3.1. Evaluation Stages

AIRPORTS COMPANY SOUTH AFRICA will use pre-determined evaluation stages when considering received quotations. The evaluation criteria will consider the commitment made for functionality/technical, Price and BEE, Objective Criteria

During the evaluation of received quotation packs AIRPORTS COMPANY SOUTH AFRICA will make an assessment whether all the bids comply with set minimum requirements and whether all returnable documents/information have been submitted. 3.3. Functionality / Technical Evaluation Functionality hurdle breakdown

Functionality

The functionality evaluation will be conducted by the end-user/operations/the Bid Evaluation Committee which comprises of various skilled and experienced members from diverse professional disciplines. The evaluation process will be based on prequalification/threshold criteria. The criteria will be as follows:

NB: Functionality phase requires full compliance of **55 Points** to prevent elimination from the Bid. It should be further noted that a **Minimum Qualifying Score per criteria must be fully** met as set out.
