DETAILED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

1. BACKGROUND

Over the past three (3) audit cycles the SABC has been utilising CaseWare to prepare interim and final annual financial statements which have been quality assured by internal audit and have been submitted to the Auditor General of South Africa for external audit, (i.e external quality assurance) as per Public Finance Management Act, No. 1of 1999, section 55(1)(b) and (c)(i), which requires public entities to prepare each year annual financial statements in accordance with a financial reporting framework, and to submit these annual financial statements within two (2) months after the end of the financial year to the auditors for auditing.

The award made to Adapt-IT for the CaseWare software is expiring. Hence, the procurement of a financial reporting software is necessary.

As an entity we continually seek to optimally utilising technological tools that will enable us to efficiently prepare quality annual financial statements which are free from material misstatements.

2. BUSINESS REQUIREMENTS SERVICE

Financial statement preparation software

- To read data from SAP for several company codes.
- Manual Input of additional data will be recommended
- Perform consolidations of the financial statements
- Ability to process adjusting journals

Effective Date of Bid

7. EVALUATION CRITERIA

7.1 BBBEE and Price

The RFQ responses will be evaluated on the 80/20-point system

7.2 Technical Evaluation

7.2.1 The tender submission will be technically evaluated out of **65 points**

7.2.2 A threshold of **40** out of **65** has been set.

7.2.3 All bidders achieving less than the set threshold of **40 points out of 65** points will not proceed to the next phase and not be evaluated for BBBEE & Price.

7.2.4 SABC further reserve the right not to award this RFQ to any bidder based on the proven poor record of accomplishment of the bidder in previous projects within the SABC.

7.2.5 Bidder's non-compliance to this mandatory requirement will be declared non-responsive.

8. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 8.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder
- 8.2 Preference points shall be calculated after process has been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices.
- 8.3 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal pints, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 8.4 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality
- 8.5 Should two or more bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

9. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

The **80/20** preference point system

- 9.1 Bidders who qualify as EME's in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by a verification Agency accredited by SANAS for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates or DTI Affidavit.
- 9.2 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status levels verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a verification agency accredited by SANAS.

- 9.3 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate
- 9.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 9.5 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 9.6 A tenderer will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intend sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended Sub-contractor is an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 9.7 A tenderer awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.

10. COMMUNICATION

Respondents are warned that a response will be disqualified should any attempt be made by a tenderer either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer(s) or employees of SABC in respect of a tender, between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.

All enquiries relating to this RFQ should be emailed three days before the closing date.

11. CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED WHEN TENDERING

- 11.1 The Corporation does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, nor shall it be responsible for or pay any expenses or losses which may be incurred by the Tenderer in the preparation and delivery of his tender. The Corporation reserves the right to accept a separate tender or separate tenders for any one or more of the sections of a specification. The corporation also reserves the right to withdraw the tender at any stage.
- 11.2 No tender shall be deemed to have been accepted unless and until a formal contract / letter of intent is prepared and executed.
- 11.3 The Corporation reserves the right to:

Not evaluate and award submissions that do not comply strictly with his RFQ document.

Make a selection solely on the information received in the submissions and

- 11.3.1 Enter into negotiations with any one or more of preferred bidder(s) based on the criteria specified in the evaluation of this tender.
- 11.3.2 Contact any bidder during the evaluation process, in order to clarify any information, without informing any other bidders. During the evaluation process, no change in the content of the RFQ shall be sought, offered or permitted.
- 11.3.3 Award a contract to one or more bidder(s).

11.3.4 Accept any tender in part or full at its own discretion.

11.3.5 Cancel this RFQ or any part thereof at any time.

11.3.6 Should a bidder(s) be selected for further negotiations, they will be chosen on the basis of the greatest benefit to the Corporation and not necessarily on the basis of the lowest costs, aligned to the BBBEE & Preference Point system.

12. Cost of Bidding

The Tenderer shall bear all costs and expenses associated with preparation and submission of its tender or RFQ, and the Corporation shall under no circumstances be responsible or liable for any such costs, regardless of, without limitation, the conduct or outcome of the bidding, evaluation, and selection process.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.

- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.

- 3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:

Bid rigging is, therefore, an agreement between competitors not to compete.

8. In addition, there have been no consultations, communications, agreements or arrangements with any competitor regarding the quality, quantity, specifications and conditions or delivery particulars of the products or services to which this bid invitation relates.
9. The terms of the accompanying bid have not been, and will not be, disclosed by the bidder, directly or indirectly, to any competitor, prior to the date and time of the official bid opening or of the awarding of the contract.
