1. PURPOSE

the purpose of this exercise is to appoint a reputable supplier for the servicing of the water treatment and waste water purification plants in the Tsitsikamma section of the Garden Route National Park for a period of 24 months.

2. BACKGROUND

South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003); with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: 25 public entities.

SANParks' operations are totally guided by its vision statement and mission statement. As a public entity, the organisation is committed to act in pursuance of transformation of South Africa's society in support of entrenching South Africa's democracy. In this regard, the organisation has adopted a transformation mission to guide its efforts accordingly.

3. SCOPE OF WORKS AND PRICING SCHEDULE

Introduction

The purpose of this document is to define the **scope, standards, and responsibilities** for the servicing, maintenance, and testing of the Water Treatment Plant (WTP), Wastewater Purification Plant (WWTP), and Drinking Water Sand Filters across all sections of Tsitsikamma National Park. The goal is to ensure safe, reliable, and compliant water and wastewater management systems.

Scope of Works:

Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Maintenance

- Routine inspections of all plant equipment including pumps, valves, chemical dosing systems, clarifiers, filters, and pipelines.
- Servicing and cleaning of sand filters, including backwashing and removal of accumulated debris.
- Calibration, maintenance, and replacement of chemical dosing pumps and instruments.
- Servicing and lubrication of pumps, motors, and other mechanical components according to manufacturer specifications.
- Replacement of worn or damaged parts including valves, seals, bearings, filters, and instrumentation.
- **Testing of treated drinking water after each maintenance** to ensure compliance with **SANS 241 Drinking Water Standards**.
- Maintain a detailed **maintenance and testing logbook**.

Wastewater Purification Plant (WWTP) Maintenance

- Routine inspections and servicing of aeration tanks, clarifiers, pumps, chemical dosing units, and sludge management equipment.
- Cleaning and desludging of tanks as per operational requirements.
- Maintenance and replacement of mechanical and electrical components as needed.
- **Testing of treated wastewater after each service** to ensure compliance with discharge and effluent quality standards.
- Monitoring and reporting of chemical dosing levels, pH, and other critical wastewater parameters.

Drinking Water Sand Filters

- Backwashing and cleaning of sand filters.
- Replacement of sand, gravel, or other media as required.
- Inspection and servicing of valves, diffusers, and associated mechanical components.

Preventive Maintenance

- Develop a preventive maintenance schedule (monthly, quarterly, and annual).
- Replace worn parts proactively to avoid system downtime.
- Ensure all mechanical and electrical equipment operates within manufacturer specifications.

Emergency Repairs

- On-call services for breakdowns.
- Rapid response to restore operations.
- Maintain spare parts inventory for common failures.

Compliance and Standards

The service provider must comply with:

- **Wastewater Discharge Regulations**
- Manufacturer's recommended maintenance schedules

- Certification for handling chemicals and wastewater.

Deliverables

- Fully operational Water Treatment and Wastewater Purification plants.
- Clean and efficient Drinking Water Sand Filters.
- Maintenance logbooks and water/wastewater testing reports.

- Recommendations for system improvements.

The following PPPFA formula was used to evaluate the price proposals submitted by bidders, this formula was used because price was the only criterion that was scored i.e. the whole 80 points were allocated to price.

12. FINAL AWARD

Bidder who complies with the specifications and scores highest total points on PRICE and B-BBEE claimed points shall be awarded the contract. SANParks reserves the right to:

1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
