SECTION 1: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND RFP SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) is a public entity established in terms of the Lotteries Amendment Act (No 32 of 2013) to regulate the National Lottery as well as other lotteries, including society lotteries. The NLC evolved out of the National Lotteries Board, established in terms of the Lotteries Act No 57 of 1997. Amongst other things, the NLC is charged with the primary responsibility to manage the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF) into which the proceeds of the National Lottery are deposited and subsequently distributed for good causes.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

To renew the SAGE Evolution annual subscription fee for by 25 May 2025 and support the NLC for a period of a year after renewal.

3. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

- 1.1. The annual subscription renewal is once off and the prospective bidder is expected to support the NLC for one year after renewal and when required.

2. FORMAL BRIEFING SESSION

- 2.1. No briefing session.

3. VALIDITY PERIOD

- 3.1. The Commission requires a validity period of 90 Days from the closing date against this RFQ.
- 3.2. Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bids, on the same terms and conditions. A written letter will be sent to every bidder that responded to the bid. In terms of procedural fairness, the bidders will be allowed to respond, in writing, to the terms and conditions of the bid and the bid price. Such acceptance of the terms and conditions of the bid and bid price becomes legally binding in the procurement process. Any bidder, that did not respond to the extension of the bid validity period, in writing **WILL NOT** be considered further for the bid upon expiry of the initial validity period.

SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

4. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE REQUEST FOR QUOTATIONS

- 4.1. This document may contain confidential information that is the property of NLC.
- 4.2. No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a quotation in response to this RFQ without prior written permission from NLC.
- 4.3. All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with NLC.
- 4.4. Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 4.5. No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official NLC Purchase Order form has been received.
- 4.6. Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za, **Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Summary report) and ensure that the Tax Matters are compliant.**

5. GENERAL RULES AND INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1. News and press releases
 - 5.1.1. Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in coordination with, NLC.
- 5.2. Precedence of documents
 - 5.2.1. This RFQ consists of several sections (see list). Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations, or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFQ and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFQ submitted hereto, the

relevant stipulations in this RFQ shall take precedence,

5.2.2. Where this RFQ is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clear recommendation that NLC may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by NLC.

5.2.3. It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFQ. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of NLC as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders hereby acknowledge that the decision of NLC in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

5.3. Preferential procurement reform

5.3.1. NLC supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, NLC insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B-BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.

5.3.2. NLC shall apply the principles of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, (Act No. 5 of 2000) to this proposal read together with the Preferential No. 5 of 2000) to this proposal read together with the Preferential Procurement Regulations published with effect from 16 January 2023("the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022").

5.4. National Industrial Participation Programme,

5.4.1. The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by the Cabinet on 30 April 1997, applies to contracts that have imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD)

5.5. Language

5.5.1. Bids shall be submitted in English.

5.6. Gender

5.6.1. Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.

5.7. Headings

5.7.1. Headings are incorporated into this RFQ document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or any other purpose.

5.8. Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993

5.8.1. The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFQ and/or subsequent agreement. NLC reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to NLC.

5.9. Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information

- 5.9.1. All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFQ is collected and processed to assess the content of its tender proposal and award the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation including the PPPFA read with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022. The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom NLC is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, NLC is compelled to submit information to the National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.
- 5.9.2. All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the NLC Data Privacy Policy.
- 5.9.3. The following persons will have access to the Personal Information collected:
- 5.9.3.1. NLC personnel participating in procurement/award procedures; and
 - 5.9.3.2. Members of the public: within seven working days from the time the bid is awarded, the following information will have to be made available on the National Treasury's e-Tender portal.
- 5.10. Costs
- 5.10.1. All costs and expenses incurred by the bidders in any way associated with the development, preparation and submission of responses and providing any additional.
- 5.11. Disqualification
- 5.11.1. Any form of canvassing/lobbying/influence regarding the shortlisting will result in disqualification.
 - 5.11.2. Any non-disclosure of any other information about this bid will result in disqualification.
 - 5.11.3. Non-compliance with the bid requirements will invalidate the bid; and
 - 5.11.4. Non-compliance with all the applicable Acts, Regulations and Policies will result in the disqualification of the bid.

6. REJECTION OF ALL BIDS/QUOTATION AND DISCLAIMER

- 6.1. The NLC reserves the right to reject all bids when deemed necessary. This is justified when there is a lack of effective competition or bids/quotations are not substantially responsive.
- 6.1.1. The NLC reserves the right not to appoint a bidder;
 - 6.1.2. The NLC may appoint more than one bidder;
 - 6.1.3. Award the contract or any part thereof to one or more bidders;
 - 6.1.4. Request further information from any bidder after the closing date for clarity purposes.
 - 6.1.5. Cancel this tender or any part thereof at any time;
 - 6.1.6. Should any of the above occur, it will be communicated in writing to the bidders; and
 - 6.1.7. Fraudulent practices shall result in immediate disqualification.
 - 6.1.8. Information required by the NLC will be borne entirely and exclusively by the bidders.

7. SUPPLIER PERFORMANCE

- 7.1. The National Lotteries Commission conducts regular performance reviews by the requirements for the classification of the contract and or stakeholder by making use of supplier evaluation forms. The evaluation is conducted against the deliverables or scope of the contract with a minimum of an annual

review done for contracts longer than a year and a review at the completion of contract for those contracts less than a year.

- 7.2. Ad-hoc performance reviews shall be conducted where non-performance is identified outside the review period.
- 7.3. Non-performance will be addressed with at least a formal letter advising specific non-performing areas and stating remedial action/s required within specific time frames. Non-adherence to remedial actions shall lead to escalating performance management actions.
- 7.4. Any party to this agreement may request to participate in a joint performance review where appropriate and seek continuous improvement opportunities.

8. SECTION 3: EVALUATION CRITERIA

The NLC will evaluate all quotations in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulation 2022 (PPR2022) using the price quoted and the specific goal stated in this specification.

10.5.1. Evaluation of Price and Specific Goals as Per PPR2022 The 80/20 Principle is based on Price and special goals for the NLC.

10.5.2. The following formula is to be used to calculate the points out of 80 for price inclusive of all applicable taxes. A maximum of 80 points is allocated for price on the following basis:
