two or more breaches of any provision of this contract, Agribusiness Development Agency shall be entitled

without prejudice to any of its other rights or remedies in law or under this contract to terminate this contract forthwith by notice in writing to the CONTRACTOR.

- 3.3 In the event of the contract being cancelled, the Agribusiness Development Agency shall have the right to recover such losses, damages or additional costs by means of set-off from moneys due or which may become due in terms of this contract or any other contract or from any guarantee provided for the due fulfilment of the contract and until such time as the amount of such losses, damages or additional costs have been determined, to retain such moneys or guarantee or any deposit as security for any loss which Agribusiness Development Agency may suffer or may have suffered.
- 3.4 In the event the Agribusiness Development Agency failing to comply with its obligations under this contract for which no specific remedy has been provided, the CONTRACTOR may by written notice addressed to Agribusiness Development Agency, require ADA to remedy its breach within 5 (five) business days of the date of such notice. If Agribusiness Development Agency fails to remedy its breach within the aforesaid period, the CONTRACTOR may:-
- 3.4.1 Enforce strict compliance with the terms and conditions of the contract; or
- 3.4.2 Cancel the contract.

4. TERMINATION OF SERVICE

- 4.1. The stipulations of the Government Procurement General Conditions of Contract shall apply in particular to cases of any failure to comply with the conditions of contract, or where an unsatisfactory service is rendered.
- 4.2. The Agribusiness Development Agency may, in no less than 5 (five) business days provide a written notice of termination to the CONTRACTOR, terminate and/or defer the provision of any Services, should —
- 4.3.1 The CONTRACTOR fail to remedy a failure in the performance of the security services, within 5 (five) business days of receipt of such notice, or within such further period as ADA may approve in writing;
- 4.3.2 The CONTRACTOR fail, in the absence of any review or appeal proceedings, to comply with any final decision reached as a result of any legal or arbitration proceedings;

- 4.3.3 The CONTRACTOR take steps to place itself in liquidation, whether voluntary or under judicial management in either case whether provisionally or finally;
- 4.3.4 The CONTRACTOR take steps to deregister itself or is deregistered;
- 4.3.5 The CONTRACTOR commit an act which would be an act of insolvency as defined by the Insolvency act of 1936 as amended from time to time
- 4.3.6 The CONTRACTOR fail to satisfy a judgement in excess of R 1, 000, 000.00 (one million rand) entered against itself within 21 (twenty one) days after it becomes aware of the judgement, except if it provides evidence on an ongoing basis to the reasonable satisfaction of Agri-business Development Agency that steps have been initiated to appeal, review or rescind a judgement and to procure suspension of execution of the judgement and that such steps are being expeditiously pursued; the period of 21 (twenty one) days shall run from the date on which judgement becomes final, or the date on which the attempt to procure the suspension of the execution fails.
- 4.3.7 The CONTRACTOR, in the judgement of the Agri-business Development Agency, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract. For purposes of this clause -

“corrupt practice” means the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of an official in the selection process or in contract execution.

“fraudulent practice” means a misrepresentation of facts, in order to influence a selection process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of Agribusiness Development Agency, and includes collusive practice among CONTRACTORS (prior to, or after, submission of proposals), designed to establish prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive Agri-business Development Agency and other CONTRACTORS of the benefits of free and open competition; or

- 4.3.8 Agribusiness Development Agency decide at any stage of the contract to terminate this contract or temporarily defer work, or any part thereof, and not to proceed with the obligations in terms of the contract.
- 4.3.9 Agribusiness Development Agency, in its sole discretion, and for any reason whatsoever, decide to terminate the contract.

- 4.4 Agribusiness Development Agency reserves the right to terminate the contract upon issue of one month written notice should the needs of the entity change during the contract period.
- 4.5 Should this agreement be terminated for any reason whatsoever or lapse at the end of the contract period, the CONTRACTOR shall immediately hand over to the entity any document, drawing, material or record developed or obtained by the CONTRACTOR in the course of discharging any duty under this agreement.

- 6.3 The Agri-business Development Agency and CONTRACTOR will enter into and sign a Services Level Agreement upon appointment of the suitable CONTRACTOR.
- 6.4 Penalties shall become payable if any equipment or assets or materials lost during period of the above agreement and in which the CONTRACTOR is on duty or supposed to be on duty.
- 6.5 The CONTRACTOR will be expected to replace or pay the market value of item/s which is/are lost including labour costs within 2 months of report of such incident.
- 6.6 The CONTRACTOR should comply with the terms stipulated above.
- 6.7 **The Agribusiness Development Agency reserves the right not to award the quotation or bid, and to cancel the quotation or bid.**

7. SERVICE DURATION

- 7.1 The project will be for the duration of thirty-six (36) months subject to performance review.

10. ARITHMETICAL ERRORS, OMISSIONS AND DISCREPENCIES

govern and the price / rate shall be corrected.

- 10.2 Where there is an error in the total of the prices either as a result of other corrections required by the checking process or in the Contractor's addition of prices, the total of the prices shall govern and the Contractor will be asked to revise selected item process (and their rates if bills of quantities apply) to achieve the quoted total of the prices.
