Electronically downloaded documentation, obtainable from the National Treasury's eTenders website, should be printed in its entirety, and suitably bound by the tenderer. # PART T1: TENDERING PROCEDURES T1.2: TENDER DATA

#### T1.2.1 STANDARD CONDITIONS OF TENDER

The conditions of tender are the Standard Conditions of Tender as contained in Annex F of the CIDB Standard for Uniformity in Construction Procurement (July 2015) as published in Government Gazette No 38960, Board Notice 136 of 2015 of 10 July 2015.

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The Standard Conditions of Tender make several references to the Tender Data for details that apply specifically to this tender. The Tender Data shall have precedence in the interpretation of any ambiguity or inconsistency between it and the Standard Conditions of Tender.

#### T1.2.2 TENDER DATA

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Submissions must be made on official tender documentation issued in electronic format by the eThekwini Municipality. Electronically downloaded documentation (see Cl. H.1.2) should be printed in its entirety, and suitably bound by the tenderer.

 Electronically downloaded documentation will not be obtainable from the National Treasury's eTenders website. The entire document should be obtained electronically on EThekwini Municipality website.

#### **F.2: TENDERER'S OBLIGATIONS**

- **F.2.1 Eligibility**: A Tenderer <u>will not</u> be eligible to submit a tender if:
  - (a) the Tenderer does not comply with the legal requirements as stated in the Employer's current SCM Policy;
  - (b) the Tenderer cannot provide proof that he is in good standing with respect to duties, taxes, levies and contributions required in terms of legislation applicable to the work in the contract;
  - (c) the Tenderer fails to attend any Compulsory Clarification Meeting;
  - (d) in the event of a Compulsory Clarification Meeting, the Tenderer fails to have form "Certificate of Attendance at Clarification Meeting / Site Inspection" (in Part T2.2) signed by the Employer's Agent or his representative.
  - (e) in the case of JV submissions, two or more JV entities have common directors / shareholders or common entities tendering for the same works.
  - (f) at the time of closing of tenders, the Tenderer is not registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD) as a service provider. In the case of a Joint Venture, this requirement will apply individually to each party in the Joint Venture.
- F.2.1.1 **Eligibility**: Only those tenderers who are registered (as "Active") with the CIDB (at time of tender closing), in a contractor grading designation equal to or higher than a contractor grading designation determined in accordance with the sum tendered, or a value determined in accordance with Regulation 25 (1B) or 25(7A) of the Construction Industry Development Regulations, for a CE class of construction work, are eligible to have their tenders evaluated.

Joint ventures are eligible to submit tenders provided that:

- (a) Every member of the joint venture is registered (as "Active") with the CIDB (at time of tender closing);
- (b) The lead partner has a contractor grading designation in the CE class of construction work and has a grading designation of not lower than one level below the required grading designation; and
- (c) The combined contractor grading designation calculated in accordance with the Construction Industry Development Regulations (2013) is equal to or higher than a contractor grading designation determined in accordance with the sum tendered for a CE class of construction work or a value determined in accordance with Regulation 25 (1B) or 25(7A) of the Construction Industry Development Regulations.

# **CIDB Registration**

Tenderers are to include with their submission a printout of their registration with the CIDB, obtained from the CIDB website ( https://registers.cidb.org.za/PublicContractors/ContractorSearch ).

The Joint Venture Grading Designation Calculator should be used when submitting as a Joint Venture ( <a href="https://registers.cidb.org.za/PublicContractors/JVGradingDesignationCalc">https://registers.cidb.org.za/PublicContractors/JVGradingDesignationCalc</a>).

The date of obtaining the above printouts is to be indicated on the printout. Registration with the CIDB must be reflected as "Active" at time of tender closing.

#### **Tax Clearance**

SARS has introduced a new Tax Compliance Status System. Tenderers can submit a Tax Compliance Status PIN (TCS PIN) instead of an original Tax Clearance Certificate. This TCS PIN can be used by third parties to certify the taxpayer's real-time compliance status.

Separate Tax Clearance Certificates / TCS PINs are required for each entity in a Joint Venture.

#### **Central Supplier Database** (CSD)

The entities (full) Registration Report, obtained from the National Treasury Central Supplier Database, is to be included in the tender submission ( <a href="https://secure.csd.gov.za">https://secure.csd.gov.za</a>).

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Separate CSD Registration Reports are required for each entity in a Joint Venture.

#### **F.3: THE EMPLOYER'S UNDERTAKINGS**

- **F.3.1.1** Respond to requests from the tenderer: Replace the words "five working days" with "three working days".
- **F.3.2 Issue addenda:** Add the following paragraph: "Addenda will be published, electronically on EThekwini Municipality website.
- **F.3.4 Opening of Tender Submissions:** Tenders will be opened immediately after the closing time for tenders. The public reading of tenders will not be done due to health and safety reasons.
- **F.3.11 Evaluation of Tender Offers:** The procedure for evaluation of responsive Tender Offers will be in accordance with the Employer's current SCM Policy, the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (5 of 2000), and the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act Regulations (January 2017).

Functionality shall be scored by not less than three evaluators and the scores of each of the evaluators will be averaged, weighted and then totalled to obtain the final evaluation score. The minimum number of evaluation points for Functionality is **70.** Only tenderers who achieve the minimum number of functionality evaluation points (or greater) will be eligible to have their tenders further evaluated.

Each evaluation criteria will be assessed in terms of five indicators – no response, poor, satisfactory, good and very good. Scores of 0, 40, 70, 90 or 100 will be allocated to no response, poor, satisfactory, good and very good, respectively.

The prompts for judgment and the associated scores used in the evaluation of quality shall be as follows:

#### **Evaluation Schedule One**

- **F.3.13** Acceptance of tender offer: In addition to the requirements of Clause F.3.13 of the Standard Conditions of Tender, tender offers will only be accepted if:
  - (a) The tenderer submits an original valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services or has made arrangements to meet outstanding tax obligations;
  - (b) The tenderer is registered, and "Active", with the Construction Industry Development Board, at time of tender closing, in an appropriate contractor grading designation;
  - (c) The tenderer or any of its directors/shareholders is not listed on the Register of Tender Defaulters in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act of 2004 as a person prohibited from doing business with the public sector;
  - (d) The tenderer has not:
    - Abused the Employer's Supply Chain Management System; or
    - Failed to perform on any previous contract and has been given a written notice to this
      effect;
  - (e) The tenderer has completed the Compulsory Enterprise Questionnaire and there are no conflicts of interest which may impact on the tenderer's ability to perform the contract in the best interests of the employer or potentially compromise the tender process;
  - (f) The tenderer is registered and in good standing with the compensation fund or with a licensed compensation insurer;
  - (g) The employer is reasonably satisfied that the tenderer has in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2014, issued in terms of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993, the necessary competencies and resources to carry out the work safely.
- **F.3.15** Complete adjudicator's contract/appointment: Refer to the New Engineering Contract NEC4 2013 Clause W2 sub clause W2.2 (1) and the Contract Data.
- **F.3.17** Copies of contract: The number of paper copies of the signed contract to be provided by the Employer is ONE (1). Bidder to submit a SOFT COPY of their completed tender submission saved onto a memory stick.

#### F.4 Special Conditions of Contract

#### F.4.1 Tools of Trade and Restrictive Conditions

- A bidder must have one 1 Ton bakkie per plumber (two assistants) and a complete municipal plumbing toolbox.
- A bidder must not be a member/director in more than one companies bidding for this work.
- A bidding company must have a maximum of two plumbers for this work.

#### F.4.2 Price Determination

Prices/ payment rates are fixed for the first twelve months, all price increases will be applicable in the second and third year only. Payment rates are pre-determined per plumber category and payable per hour. The current rates are as per table below:

This is a labour-intensive contract and material is provided by the employer through the relevant line management authorisation. There may be instances where a contractor will be required to procure certain types of material whose specifications, quality standards, quantities will be specified by the Municipality and may also engage specialist services as per operational requirements. Where it has been required to procure material and/ or specialist service, a contractor will be paid: the invoice amount + 10% of such invoice amount. Authorizations for variation orders will be in line with the eThekwini Municipal financial limits pertaining to the approval of payments.

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#### F.4.3 Work Allocation

The programme operates on a 14-day shift basis depending on operational requirements and budget availability, upon which work is allocated accordingly.

The extent of the work is not known until the burst or leaking pipe is exposed, which makes it difficult to get quotations prior to starting the work. The shift method overcomes the time delays associated with the quotation and task order process.

This mode of operation is intended to continue into the foreseeable future. An information technology programme, Plumbing Contractors System (PLC), is used to, among other functions, equitably allocate and rotate plumbers on shifts. This prevents possible manipulation of the shift roster.

#### **F.5 Contract Monitoring**

The responsibility for monitoring the contractors will be governed by:

- i) The Service Level Agreement (SLA) in the first instance.
- ii) The individual activities of contractors will be monitored by the user departments.
- iii) The Administration department will be responsible for enforcing payment and budget process controls.

There will also be performance monitoring and evaluation of contractors after every 6 shift cycle.

#### The additional conditions of tender are:

#### ACT.1 Appeals

In terms of Regulation 49 of the Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations persons aggrieved by decisions or actions taken by the Municipality, may lodge an appeal within 14 days of the decision or action, in writing to the Municipality. All appeals (clearly setting out the reasons for the appeal) and gueries with regard to the decision of award are to be directed to:

#### ACT.2 Prohibition on awards to persons in the service of the state

Clause 44 of the Supply Chain Management Regulations states that the Municipality or Municipal Entity may not make any award to a person:

- (a) Who is in the service of the State;
- (b) If that person is not a natural person, of which a director, manager, principal shareholder or stakeholder is a person in the service of the state; or
- (c) Who is an advisor or consultant contracted with the municipality or a municipal entity.

Should a contract be awarded, and it is subsequently established that Clause 44 has been breached, the Employer shall have the right to terminate the contract with immediate effect.
