1. INTRODUCTION

The Winnie Madikizela Mandela Local Municipality (WMM LM), located within the Alfred Nzo District Municipality in the Eastern Cape, is predominantly rural, with a dispersed settlement pattern. The Municipality recognizes the need to strategically guide rural development in line with the National Rural Development Strategy developed by SALGA and in alignment with SPLUMA (Act No. 16 of 2013).

2. BACKGROUND AND PROBLEM STATEMENT

The Winnie Madikizela Mandela Local Municipality is predominantly rural in character, with more than 80% of its population residing in traditional or communal land areas. The settlement pattern is highly dispersed, with numerous villages and homesteads located across difficult terrain.

Recognizing the need for a more structured and inclusive approach to rural development, the Municipality seeks to develop a Rural Settlement Development Plan (RSDP) in alignment with the National Rural Development Strategy as developed by the South African Local Government Association (SALGA). The Strategy calls for integrated rural planning, spatial transformation, and investment-led development, with a focus on enabling municipalities to unlock the socio-economic potential of their rural landscapes.

The RSDP will serve as a strategic tool to guide decision-making on land use, settlement upgrading, infrastructure prioritization, township establishment, and economic development in rural areas. It will also support the Municipality's obligations under the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act (SPLUMA) to redress spatial injustices and promote inclusive development across all human settlements.

3. SCOPE OF WORK.

The suitably qualified and experienced service provider to submit proposals for the development of a Rural Settlement Development Plan (RSDP) that will provide a long-term spatial and development framework to support coordinated, integrated, and sustainable development in the Municipality's rural areas.

Phase 1: Project Initiation and Finalization of Terms of Reference

An Inception Report must be submitted within two weeks from the date of the letter of appointment. This first report shall include a detailed work plan, timeframes and a refined budget utilization.

Phase 2: Analysis and Review of Rural Settlements.

- Identification from the spatial location, densities and configuration of all rural settlements.
- The settlement name and alternatives name(s)
- Identification of the type and level of infrastructural, housing and social services and where the gaps are.
- Land use i.e. land used for settlement, commonage, grazing and arable purposes
- Type of land tenure / ownership
- If any previous settlement planning was undertaken for a rural settlement i.e. status of planning (conceptual / draft layout plan / formal approved layout plan etc.) and in terms of which planning legislation
- If any settlement has been surveyed and the status of the plans
- GIS representation of all rural settlements and farm portions (maps and shapefiles).
- The service provider will be expected to prepare, print information pamphlets and conduct workshops with local communities, Ward Councillors and Traditional Leaders.

The key deliverable for phase 2 will be the development of a comprehensive database of all rural settlements located in Winnie Madikizela Mandela Local municipality.

Phase 3: Rural Settlement Development Plan

- Identification and protection of prime productive land and environmental sensitive areas in the rural areas
- Identify where settlement expansion should be undertaken if needed i.e. in which direction should a rural settlement expand its settlement footprint.
- Identification of settlement edges (controls) as proposed in the Provincial Spatial Development Plan
- Identification of Agricultural Protected Areas as proposed in the Provincial Spatial Development Plan
- Identification of rural nodes and service centres where a higher order of services should be planned for
- Develop business plan that the municipality will use to source funds
- GIS representation of proposals (maps & shapefiles)

4. Key Deliverables

As part of this project, the appointed service provider will be required to produce the following final deliverables:

- 8 hard copies of the final approved Rural Settlement Development Plan, inclusive of all annexures, maps, and supporting documentation;
- 1 editable soft copy of the full report in Microsoft Word and PDF formats;
- 1 GIS-compatible shapefile package and spatial database;
- All presentation materials and stakeholder engagement records compiled and submitted in digital format.

5. RELEVANT SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE.

Below is a summary of Mandatory requirements:

- Project leader must hold a tertiary qualification in Town and Regional Planning which is recognized South African Council of Planners (SACPLAN).
- Project team member must have the expertise in GIS Profession which is recognized South African Geomatics Council (SAGC).
- > One or more Personnel must have expertise in Environmental Management.

Skills and abilities required in the team to execute the project include but not limited to the following:

- Town and Regional Planning;
- Geography and hands on GIS (at least at Technician Level);
- Environmental Practitioner:
- Project Management;
- Research, analytical, writing and communication skills and Strategic planning.

It is therefore recommended that the service provider ensures that people with the relevant skills are part of the project. A list of people containing, among other things, names, qualifications and experience who will be directly involved in the project must be submitted. This should clearly indicate what roles each team member will play.

A company / team profile containing, among other things, names, qualifications and experience of persons who will be **directly** involved in the project must be included.

All team members that will be directly involved in the project will be expected to attend all progress report meetings as scheduled and agreed upon by both parties. The selected team members shall stay the same for the duration of the project and cannot be changed without prior discussions with and approval from the municipality.

6. INFORMATION GATHERING

The successful candidates are expected to contact the relevant GIS, Planning and required officials and units within the local and provincial spheres of government to obtain relevant information that is required for the project. Existing information on SDFs and Municipal Property Register which will be available within the municipality/plans will be made available to the successful service provider.

In light of the event that the service provider needs a letter to confirm the motive for requesting information from the different spheres of government or parastatals, the municipality will provide the requested letter.

However, the responsibility for collecting information necessary for the successful execution of the project remains entirely with the service provider.

7. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE BID

7.1 General

- 7.1.1 Awarding of the bid will be subject to the Service Provider's express acceptance of the municipal Supply Chain Management general contract conditions.
- 7.1.2 The municipality and Service Provider will sign a Services Level Agreement upon appointment.
- 7.1.3 Staffing requirements will be identified on the onset of the project and shall remain unchanged for the duration of the project, unless prior written consent has been granted by the municipality.
- 7.1.4 No material or information derived from the provision of the services under the contract may be used for any other purposes except for those of the municipality, except where duly authorized to do so in writing by the municipality.
- 7.1.5 Copyright in respect of all documents and data prepared or developed for the purpose of the project by the Service Provider shall be vested in municipality.
- 7.1.6 The successful Service Provider agrees to keep all records and information of, or related to the project confidential and not discloses such records or information to any third party without the prior written consent of municipality.
- 7.1.7 The municipality reserves the right to terminate the contract in the event that there is clear evidence of non-performance and non-compliance with the contract.
- 7.1.8 The service provider may be required to do a presentation in person or virtually to the municipality or partners; at their own cost should it be deemed necessary to do so.

8. Format of Proposal

- 8.1 All proposals are to respond to requirements as per the Terms of Reference.
- 8.2 All proposals should be clearly indexed and easy to read.

9. EVALUATION PROCEDURE

This bid shall be evaluation in two stages. On first stage bids will be evaluated on functionality, second stage in accordance with 80/20 preference points system as stipulated above.

First Stage - Evaluation of Functionality

The evaluation of the functionality will be evaluated individually by Members of Bid Evaluation Committee in accordance with the below functionality criteria and values.

The applicable values that will be utilized when scoring each criteria ranges from 1 being poor, 2 being average, 3 being good, 4 being very good and 5 being excellent.

- a) The applicable preference point system for this tender is the 90/10 preference point system.
- b) The applicable preference point system for this tender is the 80/20 preference point system.
- c) Either the 90/10 or 80/20 preference point system will be applicable in this tender. The lowest/ highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the accurate system once tenders are received.
- 1.3 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:
 - (a) Price; and
 - (b) Specific Goals.

- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation:
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
