1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;

1. SCOPE

This specification covers the physical and performance requirements of fully equipped, portable and easily deployable roadblock trailers for use by the Eastern Cape Department of Transport Traffic Police in accordance with SADC region standards.

2. DEFINITIONS

- Caltrop: Fully portable self-contained vehicle stopper that can easily be deployed during a roadblock and when necessary, bring a vehicle to a halt in a controlled manner.
- HID: High Intensity Discharge.
- LED: Light Emitting Diode.
- Nominal: Subject to the tolerances normal to good manufacturing practice.
- NRTA: National Road Traffic Act.
- SANAS: South African National Accreditation System.

3. CLIENT FURNISHED MATERIAL

No materials will be supplied by the client.

4. PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE TRAILER

4.1 Body builder certificate

- a) A body builder certificate shall be provided in terms of SANS 10319:2006

4.2 General

- a) To comply with compulsory specification requirements as given in section 14 of this specification.
- b) The trailer needs be light weight ensuring that the trailer can be towed by a wide range of vehicles currently in use by the client.
- c) The colour shall be white only.
- d) The minimum finished dimensions of the trailer shall be as given in table 1 taking in consideration that the trailer shall acceptably accommodate all required fittings, accessories, and equipment.

4.3 Trailer Interior layout

4.3.1 General

- a) the interior shall be designed and constructed in such a way that each equipment component of the roadblock kit shall be allocated at a specific individual storage space.
- b) such that the loaded kit components shall not cause damage to each other or to the trailer during transit.
- c) each storage space shall be clearly marked to facilitate ease of packing and or repacking.
- d) when the trailer is not in use or in transit, all equipment shall be able to be locked away and not visible.




Figure 1 – Example of typical trailer, depicting the required storage locations

- e) each trailer shall make provision for 4 separate main storage locations which shall be as follows: (see figure 1) - Storage location 1: Back of trailer (see 4.3.2) - Storage location 2 and 3: Side of trailer (see 4.3.3) - Storage location 4: Nose cone of trailer (see 4.3.4)
- f) each main storage location shall be fitted with a white LED light.

4.3.2 Storage Location 1: Back of trailer

- a) storage facility to be of the pigeonhole type.
- b) the road signs and tripod stands shall be individually placed in a pigeonhole type storage facility (each pigeonhole shall contain one single item)
- c) The pigeonhole compartments at the back of the trailer shall accommodate all individual road signs and tripod stands.
- d) the back of the trailer shall be covered with a lid (see 4.4.2)
- e) a canvas protection cover shall be fitted to the back of the trailer to protect the interior and equipment from adverse weather conditions - the canvas cover shall be used when the trailer is deployed, and back lid is erected.

4.3.3 Storage location 2 and 3: Sides of trailer

- a) storage facility to be of the chamber type.
- b) to house all the equipment (kit items) other than those specified in 4.3.2 and 4.3.4.
- c) sturdy permanent fixtures shall be attached to the floor to make provision for the piling of traffic cones.
- d) appropriate brackets and shelving shall be permanently attached to the inside of the chamber.
- e) a door shall grant access to each chamber type storage facility.

4.3.4 Storage location 4: Nose cone of trailer

- a) designed and constructed in such a way that it shall accommodate a mounted generator (see 5.1.13)
- b) access shall be granted to the inside of the nose cone by means of two side lids and a single top lid (see 4.4.4)
- c) designed in such a way that the generator shall be protected from rain and adverse weather conditions, but still provide adequate ventilation to allow heat and fumes to escape when the generator is started.

4.4 Trailer and doors and lids

4.4.1 General

- a) each trailer shall have four entry points.
- b) each door/lid shall be fitted with a locking mechanism to secure it when closed.
- c) outer edges of each door/lid shall be fitted with rubber strips to ensure a tight seal and prevent dust and dirt from entering the storage locations.

4.4.2 Back lid (providing access to storage location 1)

- a) The back lid to be fitted with traffic sign TW339 “General Warning”, to be visible when the lid is in an open position.
- b) When deployed, the back lid shall erect to enable the flashing blue, red and amber lights to face approaching traffic from both sides.
- c) The back lid shall be equipped with gas struts that shall be durable and able to withstand low wind speeds.
- d) The back lid shall be equipped with a mechanism to keep the door open in high wind speeds; this will ensure that the lid doesn’t close when a person stands behind the trailer.
- e) the back lid shall be fitted with LED lights as specified in 4.4.2.2.

4.4.2.1 Flashing LED lights on the back lid

4.4.2.2. General

- a) The technical requirements of the LED lights shall comply with the information as given in section 9.
- b) These lights shall be placed inside a permanent housing.
- c) When the roadblock trailer deploys and the back lid is erected, the flashing lights shall start to flash.

4.4.2.3. Flashing LED lights on the inside of the back lid.

- a) Flashing LED lights shall be permanently affixed to the inside of the back lid and will be facing the traffic approaching the back of the trailer which shall be configured as follows:
 - b) 2 LED modules (blue) shall be placed in the middle of the lid.
 - c) 2 LED modules (amber) shall be placed in the corners of the lid.
*One LED module at each top corner of the inside lid (Amber)
 - d) 2 LED modules (red) shall be placed in the corners of the lid.
* One LED module at each top corner of the inside lid (Red)

4.4.2.4. Flashing LED lights on the outside of the back lid

- a) flashing LED lights shall be permanently affixed on the outside of the back lid and will be facing the traffic approaching the front of the trailer, which shall be configured as follows:
- b) 2 LED modules (blue) shall be placed in the middle of the lid.
- c) 2 LED modules (amber) shall be placed in the corners of the lid.
*One LED module at each top corner of the inside lid
- d) 2 LED modules (red) shall be placed in the corners of the lid.
* One LED module at each top corner of the inside lid

4.4.3 Side doors

- a) Each side of the trailer shall be fitted with a door that shall grant access to storage locations 2 and 3 respectively.
- b) Each door shall be secured to the body of the trailer by heavy duty hinges and positioned that the door shall open to the front.
- c) In addition to the hinges, each door shall also be fitted with an appropriate gas strut.
- d) Each door shall be fitted with AA appropriate locking mechanism.
- e) The door shall be fitted with a durable handle. - properly secured towards the rear side of the door. - positioned at an appropriate height.
- f) The complete inside of each side door shall be fitted with reflective material with the following lettering in black: "Thank you for your cooperation".

4.4.4 Nose cone lids

- a) The nose cone shall be fitted with two side doors as well as a top lid that shall grant access to storage location 4.
- b) Each lid shall be secured to the body of the trailer by at least two (2) heavy duty hinges.
- c) In addition to the hinges, each door shall also be fitted with an appropriate gas lift.

4.5 Exterior Markings

- a) The sides of the trailer shall be marked in accordance with Traffic Law Enforcement specifications regarding the marking of vehicles.
- b) The marking on the trailer shall be done by the Government Fleet Management Services.

5. Equipment inside the trailer

- a) Each trailer shall be equipped with the items as given in 5.1 and 5.2.

5.1 Operational Equipment

5.1.1 Collapsible traffic signs

- a) to comply with the requirements as given in section 6

5.1.2 Portable emergency LED flashing blue light

- a) to comply with the requirements as given in section 7

5.1.3 Floodlight-and-frame-support-units with extension leads.

- a) to comply with the requirements as given in section 8

5.1.4 Reflective traffic cones

- a) total required: 48 cones per kit - 24 units as per product linked to ICN 9905184261468 (Lime/Yellow) - 24 units as per product linked to ICN 9905T05049273 (Orange)

5.1.6 Flashlights with traffic wands

- a) Flashlight to have a red casing (exterior) and clearly marked with the following words: "ROADBLOCK TRAILER"
- b) Total required: six (6) flashlights and two (2) traffic wands per kit.

5.1.7 Measuring wheel

- a) One (1) measuring wheel shall be supplied with each trailer.
- b) A durable, high-quality measuring wheel with a reset function.

5.1.8 Fuel container

- a) One (1) fuel container, accompanied by an appropriate decanting device shall be supplied with each trailer.
- b) An acceptable metallic container appropriate for fuel storage.
- c) To have a capacity of approximately 20 litres.
- d) To serve as storage for spare fuel to power the generator.
- e) Provision shall be made on the outside of the trailer to acceptably house the fuel container - housing to have a locking mechanism to secure the container in place and prevent it from being stolen.

5.1.9 Water container

- a) One (1) water container shall be supplied with each trailer.
- b) An acceptable metallic container appropriate for water storage for human consumption.
- c) To have a capacity of approximately 20 litres.
- d) To serve as storage for water used during a roadblock.
- e) Provision shall be made on the outside of the trailer to acceptably house the fuel container - housing to have a locking mechanism to secure the container in place and prevent it from being stolen.

5.1.10 Power Generator

5.1.10.1 General

- a) One (1) generator shall be supplied with each trailer.
- b) The generator shall be mounted onto the trailer in storage location 4 as follows: - Exhaust pipe shall protrude through the floorboards to the outside. - Pull-start shall be situated at a point that can be easily accessed and when pulled, shall be clear from obstructions that may cause injury to the user.

5.1.10.2 Requirements

- a) To have a four-stroke air-cooled engine.
- b) An hour meter shall be included.
- c) To be of reputable / reliable manufacture¹
- d) At least 2.0 KVA, 50 Hz
- e) Such as to provide a strong enough current to drive all the electrical equipment of the roadblock kit simultaneously.

5.1.2 Fire extinguisher

- a) One (1) fire extinguisher shall be supplied per trailer.
- b) An acceptable 4.5 kg dry powder fire extinguisher.

5.1.3 First-Aid kit

- a) One (1) complete schedule 3 first aid kit shall be supplied with each trailer.

5.1.4 Hammer

- a) One (1) 1.5 kg hammer shall be supplied per trailer.
- b) Suitable to secure steel pegs of the collapsible traffic signs to the ground (see 6.2) as well as the caltrop pegs.

6. Collapsible traffic signs and supporting frames

6.1 General

- a) Each complete traffic sign shall be collapsible.
- b) Each complete traffic sign shall be constructed in such a way that it can be folded up in a compact unit requiring the minimum storage space when packed in the trailer.
- c) The screen-printed section shall be flexible to enable it being unfolded and supported in a rectangular shape on the traffic sign tripod.
- d) Each erected traffic sign shall be able to withstand wind speeds of up to 40km/h without toppling over.

6.2 Supporting frame requirements.

- a) Twenty (20) collapsible supporting frames to be supplied per trailer.
- b) When unfolded, it shall result in a sturdy tripod support.
- c) To ensure stability, the legs of the support frame, when unfolded shall cover an area of at least 1500 mm in diameter.
- d) Ferrous components of the frame shall be electroplated to prevent corrosion.
- e) The total height of the tripod stands when opened shall not be less than 1500 mm (measurement exclude extension pole).
- f) The total height of the tripod stands when folded up, shall not exceed 1500mm.
- g) An extension pole must be supplied that shall slide inside the tripod stand frame. - the extension pole shall be sturdy enough to keep the sign up. - the tripod stand extension shall not be less than 250mm.
- h) The total height of the tripod stands when extended shall not be less than 1500mm
- i) Appropriate mass distribution in the tripod stand shall be obtained in order to withstand wind speeds of up to 40km/h without toppling over.
- j) Steel pegs of at least 200mm long shall be provided to be affixed to the tripod stands.
- k) Each tripod shall be supplied with three (3) steel pegs to be stored in storage location 3.
- l) All locking devices shall be manufactured in a fashion that it will not fall out and get lost during normal use.

6.3 Traffic sign requirements

- a) Each traffic sign shall be foldable and separate from the tripod.
- b) To comply with the requirements as given in table 3.
- c) The complete traffic sign shall be reflective.
- d) The traffic sign layout and dimensions shall be strictly in accordance with the “SADC Road Traffic Signs Manual, Edition 3, Volume 4”.
- e) The collapsible traffic sign shall have an enclosed pipe at the top of the traffic sign to enable it to connect to the tripod stand and keep it square.

7. Portable emergency LED Flashing blue light

7.1 General

- a) Four (4) portable emergency LED flashing blue lights shall be supplied per trailer.
- b) Units to be equipped with rechargeable batteries and suitable battery chargers.
- c) Units to be robust and reliable to the extent that it shall function properly under all possible work temperatures and weather conditions.
- d) Units to be portable.
- e) The units must be able to fit onto the portable traffic signs and stand on its own.

7.2 LED Requirements

- a) Each light must have a minimum of three (3) LEDs in a module.
- b) Blue LED with a typical mcd (milli-candela) of 4800 with a peak wavelength of 590nm or similar.
- c) Average life of +- 50 000 hours.
- d) Capable of achieving flashing intervals of at least 110 flashes per minute.
- e) Minimum warranty on all components shall be 1 year.

7.3 Power supply

- a) The portable light shall be powered by a built in 12V DC battery or be run directly from 220 VAC.

7.4 Electrical requirements

7.4.1 Battery Charger

- a) The light must be manufactured with a built-in battery charger to accept 220 VAC 50 Hz.

7.4.2 Battery

- a) A suitable battery shall be supplied with no memory build up and shall form part of the portable Emergency LED flashing blue light.

7.4.3 Short-circuit protection.

- a) The output shall be protected against short-circuits.

7.4.4 On/Off switch

- a) Each light shall have an on/off switch.

7.4.5 State of charge indicator

- b) A light shall indicate when the battery is charging from the mains supply.

7.4.6 Power in/out cables

- c) A cable shall be provided inside the trailer to enable the recharging of the portable LED emergency LED flashing blue light units.

7.4.7 Charging mode

- d) A charging function shall be provided that allows the battery of the flashing lights to be charged while the generator is running or when the trailer is plugged in.

7.5 Mechanical requirements

7.5.1 Housing

- a) Fixing brackets shall be administered to the portable light in order to secure the portable light to the road traffic sign. - may either be hanged onto the sign, clipped over the sign or placed onto the T-hook of the sign - all ferrous components shall be electroplated to prevent corrosion
- b) The dimensions of the portable LED blue flashing light shall not exceed 350mm x 200mm x 200mm.

7.5.2 Battery

7.5.2.1 Rated capacity

- a) The rated capacity of the battery shall be such as to power the LED flashing light for at least 5 hours before recharging is required.

7.5.2.2 Storage life

- a) The batteries shall be fully charged on delivery.
- b) The self-discharge rate of the battery shall be such that after 3 months of storage, at a temperature of 20°C, the battery shall still contain 70% of its fully charged capacity.

7.6 Extreme conditions

7.6.1 General

- a) The lights shall be used throughout the Province of the Eastern Cape; therefore, it is required to function under extreme conditions and shall comply with the specification requirements during these extreme conditions.

7.7 Warranty

- a) The housing, the on/off switch and chargers shall have a warranty of one (1) year.
- b) All other additional components shall have a warranty of at least one (1) year.

8. Floodlight-and-frame-support units with extension leads

8.1 General

- a) Each floodlight and frame support unit shall consist of three main components which shall be as follows: - Floodlights that shall comply with the requirements as given in paragraph 8.2. - Extension leads that shall comply with the requirements as given in paragraph 8.3. - Floodlight frame support that shall comply with the requirements as given in paragraph 8.4.
- b) The floodlight and frame support unit shall be collapsible and constructed in such a way that it can be folded up into a compact unit requiring the minimum storage space when packed into the trailer.
- c) The floodlights shall be detachable from the supporting structure to minimize damage during setting up or dismantling procedures.

8.2 Floodlights

8.2.1 Mechanical requirements

- a) The flood lights shall be waterproof.
- b) Each light shall have an average life of 50 000 hours.
- c) The lens shall ensure a wide even light distribution.
- d) The mountings between the floodlight and its supporting frame shall be such that the direction of each light can easily be adjusted in a vertical as well as a horizontal direction.
- e) The light unit shall be manufactured from a robust material.

8.2.2 Electrical requirements

- a) The floodlight shall operate on 12 VDC.
- b) The light shall be at least 30W and have a colour temperature of 6000K or similar.
- c) It shall be supplied with an input cord that is long enough to plug into the extension lead when the floodlight is adjusted to its maximum vertical height.
- d) To prevent personnel from tripping over the input cord, it shall be easily tied down to a point on the supporting frame close to the ground.
- e) The connection between the extension lead and the floodlight cord shall be waterproof and fitted with an appropriate low voltage plug / connector and ensure that the lights cannot be plugged into any other outlet as the ones supplied.

8.2.3 Illumination requirement

- a) The “Maximum Luminous Intensity” of the floodlights shall be at least 2000 candela.

8.2.4 Number of floodlights

- a) Total of two (2) floodlight units per supporting frame shall be supplied: - each floodlight unit shall consist of two (2) floodlights. - supporting frames to comply with the requirements as specified in paragraph 8.4.
- b) The lights shall be mounted horizontally adjacent to each other.

8.3 Extension cords

- a) Total of two (2) extension leads shall be supplied: - one lead per floodlight and supporting frame unit. - the leads shall be supplied in two lengths, i.e. 30m and 50m respectively.
- b) The diameter of the conductors shall be appropriate for the current requirements of the floodlights.
- c) The leads shall be waterproof and fitted with an appropriate low voltage plug.
- d) Each lead shall be stored on a separate wind-up reel: - the reels shall be stored in its allocated space within storage locations 2 or 3 as appropriate (see figure1).

8.4 Floodlight supporting frame.

- a) Total of two (2) floodlight supporting frames shall be supplied.
- b) To be collapsible.
- c) When unfolded, it shall result in a sturdy tripod support.
- d) To ensure stability, the legs of the tripod support frame, when unfolded shall cover a diameter of least 1500mm in diameter.
- e) Ferrous components shall be electroplated to prevent corrosion.
- f) The total height of the tripod stands when opened, shall not be less than 1100mm (measurement excludes the extension pole).
- g) The total height of the stand when folded up, shall be approximately 1300mm.
- h) An extension pole shall slide inside the tripod stand frame - the extension pole shall be round and of minimum diameter of 19mm.
- i) The tripod stand shall be manufactured from 20mm round/square tubing.
- j) The adjustable extension shall be locked in by a wing bolt that shall not be less than 6mm in diameter and must be manufactured in such a fashion that it cannot be lost by normal handling.
- k) The floodlight support frame shall result in a structure that shall enable the floodlights to be vertically adjusted in the range 1800mm (approximately) to 2300mm (maximum height.)

9. Technical requirements for the LED lights on back lid of the trailer

9.1 General requirements

- a) The emergency flashing lights, and warning devices shall comprise of LED's.
- b) Total of 12 LED modules required
- c) positioned as given in paragraph 4.4.2.2
- d) each LED module shall comprise of a minimum of 3LED's
- e) the 12 LED modules shall emit the colours as given in table 4 when switched on
- f) maximum average current draws between 8 and 12 amps
- g) minimum warranty on all components shall be 1 years

10. Electrical requirements

- a) An on-board battery shall be included, with a charger operating from the AC power supply and the generator.
- b) On-board batteries shall be housed away from any heat exposure (NOT in the nose cone)
- c) The capacity of the batteries shall be sufficient to drive the following for a minimum period of one (1) hour before having to start the on-board generator. - the blue LED warning lights on the trailer.
 - the four floodlights.
 - the portable flashing blue LED lights on the tripod stands.
 - the interior lights at the 4 storage locations.
- d) Two (2) surface mount waterproof 12 vdc outlet plugs shall be mounted on the front of the trailer for driving the floodlights.

11. External power supply

- a) To enable recharging of the on-board batteries while the trailer is at home base, an external power input plug as well as a 30m lead shall be provided.

12. Safety precautions

- a) All power outputs shall be protected with suitable circuit breakers and fuses.
- b) The batteries, chargers, circuit breakers and power converters shall be protected from the elements while it is in operation and/or not in use.
- c) All circuits shall go through the circuit breakers in the DB box.
- d) Electrical wiring must conform to the Machinery and the OHS Act, Act 6 of 1983.

13. Operating instructions

- a) Inside the lid of the trailer, a diagram depicting a typical roadblock layout shall be provided.
- b) Instruction stickers are to be provided wherever deemed necessary to prevent inadvertent damage to the trailer and kit e.g. the operational procedures of the on-board generator.
- c) Each trailer shall be delivered with an operating manual and circuit diagrams in English.

14. Compulsory specification compliance

- a) The trailer and fittings shall comply with the relevant requirements as stipulated in the compulsory specification VC 8026 “Compulsory specification for category O1 and O2 vehicles (caravans and light trailers) [By Authority of South Africa Government Gazette 26-Mar-2004]

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

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1. DEFINITIONS

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1 “Closing time” means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 “Contract” means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 “Contract price” means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 “Corrupt practice” means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 “Country of origin” means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7 “Day” means calendar day.
- 1.8 “Delivery” means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9 “Delivery ex stock” means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10 “Delivery into consignees store or to his site” means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.



- 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12 " Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components, and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.



5. USE OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION; INSPECTION

- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only as far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. PATENT RIGHTS

- 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. PERFORMANCE SECURITY

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:



- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations.

8. INSPECTIONS, TESTS AND ANALYSES

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the

contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. PACKING

9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.



10. DELIVERY AND DOCUMENTS

10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier.

10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified

11. INSURANCE

11.1 The services provided under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incurred on site. The service provider is required to provide proof valid insurance.

12. TRANSPORTATION

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.

13. INCIDENTAL SERVICES

13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any.

- (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
- (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
- (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
- (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.



14. SPARE PARTS

14.1 As specified, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. WARRANTY

15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise.

15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.

15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.



15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract

16. PAYMENT

16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified.

16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.

16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.

16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.

17. PRICES

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. CONTRACT AMENDMENTS

18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. ASSIGNMENT

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. SUBCONTRACTS

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. DELAYS IN THE SUPPLIER'S PERFORMANCE



- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- 21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. PENALTIES

- 22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the department shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the unperformed services using the current prime interest



rate calculated for each day of the expected actual performance. The department may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

22.2 The service provider undertakes to be accountable for any losses incurred whilst the company is on site.

23. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

(a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2.

(b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract;
or

(c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

24. ANTI-DUMPING AND COUNTERVAILING DUTIES AND RIGHTS

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him



25. FORCE MAJEURE

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations.

under the contract as far as is reasonably practical and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. TERMINATION FOR INSOLVENCY

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES


27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified.

27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,



- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or wilful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

- (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs,

provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

- (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. GOVERNING LANGUAGE

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. APPLICABLE LAW

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified.

31. NOTICES

31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.

31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. TAXES AND DUTIES

- 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.

33. NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL PARTICIPATION (NIP) PROGRAMME

- 33.1 The NIP programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34. PROHIBITION OF RESTRICTIVE PRACTICES

34.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor / s was / were involved in a collusive bidding (or bid rigging).

34.2 If a bidder / s or contractor / s based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Commission Act no.89 of 1998.

34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor (s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid (s) for such item (s) offered and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder (s) or contractor (s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder (s) or contractor (s) concerned.
