1.0 BACKGROUND AND INFORMATION

Periodic reassessment of the the nuclear liabilities associated with past strategic nuclear facilities is dictated by the Policy Procedure on the Management of Nuclear Liabilities Arising from Past Strategic Nuclear Facilities. The policy prescribes amongst other the following:

- Reassessments to be performed every 3-5 years, or at a frequency as determined by the minister in order to ensure alignment with the Medium Term Expenditure Framework
- The reassessment of stage 1 D&D disused facilities was conducted in 2023/2024
- The Nuclear Liabilities Assessment Methodology must be accepted by an Independent Expert and be presented for approval to the Necsa Group Exco and the Necsa Board, reviewd by the NLCC before submitted for approval to the Minister.
- Independent Expert to perform independent review of liability assessments.
- Outcomes of the independent review and corrective measures to address any issues raised by the independent expert to be presented to the Nuclear Liabilities Cordination Committee (NLCC).
- Appointment of the independent expert for the review of the liability assessment shall be done in consultation with NLCC.
- Nuclear Liabilities Assessment Methodology must also be inline with the Auditor General recommendations

2.0 PURPOSE

The purpose of this document is to present the terms of reference to appoint an independent expert to express an independent opinion on the 2023/2024FY Stage 1 reassessment of nuclear liabilities associated with past disused strategic nuclear facilities.
