### 1. BACKGROUND

The bidder shall further warrant that all materials / goods supplied under tender award shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship or from any act

or omission of the supplier that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of destination.

Tenderers are required to provide laborers and equipment for the off-loading of the ordered items.
