1. What is BDA?

Three Suspects Arrested for Drug Related Offences as Barkly East SAPS Follow Up on Positive Information

The South African Police Service confirms the arrest of three suspects on charges of possession of drugs following a successful follow-up operation based on positive information.

On 26 January 2026 members of Visible Policing Barkly East acted on information received regarding suspected drug-related activities in the Mthobo Nkululeko township.

Upon arrival at the identified premises, police conducted a search which led to the discovery of suspected drugs.

Three suspects age 22,35 and 36 were immediately arrested after being found in possession of 57 mandrax tablets in different sizes ,7 small bags of tik and a bag of loose dagga.

The drugs were seized and will form part of the evidence in the ongoing investigation.

The suspects appeared before the Barkly East magistrate court on the 27 January 2026 on charges relating to the possession of drugs.

The Joe Gqabi District Commissioner Major General Lindelwa Vellem commended the members on the swift reaction and the successful arrests and confiscations.

The SAPS continues to intensify efforts to combat drug-related crimes and she urges members of the community to continue working with the police by providing information that can assist in preventing and combating criminal activities.

SAPS Recovers Unlicensed Firearm In Ugie

Ugie , 29 January 2026 - Members from the Khowa K9 unit in collaboration with the Ugie detectives has successfully recovered an unlicensed firearm during a combined operation conducted in Land-kamp locality on the 28 January 2026 at 03:00 in the early morning hours.

The operation forms part of ongoing efforts to combat serious and violent crime, curb the proliferation of illegal firearms, and ensure the safety of communities.

During the operation, SAPS members conducted a search of the identified premises which led to the recovery of a unlicensed firearm.

A 19 year old suspect was arrested in connection with the possession of the unlicensed firearm and is expected to appear before the Ugie magistrate court on the 29 January 2026.

On further investigation it was also determined that the recovered firearm may be linked to a previous business Robbery and a second suspect age 28 was also arrested.



The Joe Gqabi District Commissioner Major General Lindelwa Vellem has commended all members involved for their dedication and commitment and reiterated that such operations will continue as part of the police's commitment to restoring peace and stability.
