Z1 Cession delegation and assignment

- Z1.1 The *Contractor* does not cede, delegate, or assign any of its rights or obligations to any person without the written consent of the *Employer*.
- Z1.2 Notwithstanding the above, the *Employer* may on written notice to the *Contractor* cede and delegate its rights and obligations under this contract to any of its subsidiaries or any of its present divisions or operations which may be converted into separate legal entities as a result of the restructuring of the Electricity Supply Industry.

Z2 Joint ventures

- Z2.1 If the *Contractor* constitutes a joint venture, consortium, or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons or organisations then these persons or organisations are deemed to be jointly and severally liable to the *Employer* for the performance of this contract.
- Z2.2 Unless already notified to the *Employer*, the persons or organisations notify the *Service Manager* within two weeks of the Contract Date of the key person who has the authority to bind the *Contractor* on their behalf.
- Z2.3 The *Contractor* does not alter the composition of the joint venture, consortium, or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons without the consent of the *Employer* having been given to the *Contractor* in writing.

Z3 Change of Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status

- Z3.1 Where a change in the *Contractor's* legal status, ownership or any other change to his business composition or business dealings results in a change to the *Contractor's* B-BBEE status, the *Contractor* notifies the *Employer* within seven days of the change.
- Z3.2 The *Contractor* is required to submit an updated verification certificate and necessary supporting documentation confirming the change in his B-BBEE status to the *Service Manager* within thirty days of the notification or as otherwise instructed by the *Service Manager*.

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- Z3.3 Where, as a result, the *Contractor's* B-BBEE status has decreased since the Contract Date the *Employer* may either re-negotiate this contract or alternatively, terminate the *Contractor's* obligation to Provide the Service.
- Z3.4 Failure by the *Contractor* to notify the *Employer* of a change in its B-BBEE status may constitute a reason for termination. If the *Employer* terminates in terms of this clause, the procedures on termination are P1, P2 and P4 as stated in clause 92, and the amount due is A1 and A3 as stated in clause 93.

Z4 Confidentiality

- Z4.1 The Contractor does not disclose or make any information arising from or in connection with this contract available to Others. This undertaking does not, however, apply to information which at the time of disclosure or thereafter, without default on the part of the Contractor, enters the public domain or to information which was already in the possession of the Contractor at the time of disclosure (evidenced by written records in existence at that time). Should the Contractor disclose information to Others in terms of clause 25.1, the Contractor ensures that the provisions of this clause are complied with by the recipient.
- Z4.2 If the *Contractor* is uncertain about whether any such information is confidential, it is to be regarded as such until notified otherwise by the *Service Manager*.
- Z4.3 In the event that the Contractor is, at any time, required by law to disclose any such information which is required to be kept confidential, the Contractor, to the extent permitted by law prior to disclosure, notifies the Employer so that an appropriate protection order and/or any other action can be taken, if possible, prior to any disclosure. In the event that such protective order is not, or cannot, be obtained, then the Contractor may disclose that portion of the information which it is required to be disclosed by law and uses reasonable efforts to obtain assurances that confidential treatment will be afforded to the information so disclosed.
- Z4.4 The taking of images (whether photographs, video footage or otherwise) of the Affected Property or any portion thereof, while Providing the Service and after the end of the service period, requires the prior written consent of the Service Manager. All rights in and to all such images vests exclusively in the Employer.
- Z4.5 The Contractor ensures that all his subcontractors abide by the undertakings in this clause.

Z5 Waiver and estoppel: Add to core clause 12.3:

Z5.1 Any extension, concession, waiver, or relaxation of any action stated in this contract by the Parties, the *Service Manager* or the *Adjudicator* does not constitute a waiver of rights and does not give rise to an estoppel unless the Parties agree otherwise and confirm such agreement in writing.

Z6 Health, safety, and the environment: Add to core clause 27.4

Z6.1 The Contractor undertakes to take all reasonable precautions to maintain the health and safety of persons in and about the execution of the service. Without limitation the Contractor: accepts that the Employer may appoint him as the "Principal Contractor" (as defined and provided for under the Construction Regulations 2014 (promulgated under the Occupational Health & Safety Act 85 of 1993) ("the Construction Regulations") for the Affected Property. warrants that the total of the Prices as at the Contract Date includes a sufficient amount for

warrants that the total of the Prices as at the Contract Date includes a sufficient amount for proper compliance with the Construction Regulations, all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and the health and safety rules, guidelines and procedures provided for in this contract and generally for the proper maintenance of health & safety in and about the execution of the *service*: and

undertakes, in and about the execution of the service, to comply with the Construction

Regulations and with all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Contractor's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.

Z6.2 The *Contractor*, in and about the execution of the *service*, complies with all applicable environmental laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Contractor's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.

Z7 Provision of a Tax Invoice and interest. Add to core clause 51

- Z7.1 Within one week of receiving a payment certificate from the Service Manager in terms of core clause 51.1, the Contractor provides the Employer with a tax invoice in accordance with the Employer's procedures stated in the Service Information, showing the amount due for payment equal to that stated in the payment certificate.
- Z7.2 If the *Contractor* does not provide a tax invoice in the form and by the time required by this contract, the time by when the *Employer* is to make a payment is extended by a period equal in time to the delayed submission of the correct tax invoice. Interest due by the *Employer* in terms of core clause 51.2 is then calculated from the delayed date by when payment is to be made.
- Z7.3 The *Contractor* (if registered in South Africa in terms of the companies Act) is required to comply with the requirements of the Value Added Tax Act, no 89 of 1991 (as amended) and to include the *Employer's* VAT number 4740101508 on each invoice he submits for payment.

Z8 Notifying compensation events

Z8.1 Delete the last paragraph of core clause 61.3 and replace with:

If the *Contractor* does not notify a compensation event within eight weeks of becoming aware of the event, he is not entitled to a change in the Prices.

Z9 Employer's limitation of liability

- Z9.1 The *Employer's* liability to the *Contractor* for the *Contractor's* indirect or consequential loss is limited to R0.00 (zero Rand)
- Z9.2 The *Contractor*'s entitlement under the indemnity in 82.1 is provided for in 60.1(12) and the *Employer*'s liability under the indemnity is limited to compensation as provided for in core clause 63 and X19.11 if Option X19 Task Order applies to this contract.

Z10 Termination: Add to core clause 91.1, at the second main bullet point, fourth sub-bullet point, after the words "against it":

Z10.1 or had a business rescue order granted against it.

Z11 Ethics

For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

Affected Party

means, as the context requires, any party, irrespective of whether it is the *Contractor* or a third party, such party's employees, agents, or Subcontractors or

	Subcontractor's employees, or any one or more of all of these parties' relatives or friends,
Coercive Action	means to harm or threaten to harm, directly or indirectly, an Affected Party or the property of an Affected Party, or to otherwise influence or attempt to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,
Collusive Action	means where two or more parties co-operate to achieve an unlawful or illegal purpose, including to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,
Committing Party	means, as the context requires, the <i>Contractor</i> , or any member thereof in the case of a joint venture, or its employees, agents, or Subcontractors or the Subcontractor's employees,
Corrupt Action	means the offering, giving, taking, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of a good or service to influence the actions of an Affected Party unlawfully or illegally,
Fraudulent Action	means any unlawfully or illegally intentional act or omission that misleads, or attempts to mislead, an Affected Party, in order to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation or incurring an obligation,
Obstructive Action	means a Committing Party unlawfully or illegally destroying, falsifying, altering, or concealing information or making false statements to materially impede an investigation into allegations of Prohibited Action and
Prohibited Action	means any one or more of a Coercive Action, Collusive Action Corrupt Action, Fraudulent Action or Obstructive Action.

- Z 11.1 A Committing Party may not take any Prohibited Action during the course of the procurement of this contract or in execution thereof.
- Z 11.2 The *Employer* may terminate the *Contractor*'s obligation to Provide the Service if a Committing Party has taken such Prohibited Action and the *Contractor* did not take timely and appropriate action to prevent or remedy the situation, without limiting any other rights or remedies the *Employer* has. It is not required that the Committing Party had to have been found guilty, in court or in any other similar process, of such Prohibited Action before the *Employer* can terminate the *Contractor*'s obligation to Provide the Service for this reason.
- Z 11.3 If the *Employer* terminates the *Contractor*'s obligation to Provide the Service for this reason, the procedures and amounts due on termination are respectively P1, P2, P3 and P4, and A1 and A3.
- Z 11.4 A Committing Party co-operates fully with any investigation pursuant to alleged Prohibited Action. Where the *Employer* does not have a contractual bond with the Committing Party, the *Contractor* ensures that the Committing Party co-operates fully with an investigation.

Annexure A: Insurance provided by the Employer

These notes are provided as guidance to tendering contractors and the Contractor about the insurance provided by the Employer. The Contractor must obtain its own advice. Details of the insurance itself are available from the internet web link given below.

- 1. Services provided in a TSC3 contract could include some element of construction or refurbishment as well as a continuous maintenance or operational service activity. If an event occurs which causes loss or damage, a claim could be made either against the *Employer*'s "works" type policy which may be in place for the *Employer*'s portion of the Affected Property concerned or against the *Employer*'s assets policy which may be in place for the *Employer*'s portion of the Affected Property concerned, or both.
- 2. The cover provided and the deductibles under the works policy are different to those under the assets policy. Each policy has a range of applicable deductibles depending on the location of the Affected Property and the nature of the insurable event.
- 3. The Contractor is required in terms of Contract Data for clause 83 to provide cover for the deductibles in the insurance provided by the Employer. This can be provided from his own resources on a 'self-insured' basis or obtained by him from his own insurers. In order to assess the extent of this cover, tendering contractors and their brokers should consult the internet web link given below and scroll to 'Format TSC3' to establish both the cover and the deductibles in relation to the service provided in terms of this contract.
- 4. Tendering contractors should note that cover provided by the *Employer* is only per the policies available on the internet web link listed below and may not be the cover required by the tendering contractor or as intended by each of the listed insurances in the left-hand column of the Insurance Table in clause 83.2. In terms of clause 83.1 "the *Contractor* provides the insurances stated in the Insurance Table except any insurance which the *Employer* is to provide". Hence the *Contractor* provides insurance which the *Employer* does not provide and in cases where the *Employer* does provide insurance the *Contractor* insures for the difference between what the Insurance Table requires and what the *Employer* provides.
- 5. If Marine Insurance is required, the *Contractor* needs to obtain a copy of the latest edition of Eskom's Marine Policies Procedures found at internet website given below.

C2.1 Pricing assumptions: Option A

How work is priced and assessed for payment

Clause 11 in NEC3 Term Service Contract (TSC3) core clauses and Option A states:

Identified and defined terms

11 11.2

- (12) The Price List is the *price list* unless later changed in accordance with this contract.
- (17) The Price for Services Provided to Date is the total of
 - the Price for each lump sum item in the Price List which the Contractor has completed and
 - where a quantity is stated for an item in the Price List, an amount calculated by multiplying the quantity which the *Contractor* has completed by the rate.
- (19) The Prices are the amounts stated in the Price column of the Price List. Where a quantity is stated for an item in the Price List, the Price is calculated by multiplying the quantity by the rate.

This confirms that Option A is a priced contract where the Prices are derived from a list of items of service which can be priced as lump sums or as expected quantities of service multiplied by a rate or a mix of both.

Function of the Price List

Clause 54.1 in Option A states: "Information in the Price List is not Service Information". This confirms that instructions to do work or how it is to be done are not included in the Price List but in the Service Information. This is further confirmed by Clause 20.1 which states, "The *Contractor* Provides the Service in accordance with the Service Information". Hence the *Contractor* does **not** Provide the Service in accordance with the Price List. The Price List is only a pricing document.

Link to the Contractor's plan

Clause 21.3 states "The *Contractor* provides information which shows how each item description on the Price List relates to the operations on each plan which he submits for acceptance". Hence when compiling the *price list*, the tendering contractor needs to develop his first clause 21.2 plan in such a way that operations shown on it can be priced in the *price list* and result in a satisfactory cash flow in terms of clause 11.2(17).

Preparing the price list

Before preparing the *price list*, both the *Employer* and tendering contractors should read the TSC3 Guidance Notes pages 14 and 15. In an Option A contract, either Party may have entered items into the *price list* either as a process of offer and acceptance (tendering) or by negotiation depending on the nature of the *service* to be provided. Alternatively, the *Employer*, in his Instructions to Tenderers or in a Tender Schedule, may have listed some items that he requires the *Contractor* to include in the *price list* to be prepared and priced by him.

It is assumed that in preparing or finalising the *price list* the *Contractor*:

- Has taken account of the guidance given in the TSC3 Guidance Notes relevant to Option A.
- Understands the function of the Price List and how work is priced and paid for.
- Is aware of the need to link operations shown in his plan to items shown in the Price List.
- Has listed and priced items in the *price list* which are inclusive of everything necessary and incidental to Providing the Service in accordance with the Service Information, as it was at the time of tender, as well as correct any Defects not caused by an *Employer's* risk.
- Has priced work he decides not to show as a separate item within the Prices or rates of other listed items in order to fulfil the obligation to complete the service for the tendered total of the Prices.
- Understands there is no adjustment to items priced as lump sums if the amount, or quantity, of
 work within that item later turns out to be different to that which the *Contractor* estimated at time of
 tender. The only basis for a change to the (lump sum) Prices is as a result of a compensation
 event.

Format of the *price list*

(From the example given in an Appendix within the TSC3 Guidance Notes)

Entries in the first four columns in the *price list* in section C2.2 are made either by the *Employer* or the tendering contractor.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid an amount for the item which is not adjusted if the quantity of work in the item changes, the tendering contractor enters the amount in the Price column only, the Unit, Expected Quantity and Rate columns being left blank.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid an amount for an item of work which is the rate for the work multiplied by the quantity completed, the tendering contractor enters the rate which is then multiplied by the Expected Quantity to produce the Price, which is also entered.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid a Price for an item proportional to the length of time for which a service is provided, a unit of time is stated in the Unit column and the expected length of time (as a quantity of the stated units of time) is stated in the Expected Quantity column.

PART 3: SCOPE OF WORK

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C3.1: EMPLOYER'S SERVICE INFORMATION

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Description of the service

1.1 Executive overview

Grootvlei Power Station needs a civil maintenance contract which will includes maintenance of buildings, roads, weighbridge, painting, and civil works in Grootvlei Power Station including Villa 4(Balfour), Vaal dam and Balfour Hub. This includes all non-plant buildings as well as plant buildings that form part of Grootvlei Power Station assets.

1.2 Employer's requirements for the service

The *Contractor* is responsible for the maintenance of buildings, roads, weighbridge (gate3) and civil works in Grootvlei Power Station including Villa 4(Balfour), Vaal dam and Balfour Hub. This includes but is not limited to the following:

- · Attending daily meetings
- Staffing and management
- Work/task planning and co-ordination
- Completing work/tasks
- Recommendations regarding spares and stock holding
- Ensure compliance with OSHAct and national standards
- Ensure compliance with Eskom policies and procedures
- Reporting on a regular basis as stipulated by Eskom on work progress and defects detected.

The *Contractor* maintains an all-year-round base crew, with basic hand tools required for the *works* at Grootvlei Power Station. The base crew personnel are to be qualified as per requirements of their work. The *Contractor* manages the base crew and appoints a site supervisor. The *Contractor* must provide an all-inclusive monthly fee for the above. The *Contractor* must provide details of the personnel that will be used, along with qualification and training records. All work that requires plant changes must be communicated and approved by the *Employer* prior to commencement of the activity.

1.2.1 Road maintenance

The Contractor shall be responsible for all road maintenance on site as per the below:

- Replacement and installations of all road signs.
- Demarcation / painting of road markings and maintaining to the required traffic department standards according to SANS 731-2: 2015.
- Repairs of the existing road surface where deterioration has been identified (i.e., potholes)
- Cleaning of all catch pits and drain inlets on an annual basis.

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1.2.2 Perimeter Fence maintenance

The Contractor will be responsible for:

- Monthly inspections on condition of fence
- Repairs to damaged fencing in Grootvlei Power Station, Vaal dam and all other plants that form part
 of Grootvlei Power Station's premises.

1.2.3 Building and structures maintenance

The Contractor shall be responsible for maintenance of all the buildings listed within the Power Station as follows:

- Ensure adherence to SABS 0400 building code and Eskom corporate identity compliance.
- Painting of buildings (internal / external) and roofs on site, Villa 4, Vaal dam and Balfour Hub.
- Replacement of all damaged windows, doors, door locks and frames.
- · Repairs to roofs, gutters, and down pipes of all buildings
- · Cleaning of gutters.
- Installation and maintenance of all notice boards on site.
- · Maintenance of Carports and Shade ports.
- Installation of new floor tiles and carpets
- Replacement of loose floor tiles and carpets.
- There will be CSI requests for building maintenance that the BU needs to attend

1.2.4 Fire equipment maintenance (under IRM's instruction)

- Maintain and replace emergency / fire equipment and signage (excluding main fire control system)
- Installation of signage and colour coding for fire equipment / emergencies
- Assist the integrated risk officer to install fire extinguishers.

1.2.5 Plumbing works and maintenance

As and when required, the contractor shall be responsible for:

- Repairing of all leaking pipes and water taps (potable water)
- Replacement/repairs of damaged gratings for storm water drains.
- Maintaining and unblocking of sewerage piping system on site, Vaal dam, Villa 4 and Balfour Hub
- Maintenance of all toilets on site
- Repairs of leaks at diesel tanks at Coal 23000, Ash 23 000, and Coal 9000
- Unblocking of drains in all buildings.
- Maintain and clean the central storm water drainage system

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1.2.6 Maintain SHE standard on site

The Contractor Shall.

- Supply own staff with required and identified PPE (SABS approved) in accordance with Eskom standard.
- · Attend all the required safety meetings.
- · Conduct daily toolbox talks.
- Ensure that good housekeeping standards are maintained.
- Disposal of waste must be in accordance with Eskom standard e.g., the safe disposal of florescent tubes at designated areas.
- Must appoint a safety representative for their area.
- Priority should be given to all safety related defects within the scope of work.
- Replacement and maintenance of all safety sign on Grootvlei power station, Villa 4, Balfour Hub and Vaal dam
- The Contractor must submit the SHE plans within the first month of the start of this contract.

1.2.7 General maintenance/work

General duties of the Contractor shall be the.

- Removal and repair of office furniture.
- Preparation of offices for new employees or as requested.
- Attending all required meetings as directed by the Employer.
- Conducting a monthly site walkabout and report all defect/findings to the Employer monthly.
- Document management of daily activities and make this available on request by the *Employer*.
- Co-ordinate, prioritise daily defects and tasks
- Assisting with mobile crane and forklift operation (training for the forklift and mobile crane will be
 provided by the *Employer*. Should the contractor fail the first attempt in training, the contractor will be
 liable for all re-training expenses)
- Conducting an annual building integrity survey and communicate findings / corrective actions to the *Employer's* representative.
- Access Control for offices and buildings

The *Contractor* must conduct a site survey and satisfy himself that the information is accurate. Any corrections must be brought to the attention of the *Employer* before the commencement date.

1.2.8 Workshop Management

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The *Contractor* will be provided with the workshop and will use these facilities during the execution of the *works* and will also provide a service to the *Employer* or the *Employer*'s appointed contractor. The workshop will have the office space and a kitchen. All office and kitchen equipment will be provided by the contractor.

Such service will be provided at no extra cost, although the direct material costs will be for the account of the *Employer* or the *Employer*'s appointed contractor as indicated in The *Contractor*'s Offer and separate orders will be provided based on the normal procurement practices of the Power Station should the need arise.

The *Contractor* may schedule any external request to optimise the workflow of the tasks in this contract but will give priority to breakdown work causing (or which may cause) health risk or environmental risk.

The *Contractor* will maintain all the equipment contained in the workshops and ensure that they are in proper working order. The *Contractor* will adhere to preventative maintenance programme for the equipment, in line with the Power Station requirements and Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) specifications.

Employer may review this responsibility at any given time and may re-allocate this function to another section and or department as and when required during the contract period - the *Employer* informs the *Contractor* in writing of any changes as and when this materialises.

1.2.9 Maintenance

The *Contractor* should take note of all refurbished and/or new equipment/or new structure, which is subject to 12 months defects liability period from the original equipment manufacturer (OEM). It is the *Contractor*'s responsibility to ensure validity of the defect's liability where applicable. The *Contractor* is to prove compliance by keeping records of maintenance tasks executed by the *Contractor*, as specified by the OEM.

1.2.10 Building Maintenance

Building maintenance includes walk-downs to confirm building condition and to identify and address visible faults including Vaal dam, Villa 4 and Balfour Hub. During these walk-downs, inspections are done on the buildings. All defects or potential failures will be recorded

The defects will be listed, and corrective actions will be planned according to the priority of the defects. Where a Permit to Work is required, the work will be planned with the Production Department.

Work will be scheduled via the *Employer's* SAP system when necessary. The *Employer's* Plant Safety Regulations will be adhered to, and the artisans are required to be authorised as responsible persons in terms of the regulations.

Where history needs to be captured, defects will be raised on the SAP system and the history will be captured on Work Orders. Comprehensive reporting is to be submitted after each inspection.

1.2.11. Inspections

The Contractor will be responsible for inspecting and identifying all building deterioration that occurs.

In addition to the repair of the breakdown, the *Contractor* will also conduct a thorough inspection to determine the cause of the failure. Where necessary, the *Contractor* will recommend corrective actions to the *Employer Representative*.

1.2.12 Planning and Scheduling

The planning, scheduling, and recording of all defects history will be done by the *Contractor* on the SAP system where necessary. The *Employer* will provide training to the *Contractor's* employees to enable them to use SAP system should the need arise.

1.2.13 Emergency Maintenance, overtime, standby and call outs.

The *Contractor* will be responsible for all unforeseen emergency failures that occur. The *Contractor* will provide a 24-hour stand-by service for emergencies. The *Contractor's* employees will be on site within 1 hour on an after-hours call out.

In addition to the repair of the breakdown, the *Contractor* will also conduct a thorough inspection to determine the cause of the failure. Where necessary, the *Contractor* will recommend corrective actions to the *Employer's Representative*

1.2.14 Weighbridge Maintenance.

The *Contractor* will be responsible for the maintenance and the cleaning of the weighbridge. This will be done according to the *Employer's* instructions. A PM form will be issued to the *Contractor* with instructions on how to perform the job. After the job has been done by the Contractor, the Contractor must fill in all the necessary information and sign this form. The form will consist of the following information but not limited: names and signatures of people who were involved, the date on which the task was performed and a brief description of the job.

1.2.15 Stock

The *Contractor* liaises with the *Service Manager* to ensure than an adequate stock level and description of spare parts is maintained in the *Employer's* stores. The *Contractor* must inform the *Service Manager* in writing should any changes to stock holding be necessary. The procurement of spare parts for stock is done by the *Employer*.

Spares held in stock, which are required for a maintenance activity, will be issued free by the *Employer*. The *Contactor* provides safeguarding for all free issued spares from damage or loss due to weather, fire, theft or negligence.

1.3 Interpretation and terminology

The following abbreviations are used in this Service Information:

2.1 The Contractor's plan for the service

The Contractor to submit a schedule prior to the commencement of each activity throughout the service period. Refer to TSC3 clause 21. A monthly report on work executed to be submitted by the Contractor.

Meetings of a specialist nature may be convened as specified elsewhere in this Service Information or if not so specified by persons and at times and locations to suit the Parties, the nature and the progress of the *service*. Records of these meetings shall be submitted to the *Service Manager* by the person convening the meeting within five days of the meeting.

All meetings shall be recorded using minutes or a register prepared and circulated by the person who convened the meeting. Such minutes or register shall not be used for the purpose of confirming actions or instructions under the contract as these shall be done separately by the person identified in the *conditions* of *contract* to carry out such actions or instructions.

2.3 Contractor's management, supervision and key people

There should be supervision throughout the service period and key people shall be always made available.

2.4 Documentation control

The *Contractor* shall provide the following documentation:

- Quality control plan
- Environmental plan
- Safety plan
- Training matrix

And all other related documents that may be required by the Service Manager.

2.5 Invoicing and payment

The assessments will be done on the 4th week of every month (25th of every month) by the *Service Manager* and *Contractor*.

Within one week of receiving a payment certificate from the *Service Manager* in terms of core clause 51.1, the *Contractor* provides the *Employer* with a tax invoice showing the amount due for payment equal to that stated in the *Service Manager*'s payment certificate.

The Contractor shall address the tax invoice to

and include on each invoice the following information:

Name and address of the Contractor and the Service Manager.

The contract number and title.

Contractor's VAT registration number.

The Employer's VAT registration number 4740101508.

Description of service provided for each item invoiced based on the Price List.

Total amount invoiced excluding VAT, the VAT and the invoiced amount including VAT.

(Add other as required)

Add procedures for invoice submission and payment (e. g. electronic payment instructions)

2.6 Contract change management

Change in scope is a compensation event. The *Employer* will be liable for any work executed without an official Task Order when a compensation event arises, the *Contractor* shall submit a quotation to the Service Manager for approval. Upon approval the *Contractor* shall be issued with a new Task Order for the additional work deviation in the works instruction.

2.7 Records of Defined Cost to be kept by the *Contractor*

The *Contractor* shall keep records of defined cost and the records shall be made available to the *Employer* by the *Contractor* on request.

2.8 Insurance provided by the Employer

2.9 Training workshops and technology transfer

Internal training will be provided by the *Employer*. All other required/ related training e.g. HIRA shall be provided by the *Contractor*

2.10 Design and supply of Equipment

All the required equipment is stated on the Service description (Section C3).

The applicable designs will be provided where possible by the Employer where necessary.

2.11 Things provided at the end of the service period for the Employer's use

Equipment

All the equipment, surplus plant and Material provided by the *Employer* shall be returned to the *Employer* at the end of the service period (refer to clause 70.2 NEC TSC3).

Information and other things

All the related service information shall be shared with the Employer (refer to clause 70.2 NEC TSC3).

2.12 Management of work done by Task Order

A Task order will be issued by the Employer to the Contractor monthly.

3 Health and safety, the environment and quality assurance

3.1 Health and safety risk management

The *Contractor* Shall act in accordance with the Health and Safety requirements stated in the Service information and any other Health and Safety information provided by the *Employer, (refer to clause 27.4 on NEC3 TSC)*. The *Contractor* shall comply with the Health and Safety Requirements stated in SHE specification provided.

3.2 Environmental constraints and management

The Contractor shall adhere to the Legal and Site Environmental requirements.

3.3 Quality assurance requirements

The Contractor shall adhere to the quality requirements e.g., Quality plan, quality control plan and work procedure.

The contractor might be subjected to audits relating to the scope executed
