The bids will be evaluated on the basis of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2022, the Elundini Local Municipality's Supply Chain Management Policy and the 80/20 preferential procurement point system for acquisition of goods or services with Rand value equal to or below R50 million will be applied. Bid no. 3 will be evaluated based on minimum threshold for local production and content, only locally produced goods/products with a (100% on Steel galvanised products) stipulated minimum threshold will be considered. Stage one (1) of evaluation process will be in terms of the minimum threshold for local production and content required in accordance with the SABS approved standard SANS 1286:2017

Should the tender offer be withdrawn in contravention hereof, the tenderer agrees that:

If the Specification requires the tenderer to provide samples, these shall be provided strictly in accordance with the instructions set out in the Specification.

If such samples are not submitted as required in the bid documents or within any further time stipulated by the Elundini Municipality in writing, then the bid concerned may be declared non-responsive.

The samples provided by all successful bidders will be retained by the Elundini Municipality for the duration of any subsequent contract. Bidders are to note that samples are requested for testing purposes therefore samples submitted to the Elundini Municipality may not in all instances be returned in the same state of supply and in other instances may not be returned at all.

Unsuccessful bidders will be advised by the Project Manager or dedicated ELM Official to collect their samples, save in the aforementioned instances where the samples would not be returned.
