Q1: Can you kindly confirm the number email users/boxes that we need to quote for?

A: 2852

**Q2**: Please clarify; ". Ability to send out documents that require an Electronic Signature on the document" By Electronic Signature you are referring to the ordinary Electronic Signature, Digital signature and Advanced Electronic Signatures.

A: We are referring to email signature appended at the bottom of every email sent

Q3: What kind of accreditation do you guys need?

A: Proof that you have a relationship with the software manufacture

**Q4**: I just wanted to find out more about the services required for the auto email signature and disclaimer. Which software platform is required for the hosting, is there a specific domain that's used?

A: The signature is required to be appended at the bottom of every email sent. Our emails are hosted in Office 365. We are using active directory/Azure Active Directory

**Q5**: As we have only recently signed our partners up, they have yet to deploy commercial instances of the software in SA. Hence, we would like to Co-bid with our partners.
