E1.1 Notice and Invitation to submit an Expression of Interest

The Department of Water and Sanitation invites expressions of interest from contractors to enter into framework agreements over a four-year term without a commitment to a quantum of work to provide management contractor services relating to the raising of the Clanwilliam Dam wall and other regional infrastructure projects. The services of the management contractor are intended to support the work of the Departments Construction South Unit in delivering various water and sanitation projects and the provision of goods and services.

The contract will be based on the NEC3 Engineering and Construction Contract (Option F: Management contract).

Respondents must have a CIDB contractor grading designation of 8CE or higher.

Only respondents who have suitable experience in the delivery of bulk water resources such as dams, water abstraction works or water transfer schemes including associated specialist mechanical and electrical works are eligible to have their submissions evaluated.

Framework agreement for the services of a management contractor for the raising of the Clanwilliam Dam wall and other regional infrastructure projects in the Western Cape, Northern and Eastern Cape for Construction South over a four-year term. Only bidders with CIDB grading 8CE or higher are eligible to bid.

E3: Indicative scope of work

1 Background

1.1 DWS Construction Units

The Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) has its own Construction Units which undertake a range of water infrastructure projects falling within the DWS's mandate. These construction infrastructure projects are clustered in 5 based construction unit offices over different regions. Construction South unit office area is in Paarl.

Resources are required to delivery infrastructure projects i.e., finance, fuel, people, materials and plant which are incorporated into the works and equipment which is used to provide the works but are not incorporated into the work. Equipment can either be owned or hired. DWS owns and maintains most of its equipment but needs to hire some specialised or bespoke equipment where it makes no sense to own and maintain such equipment. DWS also has a manufacturing capability in its workshop to manufacture certain components for incorporation into the works e.g. large diameter pipes and associated assemblies. It has people to perform the works, but as is the case with private sector contractors, it needs to procure materials and subcontract portions of the works to specialist companies who have the necessary capabilities to perform aspects of the works.

DWS management has recognised the need for a step change in approach to enable DWS construction units to deliver projects efficiently and economically. It is anticipated that the Management tender will assist in the expediting of the implementation of the Projects.

1.2 DWS Infrastructure Procurement Strategy

DWS has developed an Infrastructure Procurement Strategy which establishes the selected packaging, contracting, pricing and targeting strategy and procurement procedure for categories of procurement spend. The objectives of this strategy are:

a) primary procurement objectives (tangible and intangible objectives):

- 1) accelerate progress in improving the reliability of the water service and access to sustainable sanitation services;
- 2) respond rapidly to emerging needs and emergencies as and when they arise in the shortest possible time;
- 3) enable DWS Construction Units to function efficiently, effectively and economically through the timeous and in sequence delivery of resources to sites or workshops;
- 4) reduce costs through more efficient procurement practices;
- 5) reduce the time taken to solicit tenders and award contracts;

- 6) improve the quality of existing and future infrastructure;
- 7) increase the internal capacity and capability of DWS to efficiently, economically and effectively deliver infrastructure projects; and
- 8) deliver value for money, while minimising the scope for corruption

b) secondary objectives (that which can be promoted through a procurement):

- 1) promote broad based black economic empowerment in support of the economic transformation of South Africa;
- 2) develop internal skills and capacity to execute projects;
- 3) support skills development by increasing the number of people who have part qualifications, national qualifications and professional designations awarded by statutory councils;
- 4) promote and support local participation throughout the supply chain and local employment through the delivery of infrastructure;
- 5) promote enterprise development amongst CIDB registered contractors who are black owned or at least 30% black women owned;
- 6) promote local production and content of designated goods.

The DWS has recently also put in place a Supply Chain Management Policy for Infrastructure Procurement and associated standard operating procedures to implement the strategy.

2 Objective of the call for an expression of interest

The objective of this call for an expression of interest is to prequalify interested CIDB registered contractors so that they can be invited to submit tenders for management contracting services within the Western Cape, Northern and Eastern Cape provinces for Construction South Unit:

- a) for the raising of the Clanwilliam Dam wall as well as other dam, water abstraction works or water transfer schemes including associated specialist mechanical and electrical works projects falling within the area where the Construction South Unit has responsibilities; and
- b) to provide capacity to deal with any water and sanitation infrastructure related projects including those relating to water resources, bulk supply, water use reticulations, sanitation and outfall sewers and wastewater treatment and return flow which may be planned or arise from an emergency.

3 Framework agreements

A Framework agreement is an agreement between the Employer and one or more contractors, the purpose of which is to establish the terms governing orders to be awarded during a given period, in particular with regard to price and, where appropriate, the quantity envisaged. An order, on the other hand, is an instruction to provide work under a framework agreement. Framework agreements enable the Employer to procure on an as-instructed basis (call offs) over a set term without committing to any quantum of work. Such agreements do not bind the Employer to make use of such agreements to meet its needs. The Employer may approach the market for work falling within the scope of work of the Framework agreement, whenever it considers that better value in terms of time, cost and the quality may be obtained.

The issuing of orders to contractors having framework agreements covering the same scope of work may be made with or without requiring competition amongst such contractors. Competition amongst such contractors for orders takes place where there is no justifiable reason for issuing an order to a particular contractor, the terms in the order are insufficiently precise or complete to cover the particular requirement, or a better quality of service can be obtained through a competitive process.

The Employer will apply the provisions of SANS ISO 10845-1:2022, *Construction Procurement - Part 1: Processes, Methods and Procedures*, in the implementation of framework agreements.

4 Projects and required services

4.1 Projects

The current and planned projects within the Western Cape and Northern Cape which have been assigned to the Construction South Unit include:

a) Olifants Doorn River Water Resource Project: Raising of the Clanwilliam Dam

The Clanwilliam Dam is a concrete gravity Dam on the Olifants River near Clanwilliam in the Western Cape. It was established in 1935, The wall was raised to its current height of 43 metres in 1964. The main purpose of the dam is to provide irrigation water to the agricultural region downstream. It has a capacity of 121,8 million m³.

The raising of the Clanwilliam dam wall, which will be the first phase of the Olifants-Doorn River Water Resources Project (ODRWRP), will increase the yield of the dam by about 70 million m³ per annum to augment the water supplies to the Olifants River irrigation scheme situated in the north-western part of the Western Cape province, as well as to assist in the development of resource-poor farmers.

The raised dam wall will be approximately 370 m in length and 49 m in maximum height. At full supply level the reservoir will cover a surface area of approximately 2 022 ha and capacity of 344,3 million cubic metre. The works include the addition of concrete on the downstream side, extending the apron, construction of a free-standing intake tower, river outlet control house, a power generating house, short tunnel and coffer dam works on the upstream side, as well as various other pipe outlet structures on the downstream side. This work is to be done without interfering with the day-to-day operation of the dam.

The Clanwilliam Dam has been declared a category F dam, and is therefore not safe. To address the unsafe situation, DWS Construction South have proposed to place the first concrete on the spillway section and right bank of the dam.

b) Namakwa Bulk Water Supply Refurbishment Scheme

The Department of Water and Sanitation's Construction Division has been appointed to undertake the Namakwa pipe line refurbishment phase IIb. The existing 40 year old raising main pipeline supplying potable water from the Orange River to Springbok and surrounding towns is reaching end of life and needs to be refurbished. The following forms part of the refurbishment of the pipeline:

1. The underground and aboveground installation of 47km, 600NB spigot and socket Steel pipeline from the Henkriesmond Pre-sedimentation facility to the Eenriet Mountain. The works also includes the construction of concrete valve chambers, rehabilitation and restoration of the construction corridor and the aerial installation of an 8-core fibre optic cable for the telemetric system to be implemented.
2. The construction of a 3MI Concrete Reservoir at the Doringwater Booster Pump Station and Waterproofing works on two underground clear reservoirs at the Henkries Purification facility.
3. Refurbishment of 3 x Pump Station buildings and Installation of a 3km gravity main.
4. Installation of 4 x distribution pipelines.

c) Breede River Government Water Scheme (GWS): Kwaggaskloof Dam

The Sub-Directorate: Dam Safety Surveillance (DSS) within the Directorate: Strategic Asset Management (SAM) of the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) is doing rehabilitation works on the Kwaggaskloof Dam to improve the redundancy of the water supply at the dam and to create a safe environment.

The outlet works currently consists of two outlet pipes which lead from the upstream dry intake tower to a downstream canal and pumping station separately. From the intake tower the left 1200mm diameter outlet pipe is encased in concrete as it runs through the embankment to the downstream outlet. It discharges into a downstream stilling basin and irrigation canal. The right outlet pipe is encased in concrete for 46m with a 1200mm diameter outlet pipe and then enters into a 70m length of open culvert (gallery). From the open gallery the outlet pipe is 700mm in diameter and exits the embankment the pipe at an open concrete culvert structure and is then buried and connected to the downstream pump station (Bossieveld Pump Station).

For this project the configuration of the outlet pipes needs to be altered to install a cross-over system which uses both outlet pipes for both the pump station and the canal. In the newly designed system, the 700mm diameter outlet pipe within the open gallery will be removed and replaced by a 1200mm diameter outlet pipe. Both the left and right 1200mm diameter outlet pipes as it is exiting the embankment will run into a newly constructed concrete outlet structure. From there the two outlet pipes will discharge into a re-designed stilling basin through sleeve into the irrigation canal. In the new outlet structure a new separate 900mm diameter outlet pipe will be connected to both 1200mm diameter left and right outlet pipes. This 900mm diameter outlet pipe will be buried underground and run to the downstream pump station. The old buried 700mm diameter outlet pipe which runs to the pump station will be removed.

The rehabilitation of these outlet works comprises of civil works and mechanical and electrical works. The mechanical and electrical works include supply and installation of all the pipes, valves, access doors, overhead crane, miscellaneous items (incl. gratings, beams, ladders, manhole covers, ventilators, louvered vents, window guards, cladding plates), electrical supply and dewatering equipment as further described in this document.

d) Other Projects

The Construction South Unit may also be called upon to undertake projects relating to any water and sanitation infrastructure related projects including those relating to water resources, bulk supply, water use reticulations, sanitation and outfall sewers and wastewater treatment and return flow which may be planned or arise from an emergency.

4.2 Required Services

The works associated with a project may comprise any or all the following over a four-year term without any commitment to a quantum of work:

- a) the provision of engineering and construction works including any level of design responsibility for a site;
- b) the supply and delivery of goods, materials and equipment to a delivery place or site;
- c) the supply of plant and related services including design, manufacture, delivery and installation for a site;
- d) the servicing, maintenance, and repair of DWS equipment;
- e) the provision of professional services which are required to support the work of an employer's construction unit or for a site; and
- f) the management and provision of a service to support the work of an Employer's Construction Unit or for an affected property for a period of time.

5 Procurement strategy

The Employer intends entering into a framework agreement with a limited number of contractors, following a competitive selection process (qualified procedure). The NEC3 Engineering and Construction Contract (ECC), Option F: Management contract will form the basis of the framework agreement entered into with the Employer. The management contractor's responsibilities for construction work are the same as those of a contractor working under one of the other options provided in the NEC3 ECC for engineering and constructions works.

However, the management contractor performs only a limited amount of construction works typically relating to site establishment and de-establishment and may be called upon to provide the DWS Construction Unit with resources. The remainder of work will be contracted from local sub-contractors and suppliers who will be subcontracted through direct contracts with the contractor, who acts as a management contractor.

The management contractor tenders his Fee and is paid on a cost reimbursable basis i.e. Defined Cost uplifted by his Fee percentage. Defined Cost includes subcontract amounts and the prices of the work done by the Contractor himself less Disallowed Cost. Disallowed Cost includes costs not justified by accounts and record, costs not in accordance with a Subcontractor's contract, costs incurred because procedures were not followed and payment to a Subcontractor for work which the Contractor is to do himself and the Contractor's management.

The management contractor is responsible for supplying management services. The management contractor's Fee will increase if subcontractors' prices (part of Defined Cost to the contractor) increase due to compensation events. However, he will not receive separate payment for his work in dealing with compensation events and he will not receive any additional Fee for work on compensation events which does not lead to an increase in subcontractors' prices.

The NEC3 ECC will be modified to accommodate the range of works required in addition to engineering and construction works i.e. the supply and delivery of goods, materials, equipment and plant to a delivery place, the provision of professional services and the management and provision of a service to support the work of an Employer's Construction Unit or for an affected property for a period of time. Such works will also be undertaken on the basis of Defined Cost uplifted by a Fee.

The Respondents will be evaluated in a two phase process:

- Phase 1 will be this document; the Expression of Interest for the framework agreement. This will be evaluated and all bidders who comply to the requirements as set out will be requested to complete a second document
- Phase 2: Respondents who are invited to submit tenders will be evaluated on the basis of financial offer, preference, quality and other requirements. Tenderers will be required to tender their direct fee percentage and subcontracted fee percentages. These parameters will be reduced to a comparative offer in terms of a tender assessment schedule. A framework agreement will be entered into with the highest scoring tenderers.

6 Secondary procurement objectives and obligations

Respondents will be required in the performance of the contract to attain key performance indicators relating to the aforementioned secondary objectives in the execution of orders.
