Z1 Cession delegation and assignment

- Z1.1 The *Contractor* does not cede, delegate or assign any of its rights or obligations to any person without the written consent of the *Employer*.
- Z1.2 Notwithstanding the above, the *Employer* may on written notice to the *Contractor* cede and delegate its rights and obligations under this contract to any of its subsidiaries or any of its present divisions or operations which may be converted into separate legal entities as a result of the restructuring of the Electricity Supply Industry.

Z2 Joint ventures

- Z2.1 If the *Contractor* constitutes a joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons or organisations then these persons or organisations are deemed to be jointly and severally liable to the *Employer* for the performance of this contract.
- Z2.2 Unless already notified to the *Employer*, the persons or organisations notify the *Service Manager* within two weeks of the Contract Date of the key person who has the authority to bind the *Contractor* on their behalf.
- Z2.3 The *Contractor* does not alter the composition of the joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons without the consent of the *Employer* having been given to the *Contractor* in writing.

Z3 Change of Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status

- Z3.1 Where a change in the *Contractor's* legal status, ownership or any other change to his business composition or business dealings results in a change to the *Contractor's* B-BBEE status, the *Contractor* notifies the *Employer* within seven days of the change.
- Z3.2 The *Contractor* is required to submit an updated verification certificate and necessary supporting documentation confirming the change in his B-BBEE status to the *Service Manager* within thirty days of the notification or as otherwise instructed by the *Service Manager*.
- Z3.3 Where, as a result, the *Contractor's* B-BBEE status has decreased since the Contract Date the *Employer* may either re-negotiate this contract or alternatively, terminate the *Contractor's* obligation to Provide the Service.
- Z3.4 Failure by the *Contractor* to notify the *Employer* of a change in its B-BBEE status may constitute a reason for termination. If the *Employer* terminates in terms of this clause, the procedures on termination are P1, P2 and P4 as stated in clause 92, and the amount due is A1 and A3 as stated in clause 93.

Z4 Confidentiality

- Z4.1 The Contractor does not disclose or make any information arising from or in connection with this contract available to Others. This undertaking does not, however, apply to information which at the time of disclosure or thereafter, without default on the part of the Contractor, enters the public domain or to information which was already in the possession of the Contractor at the time of disclosure (evidenced by written records in existence at that time). Should the Contractor disclose information to Others in terms of clause 25.1, the Contractor ensures that the provisions of this clause are complied with by the recipient.
- Z4.2 If the *Contractor* is uncertain about whether any such information is confidential, it is to be regarded as such until notified otherwise by the *Service Manager*.
- Z4.3 In the event that the *Contractor* is, at any time, required by law to disclose any such information which is required to be kept confidential, the *Contractor*, to the extent permitted by law prior to disclosure, notifies the *Employer* so that an appropriate protection order and/or any other action can be taken if possible, prior to any disclosure. In the event that such protective order is not, or cannot, be obtained, then the *Contractor* may disclose that portion of the information which it is required to be disclosed by law and uses reasonable efforts to obtain assurances that confidential treatment will be afforded to the information so disclosed.
- Z4.4 The taking of images (whether photographs, video footage or otherwise) of the Affected Property or any portion thereof, in the course of Providing the Service and after the end of the *service period*, requires the prior written consent of the *Service Manager*. All rights in and to all such images vests exclusively in the *Employer*.
- Z4.5 The *Contractor* ensures that all his subcontractors abide by the undertakings in this clause.

Z5 Waiver and estoppel: Add to core clause 12.3:

Z5.1 Any extension, concession, waiver or relaxation of any action stated in this contract by the Parties, the *Service Manager* or the *Adjudicator* does not constitute a waiver of rights, and does not give rise to an estoppel unless the Parties agree otherwise and confirm such agreement in writing.

Z6 Health, safety and the environment: Add to core clause 27.4

Z6.1 The *Contractor* undertakes to take all reasonable precautions to maintain the health and safety of persons in and about the execution of the *service*. Without limitation the *Contractor*: accepts that the *Employer* may appoint him as the "Principal Contractor" (as defined and provided for under the Construction Regulations 2014 (promulgated under the Occupational

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- Health & Safety Act 85 of 1993) ("the Construction Regulations") for the Affected Property; warrants that the total of the Prices as at the Contract Date includes a sufficient amount for proper compliance with the Construction Regulations, all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and the health and safety rules, guidelines and procedures provided for in this contract and generally for the proper maintenance of health & safety in and about the execution of the *service*; and
- undertakes, in and about the execution of the *service*, to comply with the Construction Regulations and with all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Contractor's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.
- Z6.2 The *Contractor*, in and about the execution of the *service*, complies with all applicable environmental laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Contractor's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.

Z7 Provision of a Tax Invoice and interest. Add to core clause 51

- Z7.1 Within one week of receiving a payment certificate from the *Service Manager* in terms of core clause 51.1, the *Contractor* provides the *Employer* with a tax invoice in accordance with the *Employer*'s procedures stated in the Service Information, showing the amount due for payment equal to that stated in the payment certificate.
- Z7.2 If the *Contractor* does not provide a tax invoice in the form and by the time required by this contract, the time by when the *Employer* is to make a payment is extended by a period equal in time to the delayed submission of the correct tax invoice. Interest due by the *Employer* in terms of core clause 51.2 is then calculated from the delayed date by when payment is to be made.
- Z7.3 The *Contractor* (if registered in South Africa in terms of the companies Act) is required to comply with the requirements of the Value Added Tax Act, no 89 of 1991 (as amended) and to include the *Employer*'s VAT number 4740101508 on each invoice he submits for payment.

Z8 Notifying compensation events

Z8.1 Delete the last paragraph of core clause 61.3 and replace with:

If the *Contractor* does not notify a compensation event within eight weeks of becoming aware of the event, he is not entitled to a change in the Prices.

Z9 *Employer's* limitation of liability

- Z9.1 The *Employer's* liability to the *Contractor* for the *Contractor's* indirect or consequential loss is limited to R0.00 (zero Rand)
- Z9.2 The *Contractor*'s entitlement under the indemnity in 82.1 is provided for in 60.1(12) and the *Employer*'s liability under the indemnity is limited to compensation as provided for in core clause 63 and X19.11 if Option X19 Task Order applies to this contract.

Z10 Termination: Add to core clause 91.1, at the second main bullet point, fourth sub-bullet point, after the words "against it":

Z10.1 or had a business rescue order granted against it.

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Z11 Ethics

For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

Affected Party means, as the context requires, any party, irrespective of whether it is the Contractor

or a third party, such party's employees, agents, or Subcontractors or Subcontractor's

employees, or any one or more of all of these parties' relatives or friends,

Coercive Action

means to harm or threaten to harm, directly or indirectly, an Affected Party or the property of an Affected Party, or to otherwise influence or attempt to influence an

Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,

Collusive Action

means where two or more parties co-operate to achieve an unlawful or illegal purpose, including to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,

Committing Party

Z13 Nuclear Liability

- Z13.2 The *Employer* is solely responsible for and indemnifies the *Contractor* or any other person against any and all liabilities which the *Contractor* or any person may incur arising out of or resulting from nuclear damage, as defined in Act 47 of 1999, save to the extent that any liabilities are incurred due to the unlawful intent of the *Contractor* or any other person or the presence of the *Contractor* or that person or any property of the *Contractor* or such person at or in the KNPS or on the KNPS site, without the permission of the *Employer* or of a person acting on behalf of the *Employer*.
- Z13.3 Subject to clause Z13.4 below, the *Employer* waives all rights of recourse, arising from the aforesaid, save to the extent that any claims arise or liability is incurred due or attributable to the unlawful intent of the *Contractor* or any other person, or the presence of the *Contractor* or that person or any property of the *Contractor* or such person at or in the KNPS or on the KNPS site, without the permission of the *Employer* or of a person acting on behalf of the *Employer*.
- Z13.4 The *Employer* does not waive its rights provided for in section 30 (7) of Act 47 of 1999, or any replacement section dealing with the same subject matter.
- Z13.5 The protection afforded by the provisions hereof shall be in effect until the KNPS is decommissioned.

Z14 Asbestos

For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

AAIA means approved asbestos inspection authority.

ACM means asbestos containing materials.

AL means action level, i.e. a level of 50% of the OEL, i.e. 0.1 regulated asbestos fibres

per ml of air measured over a 4 hour period. The value at which proactive actions is

required in order to control asbestos exposure to prevent exceeding the OEL.

Ambient Air means breathable air in area of work with specific reference to breathing zone, which

is defined to be a virtual area within a radius of approximately 30cm from the nose inlet.

OEL means occupational exposure limit.

Parallel Measurements means measurements performed in parallel, yet separately, to existing measurements

to verify validity of results.

Safe Levels means airborne asbestos exposure levels conforming to the Standard's requirements

for safe processing, handling, storing, disposal and phase-out of asbestos and

asbestos containing material, equipment and articles.

Standard means the *Employer*'s Asbestos Standard 32-303: Requirements for Safe Processing,

Handling, Storing, Disposal and Phase-out of Asbestos and Asbestos Containing

Material, Equipment and Articles.

SANAS means the South African National Accreditation System.

TWA means the average exposure, within a given workplace, to airborne asbestos fibres,

normalised to the baseline of a 4 hour continuous period, also applicable to short term

exposures, i.e. 10-minute TWA.

- Z14.1 The Employer ensures that the Ambient Air in the area where the Contractor will Provide the Services conforms to the acceptable prescribed South African standard for asbestos, as per the regulations published in GNR 155 of 10 February 2002, under the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) ("Asbestos Regulations"). The OEL for asbestos is 0.2 regulated asbestos fibres per millilitre of air as a 4-hour TWA, averaged over any continuous period of four hours, and the short term exposure limit of 0.6 regulated asbestos fibres per millilitre of air as a 10-minute TWA, averaged over any 10 minutes, measured in accordance with HSG248 and monitored according to HSG173 and OESSM.

All measurements and reporting are effected by an independent, competent, and certified occupational hygiene inspection body, i.e. a SANAS accredited and Department of Employment and Labour approved AAIA. The *Contractor* may perform Parallel Measurements and related control measures at the *Contractor*'s expense. For the purposes of compliance the results generated from Parallel Measurements are evaluated only against South African statutory limits as detailed in clause Z14.1. Control measures conform to the requirements stipulated in the AAIA-approved asbestos work plan.
- Z14.3 The Employer manages asbestos and ACM according to the Standard.
- Z14.4 In the event that any asbestos is identified while Providing the Services, a risk assessment is conducted and if so required, with reference to possible exposure to an airborne concentration of above the AL for asbestos, immediate control measures are implemented and relevant air monitoring conducted in order to declare the area safe.
- Z14.5 The *Contractor*'s personnel are entitled to stop working and leave the contaminated area forthwith until such time that the area of concern is declared safe by either Compliance Monitoring or an AAIA approved control measure intervention, for example, per the emergency asbestos work plan, if applicable.
- Z14.6 The Contractor continues to Provide the Services, without additional control measures presented, on presentation of Safe Levels. The contractually agreed dates to Provide the Services, including the Completion Date, are adjusted accordingly. The contractually agreed dates are extended by the notification periods required by regulations 3 and 21 of the Asbestos Regulations, 2001.
- Z14.7 Any removal and disposal of asbestos, asbestos containing materials and waste, is done by a registered asbestos contractor, instructed by the *Employer* at the *Employer*'s expense, and conducted in line with South African legislation

This is further confirmed by Clause 20.1 which states, "The *Contractor* Provides the Service in accordance with the Service Information". Hence the *Contractor* does **not** Provide the Service in accordance with the Price List. The Price List is only a pricing document.

Link to the Contractor's plan

Clause 21.4 states "The *Contractor* provides information which shows how each item description on the Price List relates to the operations on each plan which he submits for acceptance". Hence when compiling the *price list*, the tendering contractor needs to develop his first clause 21.2 plan in such a way that operations shown on it can be priced in the *price list* and result in a satisfactory cash flow in terms of clause 11.2(17).

Preparing the *price list*

Before preparing the *price list*, both the *Employer* and tendering contractors should read the TSC3 Guidance Notes pages 14 and 15. In an Option A contract, either Party may have entered items into the *price list* either as a process of offer and acceptance (tendering) or by negotiation depending on the nature of the *service* to be provided. Alternatively the *Employer*, in his Instructions to Tenderers or in a Tender Schedule, may have listed some items that he requires the *Contractor* to include in the *price list* to be prepared and priced by him.

It is assumed that in preparing or finalising the *price list* the *Contractor*:

- Has taken account of the guidance given in the TSC3 Guidance Notes relevant to Option A;
- Understands the function of the Price List and how work is priced and paid for;
- Is aware of the need to link operations shown in his plan to items shown in the Price List;
- Has listed and priced items in the *price list* which are inclusive of everything necessary and incidental to Providing the Service in accordance with the Service Information, as it was at the time of tender, as well as correct any Defects not caused by an *Employer's* risk;
- Has priced work he decides not to show as a separate item within the Prices or rates of other listed items in order to fulfil the obligation to complete the *service* for the tendered total of the Prices.
- Understands there is no adjustment to items priced as lump sums if the amount, or quantity, of
 work within that item later turns out to be different to that which the *Contractor* estimated at time of
 tender. The only basis for a change to the (lump sum) Prices is as a result of a compensation
 event.

Format of the *price list*

(From the example given in an Appendix within the TSC3 Guidance Notes)

Entries in the first four columns in the *price list* in section C2.2 are made either by the *Employer* or the tendering contractor.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid an amount for the item which is not adjusted if the quantity of work in the item changes, the tendering contractor enters the amount in the Price column only, the Unit, Expected Quantity and Rate columns being left blank.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid an amount for an item of work which is the rate for the work multiplied by the quantity completed, the tendering contractor enters the rate which is then multiplied by the Expected Quantity to produce the Price, which is also entered.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid a Price for an item proportional to the length of time for which a service is provided, a unit of time is stated in the Unit column and the expected length of time (as a quantity of the stated units of time) is stated in the Expected Quantity column.

1.1 Executive overview

Provision of Laundry Services to Matla Power Station for the period of 5 years

1.2 Employer's requirements for the service

Eskom Matla Power Station is committed to ensure health and safety of its employees is not compromised. Therefore, it is of outmost importance to ensure that PPE, table linen, medical linen and all other laundry is hygienically clean and safe for use

Matla Power Station intends to enter into an agreement with a service provider who would offer laundry services for a period of five (5) years as follows:

- The laundry is to be washed according to the washing instructions on the label of the clothing or according to standards provided by Employer representative.
- The safety features of the safety clothing are to be maintained.
- Broken and damaged zips must be replaced with new zips and torn seams must be stitched and repaired by the service provider as detailed in the contract and the price per Kilogram should be inclusive of stitching, zips and buttons replacement.
- Washing temperature 60 Degrees Celsius or as specified on the garment label.
- It will be responsibility of the service provider to provide: Labour, Equipment, collection and delivery cost and all required detergent for laundry

DETERMINATION OF THE QUALITY OF WORK

Direction for normal laundry

- The laundry must be washed using high quality eco-friendly detergent and softener
- The service include ironing and folding of laundry in manageable sizes and packaged in clear plastics or any other backpacking pre-approved by Contract Manager
- In the event where the contract manager is not satisfied with the cleanliness of the laundry or any service provided by the service provider, The items will be returned to the service provider to redo the laundry at no charge to Eskom.
- The contract manager will notify the service provider of the unsatisfactory service in writing and the service provider shall rectify the deficiency within five (5) working days
- The service provider shall rectify the defect pointed at No extra charge to Eskom.
- Should the service provider fail to correct the defects pointed out, The contract
 manager reserves the right to have defects corrected by different service provider
 and recover costs for such from service provider contracted.
- The service provider will provide hygiene assurance to ensure that Matla

- employees are not exposed to any health risks due to products or chemicals used by service provider or handling of laundry.
- The service provider must be flexible to change detergent for people with sensitive skin to protect personnel members who have allergies such as dermatitis/Eczema etc.

FREQUENCY FOR LAUNDRY

NB. The below is just an estimate as laundry will be washed on as required basis

- Chefs Uniform to be washed weekly or as when required
- Table cloths to be washed weekly or as when required
- Medical Linen will be washed bi-weekly or as when required
- Arch Flash suits will be washed as when required
- Bullet Proof Vests to be washed bi-weekly or as required
- All other items will washed on as when required

DIRECTION TO WASH FLASH SUITS:

Electrical arc flash protective clothing protects from thermal effects arc flash only. This garment protects resists ignition when exposed to flame or electrical arc. It will not continue to burn when removed from the ignition source

Directions for wash cycle

Note. The below is just the basics, Manufacturer instruction on label must always prevails.

- Wash in hot water, temperature 40 degrees Celsius
- tumble drying and tunnel fishing can be used
- do not use chlorine bleach or hydrogen peroxide either separately or in detergents
- detergent ph range: 7- 9 do not use optical brightness or fabric softener
- Wash separately from other garments or dry clean.
- Tumble dry at a low setting.
- No direct sunlight

CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE OF FIRE FIGHTING PPE Fire Tunic and Bunker gear

- Before washing garments must be inspected for any defect on the closure system outer shell, moisture barrier and thermo line.
- Remove all equipment make sure that pockets are empty.
- If inner is removable, remove inner and wash inner and outer separate.
- Chlorine bleach or chlorinated solvents shall not be used to clean or decontaminate garments.
- Cleaning and decontamination solutions shall have a pH range of not less than 6.0 pH and not greater than 10.5 pH.(Use any washing powder except Sunlight)
- Heavy scrubbing or spraying with high velocity water jets, such as a power washer,

shall not be used.

- Protective ensembles and protective ensemble elements shall be cleaned and decontaminated separately from non-protective items.
- After washing inspect garment for default holes.

When cleaning in a utility sink

- Do not overload the sink.
- If necessary pre-treat heavily soiled or spotted areas.
- Fill the sink with water not to exceed 40°C (105°F).
- Add cleaning solution or detergent.
- Wear protective gloves and eye/face splash protection.
- Scrub gently using a soft bristle brush. Use extra care with moisture barrier assemblies.
- Drain the water from the sink.
- Refill the sink, agitate using gloved hand or stir stick.
- Gently wring out garments and drain the water from the sink.
- Repeat steps 7 and 8 until garment is thoroughly rinsed.
- Dry the elements.
- Inspect and rewash if necessary.
- Rinse out the sink.

Washing machine cleaning.

- Do not overload the machine.
- If necessary, pre-treat heavily soiled or spotted areas.
- Fasten all closures, including pocket closures, hook and loop, snaps, zippers, hooks
- Turn garment inside out and place in mesh laundry bag.
- Set and start the machine cycle, use a water temperature setting not to exceed 40°C (105°F).
- Add detergent.
- Run one complete cycle, rinsing at least twice.
- Dry the elements.
- Inspect and rewash if necessary.

Note: If the machine is also used to wash other items that are heavily soiled or with dangerous chemicals, Ensure that you rinse out the machine by running it while empty through a complete cycle with 49°C to 52°C (120°F to 125°F) with water and detergent.

Air-drying:

- Place elements in an area with good ventilation.
- Do not dry in direct sunlight.

Machine drying:

Note: Do not overload the machine.

- Fasten all closures, including pocket closures, hook and loop, snaps, zippers, hooks etc
- Turn garments inside out and place in a mesh laundry bag
- If the dryer has a no-heat option, use it.
- If heat must be used, basket temperature shall not exceed 40°C (105°F)
- If heat is used, remove garments before they are completely dry.

LOST OR DAMAGED LINEN

• The supplier will be responsible to replace lost or damaged items in his possession at his own costs.

LAUNDRY DELIVERY AND COLLECTION

- Dirty laundry and clean laundry is to be collected and delivered by supplier to and from Matla Power Station
- Dirty laundry is to be checked and counted by the supplier on collection and sign collection book
- Clean laundry is to be pre-sorted, pre-counted and wrapped in uniform bundle quantities according to type, gender and size

SOILED LINEN

 The infected linen will be placed separately and disinfected by submerging it in the disinfectant solution before washing, Blood stained and infected clothes will firstly be washed separately and then washed again in routine wash
