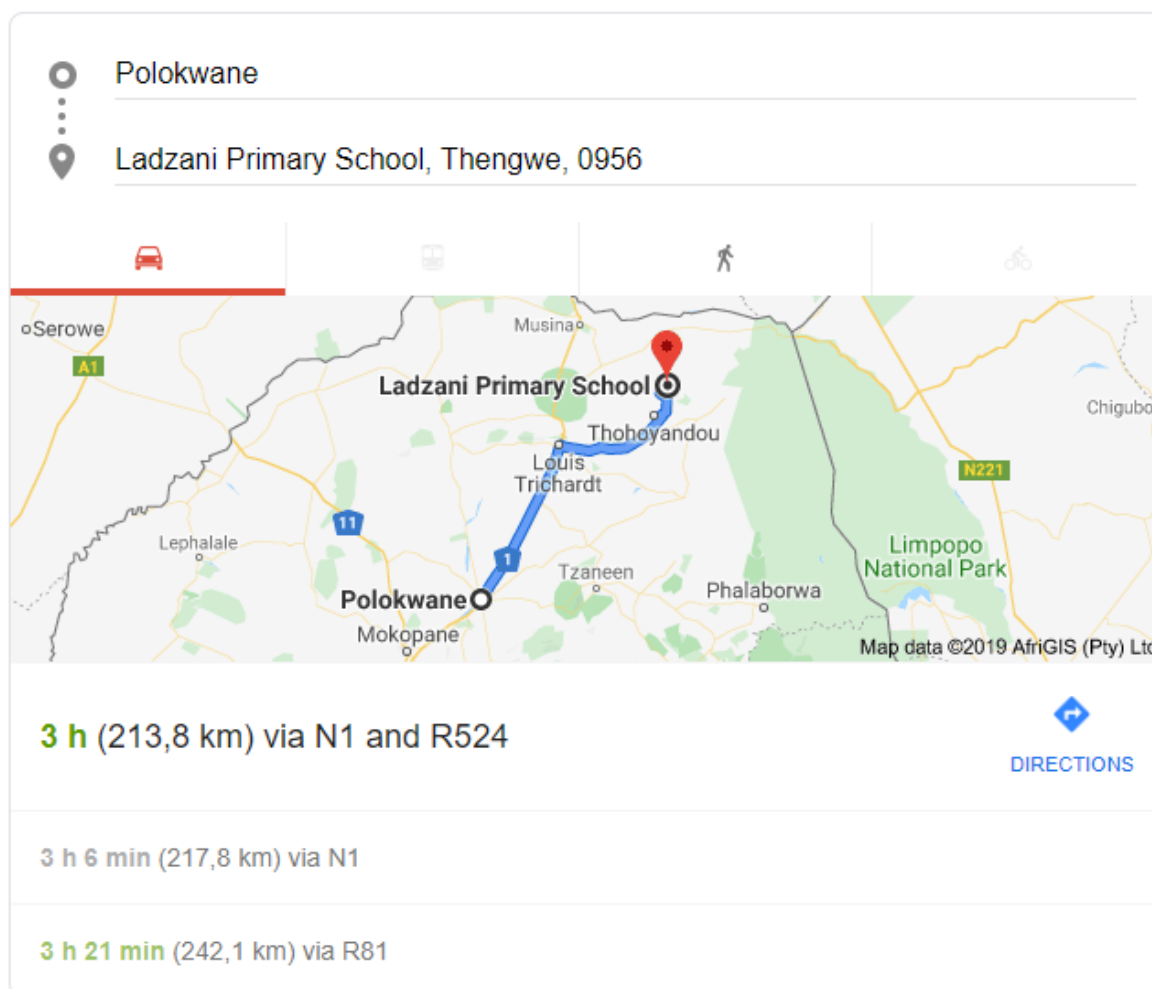


Figure 1: Polokwane to Ladzani Primary School
