# TERMS OF REFERENCE – APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER FOR THE SUPPLY, DELIVERY, INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF TVS AND DECODERS AS AND WHEN REQUIRED FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS IN THE KRUGER NATIONAL PARK.

The scope of work involves the appointment of a service provider for the supply, delivery, installation and maintenance of Tvs and decoders as and when required for a period of 3 years in the Kruger National Park. The installation of work should be in accordance with relevant SANS standards.

#### INTRODUCTION TO SANPARKS

SANParks was initially established in terms of the now repealed National Parks Act, 57of 1976 and continue to exist in terms of the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 57 of 2003; with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: 25 public entity.

South African National Parks (SANParks) cannot amend the National Treasury's General Conditions of Contract (GCC).
