SECTION 1: BACKGROUND, OBJECTIVE AND SPECIFICATION

1. INTRODUCTION

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) is a public entity established by the Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997 as amended, to regulate the National Lottery and other lotteries and to administer the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund ("NLDTF"). In December 2014, the Lotteries Amendment Act 32 of 2013 was promulgated and Regulations thereof published on 14 April 2015.

In line with the requirements of the Public Finance Management Act No. 1 of 1999 ("PFMA") and Treasury Regulations the NLC seeks to utilise the services of Teamwork.com an online project management software application software provider with additional risk and other functionality.

2. OBJECTIVES

To appoint a service provider to supply Teamwork.com ready to use fully collaborative online project management software (No customization).

3. NLC SPECIFICATIONS

The application/software must have the following:

SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotations (RFQ)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the NLC.
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFQ without prior written permission from the NLC.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the NLC.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official NLC Purchase Order form has been received.
- 1.6 Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za.
- 1.7 Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Summary report) and ensure that their tax matters are compliant.

2. General rules and instructions

- 2.1 News and press releases
- 2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the NLC.
- 2.2 Precedence of documents
- 2.2.1 This RFQ consists of a number of sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFQ and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFQ submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFQ shall take precedence.
- 2.2.2 Where this RFQ is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that the NLC may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or

- acknowledged by the NLC.
- 2.2.3 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFQ. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of the NLC as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of the NLC in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.
- 2.3 Preferential procurement reform
- 2.4 The NLC supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, the NLC insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B-BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.

- 2.8 Language
- 2.8.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.
- 2.9 Gender
- 2.9.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.

- 2.10.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFQ document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.

1.2 Bid Formats
