## PROVISION OF THE DIMSON MARSH STAUNTON DATASET AND THE LICENCE FOR THE USE OF THE DATA FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR FOR THE PORTS REGULATOR OF SOUTH AFRICA (PRSA)

#### 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. Ports Regulator of South Africa (PRSA) is a Schedule 3A public entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, 1 of 1999 (PFMA). Port Regulator South Africa must fully comply with all the requirements of the PFMA.
- 1.2. The Ports Regulator is the independent National Regulator for the South African ports, governed by the National Ports Act, 2005 (Act No. 12 of 2005). In terms of section 30 (1) and (2) of the National Ports Act, the main function of the Regulator is to:
  - Exercise economic regulation for the ports system in line with government's strategic objectives.
  - Promote equity of access of ports and facilities and service provider by ports.
  - Monitor the activities of the National Ports Authority to ensure that it performs it functions in accordance with the act; and
  - Hear appeals and complaints contemplated in terms of Section 48 of the Act.

#### 2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Request for Information is to request service provider/s to submit their proposals for the provision of the Dimson Marsh Staunton dataset and the licence for the use of the data for a period of one year for the Ports Regulator of South Africa (PRSA)

#### 3. MOTIVATION

The Regulator is required to utilise the information contained within the DMS dataset for the calculation of the Market Risk Premium in accordance with its Tariff Methodology as published in March 2023.

The Tariff Methodology for the South African port system adopts a Revenue Required Model, with the Weighted Average Cost of Capital (WACC) serving as a component to the Revenue Requirement model. The WACC model adopts a Capital Asset Pricing Model which considers the weighted cost of equity together with the weighted average cost of debt. In the calculation of the weighted average cost of equity, the Regulator must consider the Market Risk Premium (MRP) to establish the cost of equity for each tariff period.

For certainty of the parameters used in the calculation of the WACC, the Ports Regulator prescribes for an MRP found in the DMS Dataset or book published by the three professors at the London Business School, namely, Elroy Dimson, Paul Marsh and Mike Staunton collectively known as DMS. The dataset and/or the book presents information depicting over 101 years of annual global investment returns. This information avoids own calculation of the MRP which when calculated by regulators and regulated entities creates differences and a point of argument.
