Tenders will be evaluated in line with the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2017, Pertaining to Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No. 5 of 2000 in accordance with the evaluation criteria in line with IDT Supply Chain Management Policy, as follows:

Stage 1 - Mandatory

PHASE ONE - MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS/ DOCUMENTATION MANDATORY RETURNABLE DOCUMENTS

1. Authority to Sign this Bid (for companies that has more than one director)
 2. Service Providers must be registered on Central Supplier Database (MAAA Number to be used to verify registration)
 3. Valid and Active CIDB Grading certificate as per the above each mentioned project and higher - JV's to submit consolidated CIDB Grading, which equates to the required grading
 4. Valid COIDA or FEM certificates - If JV all partners must submit COIDA or FEM Certificates
 5. Fully Completed and Signed form of offer All blanks spaces must be completed
 6. Fully Completed and signed
 - SBD1: Invitation to bid
 - SBD4: Bidder's disclosure
 - SBD 6.1: Preference points claim form in terms of PPPFA, Procurement Regulations 2017
 - Fully & Duly Completed and Signed Preference points claim form in terms of PPPFA, Procurement Regulations 2017 (SBD 6.1).
- All blanks spaces must be completed. Bidders to indicate items that are not applicable
- SBD 6.2 Local Content form
 - Fully & Duly Completed and Signed Local content form (SBD 6.2) including all the annexures C, D & E. Bidders must return Annexure C. Annexure D & E to be kept by the bidder for verification/audit upon appointment. All blanks spaces must be completed. Bidders to indicate items that are not applicable.
 - Only locally (South Africa) manufactured product that meet the stipulated minimum threshold for local content will be considered (Preferential Procurement Regulations 2017).
- A Bid that fails to meet the stipulated threshold for local production content is unacceptable
7. 30% Subcontracting In order to advance selected designated groups, IDT has decided to apply pre-qualifying criteria for this bid in terms of regulation 4(1) (c) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2017 that only tenderers sub-contracting a minimum of 30% to any An Exempted Micro Enterprise (EMEs) or Qualifying Small Enterprise (QSEs) which is at least 51% owned by black people who are women or
 - b) An EMEs or which is at least 51% owned by black's people with disabilities; or
 - c) An Exempted Micro Enterprise (EMEs) or Qualifying Small Enterprise (QSEs) which is at least 51% owned by black people who are youth.
- The bidders must select sub-contractors from the CIDB database who are registered on CSD
- A list of suppliers to be used for sub-contracting purpose will be made available on the IDT website
- Bidders or contractors must submit proof of subcontracting agreement, which is signed between the main contractor and the subcontractor. The following must be attached to the subcontracting agreement
- Proof of BBBEE status of the subcontractor
 - CIDB Grading -Grade 6GB The maximum grading required is grade 6Gb if the bidder intent to subcontract more than 1 company. Should the bidder subcontract multiple companies the consolidated grading must equate to Gr 6GB

- Signed Subcontracting Agreement
 - Should the bidder subcontract more than one bidder, the consolidated percentage must equate to 30% allocated for subcontracting. 30% subcontracting is a Condition of Tender
- NB: The Tenderers who fail to comply with this requirement would be considered as being not acceptable and will be disqualified and will not be considered for further evaluation or award

 - 10 Compulsory Briefing Session – Briefing session attendance Register must be signed at the Briefing Meeting

Stage 2 – Functionality Routine Scale.

Quality/ Functionality: 100 points: Client references and Relevant experience on similar large-scale projects = **35**, Client references = **15**
Safety Health & Environmental Quality (SHEQ) specific plan = **10**, Qualification and competency of key personnel = **20**, Programme schedule = **10**, Schedule, Availability of plant and equipment= **10**

NB: Only tenders who obtain 70% (70 points) minimum functionality threshold will be evaluated further.

Stage 3 – Price and BBBEE

90/10 Preference points system will be used where 90 points is for price and 10 points for Preference BBBEE.

Original/ Certified B-BBEE certificate issued by an accounting officer as contemplated in the CCA or a sworn affidavits in terms of the amended BBBEE codes in accordance with SBD 6.1

Tenders tendering as joint ventures/ consortiums are required to submit an original/ certified consolidated B-BBEE certificate issued by an accounting officer as contemplated in the CCA or a sworn affidavits in terms of the amended BBBEE codes in accordance with SBD 6.1, or valid Verification Agency accredited by SANAS in order to qualify for points for the B-BBEE status level as one entity.

Tender validity period is 120 days
