Denel (SOC) Ltd is the largest manufacturer of defence equipment in South Africa and operates in the military aerospace and landward defence environment. Incorporated as a private company in 1992 in terms of the South African Companies Act (No 62 of 1973)

PURPOSE OF THIS REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

The K9 Dog kennel unit of Denel Land System in Lyttleton Manor, Centurion is underlain by Dolomite bedrock, being a carbonaceous rock slightly soluble in mildly acidic conditions (rainwater). The dog kennel unit was closed due to a sinkhole event (collapse of overlying soils into cavities) after a period of intense rainfall on October 2021.

The site runs through a mapped dolomitic area and is therefore subject to a significant risk of sinkhole formation. The main purpose of this project is to protect the K9 Dog Kennel unit and the surrounding area against existing and potential forming of new sinkholes.

LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK OF THE BID

Tax Legislation

- 1.1.1 Bidder(s) must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Denel SOC Ltd and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

- 1.7 If Bidder(s) finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this bid or any other information provided by Denel SOC Ltd (other than minor clerical matters), the Bidder(s) must promptly notify Denel SOC Ltd in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford Denel SOC Ltd an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).

- 1.11 Bidders' attention is drawn to the fact that amendments to any of the Bid Conditions or setting of counter conditions by Bidders or qualifying any Bid Conditions will result in the invalidation of such bids.

FRONTING

- 1.12 Government supports the spirit of broad based black economic empowerment and recognizes that real empowerment can only be achieved through individuals and businesses conducting themselves in accordance with the Constitution and in an honest, fair, equitable, transparent and legally compliant manner. PRESENTATION / DEMONSTRATION

- 1.19 Denel SOC Ltd reserves the right to request presentations/demonstrations from the short-listed Bidders as part of the bid evaluation process.

DURATION OF THE CONTRACT

- 1.20 Once Off.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF SPECIFICATION

- 1.21 All intellectual proprietary rights emanating from this project will reside with Denel.
- 1.22 All reports and working paper files shall become the property of Denel.
- 1.23 The prospective service providers must submit an all-inclusive price and detailed cost breakdown schedule (the price must be VAT inclusive).
- 1.24 Travelling costs and time spent or incurred between the service provider offices and Denel or home and office the staff shall not be for the account of Denel
- 1.25 Payment will be strictly based on completed and approved deliverables and time spent and not only based on time spent at Denel.
- 1.26 The successful bidder will be expected to conduct themselves in a manner that will be seen as part of Denel.

1. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work entails sinkhole mitigation works at various sites in the Metrorail Gauteng Province. The service provider shall do the work as directed by the Engineer or his/her representative and in accordance with the specifications set out in this tender/contract document.

1.1 Scope of the Desired Solution

The appointed contractor will be required to undertake the following services;

- Site Clearance including removal of existing structure
- Removal and discarding of existing water pipes
- Earthworks including bulk excavation.
- Drilling and grouting
- Backfilling and compaction using imported material from commercial source
- Road re-instatement
- Reporting.

The following studies and services are required from the Contractor conducting investigations in accordance with SABS 1936:

- Topographical Surveys;
- Occupation Health and Safety;
- Cadastral Surveys;
- Service Detection;
- Existing roads

1.2 Details on the preferred solution

The preferred solution shall be the appointment of a project management/consulting engineering company that will execute thorough engineering work and advise Denel Land system on the suitable design solution, new drainage upgrade and sinkhole mitigation works at Denel Land system. The appointed company will also be responsible for project management during construction and project close out.

1.3 Targeted area by this project

The place of work shall be the Gauteng region, within Denel Land System, Centurion, the sequence of work shall be determined on an on-going basis based on operational requirements and availability of sites for outages. This will be communicated in time to the service provider.

2. EXTENT AND COVERAGE OF THE PROPOSED PROJECT




Figure 1: Area affected (Denel Land system)

The above figure depicts the area affected; Denel Land is situated on the line of Pretoria to Centurion. The K9 Dog kennel units are temporarily closed. Dogs that are affected were moved to other nearby dog kennel unit.

Specification of the work or products or services required

This specification covers sinkhole mitigation works will be at K9 Dog Kennel Unit in the Denel land system, Gauteng Province. The service provider shall do the work as directed by the Engineer or his/her representative and in accordance with the specifications set out in this tender/contract document.

2.1. Specification of the scope of work

This contract covers the general principles and requirements for:

- Review of the Geotechnical investigations report implemented to determine the general suitability of the dolomite land developed for dog kennel unit.
- The review of determined inherent hazard class of dolomite land, to be used in conjunction with other parts of SANS 1936 to ascertain the dolomite area designation and requirements for the development of such land; and
- Inspection and verification during the implementation phase of a project on dolomite land.

2.2. Contract Period

The contract period will be 3 months. Emergency work to be conducted and safe reopening of the dog kennel unit to be determined within a week of commencement.

2.3. Day works

Before commencing with the day works, the operator and staff shall ensure that they are all wearing the correct personnel protective equipment (PPE) and that the required safety protocol has been completed (such as Tool Box talk and etc).

3. MAINTENANCE PERIOD

All tools and equipment should be serviced and maintained on a routine basis. This should include the replacement of diesel, hydraulic and engine oil filters, oils, lubricants, fan belts, worn parts and etc.

4. PROTECTION OF WORKS

- a) Denel Land System (in cooperation with the service provider) will arrange for the occupations during which the project will take place.
- b) The service provider shall comply with Denel Land System safety legislation and requirements in all respects, before the beginning of the works.
- c) The service provider shall provide his own security.

4.1 TO BE PROVIDED BY DENEL LAND SYSTEM

- Dumping site to offload the spoiled material.

4.2. TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CONTRACTOR

- The tenderer shall submit with his/her tender a detailed method statement and sequenced program based on evaluation criteria of how he/she proposes to execute the work. This shall include detail of number and grades of staff and equipment that he/she intends using. On award of the tender the successful tenderer's first task under the Contract shall be to agree with the Project Manager on a Final Work Program to be followed. This must be done within 1 day from date of award.
- A site book (in triplicate) to record all incidents as well as the progress of work done during the occupation.

- A record should be kept of the details of each stage including project details, level survey, slip circle crack dilation etc.
- All machinery, equipment, vehicles and labour that he shall need to successfully complete the project. He must maintain and operate during the contract period including all consumables, refer to figure 2: section sinkhole rehabilitation method.

4.3 MATERIAL

All material will be supplied by the contractor, and should be included in the Tendered rates. (E.g. boulders, concrete etc.) Refer to schedule of quantities.

4.4 PLANT, TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

The service provider must provide his/her own vehicles and equipment needed to assess and rehabilitate the sinkhole. A daily check should be made for any oil leaks, exposed wires and loose (hot) electric Request for Quotation for sinkhole mitigation works in the Denel Land System area connections. If leaks occur, a drip tray or sheet should be placed beneath the rig. Any contaminants entering the soil should be scrapped up and safely disposed of.

4.5 MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

The sinkhole structure is usually composed of two parts.

- A funnel section which is normally cone shaped and extends from an irregular shaped edge at the surface, narrowing downwards to the floor of the cavity

The design principle of sinkhole backfilling is therefore carried out in stages in accordance with SABS 1936.

4.6 SAFETY

- All work in this contract shall comply with the Occupational Safety Act No 85 of 1993, National Environmental management Act 107 of 1997 Act and construction regulation 2014. These items shall all be included in the tendered rates.
- A copy of the act as well as an approved safety file shall be kept on site for the duration of the project.

- The Contractor shall comply with all applicable legislation and Denel Land System safety requirements adopted from time to time and instructed by the Project Manager. Such compliance shall be entirely at the contractor's cost and shall be deemed to have been allowed for in the rates or total prices in the contract.
- The Contractor shall report all incidents in writing to the Project Manager. Any incident resulting in the death of or injury to any person on the works shall be reported within 1 hour of its occurrence and any other incident shall be reported within 24 hours of its occurrence.
- All personnel employed by the Contractor shall have undergone a Health and Safety Induction.
- Permits to work (in line with Covid-19 regulations) shall be issued at the cost of the contractor to all personnel on that shall be signed and stamped by the authorized Denel Land System responsible for Risk Management.
- The contractor shall ensure that all COVID - 19 protocols are adhered to.
- The Contractor shall make necessary arrangements for sanitation, water and electricity at these relevant sites during the installation of the equipment.
- Normal protection measures in accordance with the Protection Manual shall apply.
- The service provider shall be responsible for the safety of personnel on site.
- The following shall also form part of the safety plan:
 - Transportation of equipment and personnel.
 - Transportation, storage and handling of hazardous equipment
 - The site access certificate shall only be issued (to the successful bidder) after the evaluation and approval of the safety file.

- 1.36 Denel **SOC Ltd reserves the right:**

- 1.37 To award this tender to a bidder that did not score the highest total number of points, only in accordance with section 2(1)(f) of the PPPFA (Act 5 of 2000)
- 1.38 To negotiate with one or more preferred bidder(s) identified in the evaluation process, regarding any terms and conditions, including price without offering the same opportunity to any other bidder(s) who has not been awarded the status of the preferred bidder(s).
- 1.39 To accept part of a tender rather than the whole tender.

- a. engages in any collusive tendering, anti-competitive conduct, or any other similar conduct, including but not limited to any collusion with any other bidder in respect of the subject matter of this bid;
- b. seeks any assistance, other than assistance officially provided by a Government Entity, from any employee, advisor or other representative of a Government Entity in order to obtain any unlawful advantage in relation to procurement or services provided or to be provided to a Government Entity;

1.49 If a bidder breaches the conditions of this bid and, as a result of that breach, Denel SOC Ltd incurs costs or damages (including, without limitation, the cost of any investigations, procedural impairment, repetition of all or part of the bid process and/or enforcement of intellectual property rights or confidentiality obligations), then the bidder indemnifies and holds Denel SOC Ltd harmless from any and all such costs which Denel SOC Ltd may incur and for any damages or losses Denel SOC Ltd may suffer.

PRECEDENCE

1.50 This document will prevail over any information provided during any briefing session whether oral or written, unless such written information provided, expressly amends this document by reference.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

1.51 A bidder participates in this bid process entirely at its own risk and cost. Denel SOC Ltd shall not be liable to compensate a bidder on any grounds whatsoever for any costs incurred or any damages suffered as a result of the Bidder's participation in this Bid process.

TAX COMPLIANCE

1.52 No tender shall be awarded to a bidder who is not tax compliant. Denel SOC Ltd reserves the right to withdraw an award made, or cancel a contract concluded with a successful bidder in the event that it is established that such bidder was in fact not tax compliant at the time of the award, or has submitted a fraudulent Tax Clearance Certificate to Denel SOC Ltd, or whose verification against the Central Supplier Database (CSD) proves non-compliant. Denel SOC Ltd further reserves the right to cancel a contract with a successful bidder in the event that such bidder does not remain tax compliant for the full term of the contract.

TENDER DEFAULTERS AND RESTRICTED SUPPLIERS

1.53 No tender shall be awarded to a bidder whose name (or any of its members, directors, partners or trustees) appear on the Register of Tender Defaulters kept by National Treasury, or who have been placed on National Treasury's List of Restricted

Suppliers. Denel SOC Ltd reserves the right to withdraw an award, or cancel a contract concluded with a Bidder should it be established, at any time, that a bidder has been blacklisted with National Treasury by another government institution.

GOVERNING LAW

- 1.54 South African law governs this bid and the bid response process. The bidder agrees to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the South African courts in any dispute of any kind that may arise out of or in connection with the subject matter of this bid, the bid itself and all processes associated with the bid.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR SUB-CONTRACTORS AND BIDDER'S PERSONNEL

- 1.55 A bidder is responsible for ensuring that its personnel (including agents, officers, directors, employees, advisors and other representatives), its sub-contractors (if any) and personnel of its sub-contractors comply with all terms and conditions of this bid. In the event that Denel SOC Ltd allows a bidder to make use of sub-contractors, such sub-contractors will at all times remain the responsibility of the bidder and Denel SOC Ltd will not under any circumstances be liable for any losses or damages incurred by or caused by such sub-contractors.

- 1.56 Except as may be required by operation of law, by a court or by a regulatory authority having appropriate jurisdiction, no information contained in or relating to this bid or a bidder's tender(s) will be disclosed by any bidder or other person not officially involved with Denel SOC Ltd's examination and evaluation of a Tender.
- 1.57 No part of the bid may be distributed, reproduced, stored or transmitted, in any form or by any means, electronic, photocopying, recording or otherwise, in whole or in part except for the purpose of preparing a Tender. This bid and any other documents supplied by Denel SOC Ltd remain proprietary to Denel SOC Ltd and must be promptly returned to Denel SOC Ltd upon request together with all copies, electronic versions, excerpts or summaries thereof or work derived there from.

ANNEXURE G: SBD 9

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT TENDER DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Tendering Document (SBD) must form part of all Tenders¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive Tendering (or Tender rigging).² Collusive tendering is a *per se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.

- 3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:
