**REQUEST FOR  
QUOTATIONS FOR OHTE  
INSPECTION - PRASA  
NALEDI-PARKSTATION  
CORRIDOR**

## **1. Purpose**

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- 1.1. The purpose of this procurement requisition is to appoint a qualified service provider to conduct an OHTE infrastructure inspection in the railway
- 1.2. corridor between Naledi and Johannesburg Park stations for the RSR.

## **2. Considerations/background**

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- 2.1. The Overhead Traction Equipment (OHTE) between Naledi and Johannesburg Park stations has been restored. The Passenger Rail Agency of South Africa (PRASA) is currently running Electrical Multiple Unit (EMU) trains in this corridor since December 2022.
- 2.2. There have been several challenges experienced with OHTE in the corridor since the resumption of train service in the section
- 2.3. One of the problems reported to being experienced was a lightning strike during a storm resulting in line closure and train cancellations. It seems that there was a failure in the OHTE protection system in the section.

## **3. Scope of work / Specification**

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Specifications are as follows:

- 3.1. Conduct an inspection in loco at the selected sections between Naledi and Johannesburg Park stations to assess the condition of the OHTE infrastructure installed in the section. The service provider will also observe train traffic and the types of trains using the corridor
- 3.2. Engage in discussions with following key PRASA personnel to understand the challenges experienced in the section and the controls implemented for safe train

- operations in the section
- 3.3. **Request and peruse the following OHTE infrastructure documents**
  - 3.4. **Conduct OHTE verifications tests with PRASA personnel where required. The verification tests will be guided by what comes out from the inspections, discussions, and perusal of documents**
  - 3.5. **Make recommendations to improve the OHTE infrastructure conditions in the corridor.**
  - 3.6. **Provide an inspection report covering the complete allocated scope.**
  - 3.7. **The service provider receives its powers to conduct this investigation from section 33 of Act16 of 2002. The service provider has the same powers as any RSR Railway Safety Inspector.**
  - 3.8. **A total of 180 hours will be allocated for this assignment. The 180 hours includes review of documents, site visits and inspections, interviews, drafting of the inspection report and any other relevant activity that will make this project a success.**

- a) The persons must be registered with Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA) In terms of the Engineering Profession Act 46 of 2000 as a Professional Engineer or Technologist. (Submit a valid proof)

## 6. Functionality Evaluation Criteria - *if applicable*

- 6.1. The suitable service provider must demonstrate capacity and capability to execute this project by complying with the functionality criteria on the table below:

Service Providers must attain a minimum threshold of **70 points** or more to be considered for evaluation on the 80/20 Preference Point System.

*Failure to attain the set minimum threshold will result in a disqualification.*

## **7. Evaluation 80/20 Preference Point System**

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- 7.1. The price quotations will be evaluated in accordance with the pre-scripts of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) and its regulations, in particular Preference Procurement Regulation 2022 which stipulate **80/20 preference point system for acquisition of goods or services with Rand value equal to or below R50 million (inclusive of all applicable tax).**
- 7.2. **A maximum of 80 points for price and 20 points for the specific goal**

specified on the request for quotation may be awarded to a Service Provider.
