TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR EVENTS COORDINATOR TO SUPPLY GOODS AND RENDER SERVICES AT THE SANIE KONYANA DOCUMENTARY LAUNCH AT ZEERUST, NORTHWEST ON THE 28 SEPTEMBER 2024

1. BACKGROUND

The National Heritage Council (NHC) is a Schedule 3A public entity and a juristic person that came into existence through an amendment of the Cultural Laws Second Amendment Act 2001 (Act 69 of 2001), and was officially constituted through the National Heritage Council Act of 1999 (Act 11 of 1999) It is under the Department of Sport, Arts and Culture (DSAC).

The NHC is responsible for the preservation of the country's heritage. The important areas that the NHC focuses on are policy development for the sector to meet its transformation goals, public awareness and education, knowledge production in heritage subjects that were previously neglected, as well as making funding available to projects that place heritage as a socio-economic resource.

The NHC requires the services of a suitable experienced event coordinator based in Zeerust, North West that will be responsible for the supply of goods and rendering of services as stipulated in this document.

2. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The coordinator will be responsible for the supply of goods and the rendering of services, as follows:

- 2.1 Provide the service of an event coordinator from the date of inception until the post event reporting, including designing poster and programme for the event and distributed copies of the speeches.
- 2.2 Venue layout on the identified venue (Church or Community Hall) at Makgola , Zeerust for 29 September 2024.



- 2.3 Rendering catering services for 350 attendees using 2 separate serving stations as stipulated
- 2.4 Setup and arrangement of the venue
- 2.5 Supply and delivery décor for the event
- 2.6 Videography and photographic services
- 2.7 Provide audio visual, sound and stage equipment for the event
- 2.8 Streamline the event through social media
- 2.9 Supply and deliver branded commemorative ornamental plaque
- 2.10 Arrange an entertainment group that renders Cultural Expressions

- 3.2. Must be available to attend the event to oversee and ensure that all challenges are attended to.

- 4.1.1. The event coordinator must be located in North West, preferably Zeerust.
- 4.1.2. The event coordinator must be resourceful and flexible to make quick decisions and provide reasonable solutions to the NHC representative.
- 4.1.3. The event coordinator must have the necessary computer skills in using messaging platforms, event management software and other processing programs for the organizing of the event as required.
- 4.1.4. The event coordinator must be able to plan and coordinates events of Stakeholder intensity across political, business and communities.
- 4.1.5. Must be able to arrange, secure, coordinate and manage a major event.
- 4.1.6. Submit status reports every 3rd day from date of receipt of the purchase order.
- 4.1.7. The event coordinator is required to develop the concept in line with the requirements and submit it with the quotation for review. The service provider must demonstrate his/her capabilities to act as coordinator for an event of this magnitude.
- 4.1.8. The service provider must be well-organized, the project well-executed and memorable for the attendees.
- 4.1.9. The service provider should ensure participation of local economic development through working with local people
- 4.1.10. The service provider is responsible to enquire from the venue on the availability of items indicated in this RFQ. Where the items e.g. chairs are available, the service provider must indicate it and only quote for the items that must be supplied or where costing is involved.
- 4.1.11. The service provider must ensure compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act and all other statutory requirements in line with the scope of the services required.

- a) The applicable preference point system for this tender is the **80/20** preference point system.
- b) The **80/20 preference point system** will be applicable in this tender. The lowest/ highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the accurate system once tenders are received.

1.3 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) Specific Goals.

1.4 To be completed by the organ of state:

The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) **“the Act”** means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
- (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,
