DETAILED SPECIFICATION:

PROVISION OF ARLAM MONITORING, ARMED RESPONSE, SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE FOR THE PORTS REGULATOR OF SOUTH AFRICA FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTEEN (13) MONTHS

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Ports Regulator of South Africa (PRSA) is a Schedule 3A public entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, 1 of 1999 (PFMA). Port Regulator South Africa must fully comply with all the requirements of the PFMA.
- 1.2 The Ports Regulator is the independent National Regulator for the South African ports, governed by the National Ports Act, 2005 (Act No. 12 of 2005).
 In terms of section 30 (1) and (2) of the National Ports Act, the main function of the Regulator is to:
 - Exercise economic regulation for the ports system in line with government's strategic objectives.
 - Promote equity of access of ports and facilities and service provider by ports.
 - Monitor the activities of the National Ports Authority to ensure that it performs it functions in accordance with the act; and
 - Hear appeals and complaints contemplated in terms of Section 48 of the Act.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this invitation is to request suitably qualified and experienced service providers to submit proposals to provide an alarm monitoring, armed response, support and maintenance for the Ports Regulator of South Africa for a period of thirteen (13) months.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

- Provide 24 hours monitoring with armed response.
- Provide technical support and maintenance of the alarm system as and when required.

4. SPECIFICATION

- Alarm system must have a device setting that works with a PIN and manual for activation during closure or locking of doors.
- All internal warning devices must be installed in an enclosed container for the purpose of protecting the devices.
- The device should alert or report to PRSA internal staff as well as the service provider in the event of an intruder. This should include call notification on mobile numbers that will be provided to the successful bidder.
- The alarm must not be able to activate if the doors or windows are not closed.
- Signaling must be via an acceptable dual signal system.
- Armed response unit must be able to reach the building within reasonable time.

5. EVALUATION CRITERIA

4.1 SCM Administrative

- 4.1.1 The service provider must submit proof of registration on CSD (Central Supplier Database).
- 4.1.2 The SBD 4 form must be completed, initialled and signed by the authorised company representative.

4.2 MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

The service provider must provide valid and up to date proof of registration with Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority (PSIRA).

Failure to provide this mandatory information may lead to bidders' proposal not being considered further.

4.3 PRICE COMPARISON

RFQ responses will be evaluated based on price only.
