In this phase <u>all</u> bids that met all the requirements in terms of the submitted proposal per the above set of mandatory requirements will be evaluated as follows:

Please Note: Aerial resource typing for Helicopters is according to the international ICS fire typing standard. For assistance to the bidders please see below definitions and detail for the resources requested in this tender.

For the purpose of this tender:

The term "aircraft" refers to a helicopter, spotter and Fixed Wing Bomber (AT 802) aeroplane with operational/technical capabilities as specified below

1. Type 2 (Medium size) helicopter

- 1.1 The helicopter of Type 2 (Medium size) must have an ability to hover out of ground and take in a minimum of 1200 litres water in the collapsible Bambi type bucket over sea, dams or waste water from waste water treatment plants, etc. This includes the wetting agent/ fire retardant.
- 1.2 1.2To be equipped with an on board ±100lt. chemical tank with foam injection system with a discharge mechanism for applying the required volume of fire suppressant or retardant chemicals to the water in the Bambi type bucket.
- 1.3 A minimum cruise speed of 195 km/hour.
- 1.4 Ability for start-up procedure to be completed in 8 minutes and ready for take-off thereafter.
- 1.5 Be able to climb at minimum of 500 m/min.
- 1.6 Fuel consumption to maximum 300 ltr/hr
- 1.7 Cargo Hook ability, for underslung lifting.
- 1.8 From time to time the helicopter will also be used for trooping, a minimum of 8 personnel with equipment at a time.
- 1.9 Flight endurance to be at least 2 hours.
- 1.10 Ability to operate in high wind conditions.
- 1.11 All Helicopters to be equipped with a spare Bambi type bucket of a minimum capacity of 1200 litres with the capacity to dispense the wetting agent/fire retardant.

Note: Service provider can be requested to supply more than one resource for the duration of the contract period on an as and when needed basis.

2. Type 1 (Large Helicopter):

- 2.1 The helicopter of large size must have an ability to hover out of ground and take in a minimum of 3200 litres water in the collapsible Bambi type bucket over sea, dams or waste water from waste water treatment plants, etc. This includes the wetting agent / fire retardant.
- 2.2 To be equipped with an on board chemical tank of minimum 400lt. with a foam injection system and programmable discharge

- mechanism for applying fire retardant chemicals to the water in the Bambi type bucket.
- 2.3 Power to be supplied by two twin turbine engines operating on Jet A –
 1 or illuminating paraffin. Engine power minimum of 2250 Shaft Horsepower each.
- 2.4 Ability for start-up procedure to be completed in 8 minutes and ready for take-off thereafter.
- 2.5 Limiting maximum wind speed conditions for main rotor start-up: 90 km/hr.
- 2.6 Turbines to be effective in high temperature conditions up to + 50 degrees Celsius.
- 2.7 Cargo Hook ability for under slung lifting.
- 2.8 From time to time the helicopter will also be used for trooping, a minimum of 12 personnel with equipment at a time.
- 2.9 Flight endurance to be at least 3 hours.
- 2.10 Fuel consumption to maximum 600 ltr/hr
- 2.11 Ability to operate in high wind conditions.
- 2.12 Hover ceiling 3600 m and service ceiling 5500m
- 2.13 All Helicopters to be equipped with a spare Bambi type bucket of a minimumcapacity of 3500 litres with the capacity to dispense the wetting agent/fire retardant

3. Spotter Aeroplane:

- 3.1 Engine power of not less than 172 kW or 230 bhp
- 3.2 Able to reach a cruising speed of 220km/h or 135 mph
- 3.3 The flight endurance to be at least 4 hours
- 3.4 Service ceiling of 3600 m or 1200 ft.
- 3.5 Minimum take-off weight 1818 kg.
- 3.6 Crew space for pilot plus 3.
- 3.7 Fuel consumption of not more than 60 litres per hour.
- 3.8 To be fitted with on board civil aviation approved radio equipment for communication with the helicopter, dispatch centre and incident commander on the fire ground.
- 3.9 Rate of climb 4 m/s or 800 ft per min.

4. Fixed Wing Bomber:

- 4.1 Engine power of not less than 1007 kW (1350HP)
- 4.2 Be able to reach a cruising speed of not less than 170 mph
- 4.3 Crew space (pilot only)
- 4.4 Fuel consumption of not more than 350 litres per hour.
- 4.5 Fuel capacity of not less than 961L
- 4.6 To be fitted with on-board civil aviation approved radio equipment for communication with the Spotter, Helicopter, and dispatch centre.
- 4.7 Lift a minimum of 2500l of water from a 800m runway
- 4.8 Rate of climb not less than 700 ft per minute at maximum take-off weight
- 4.9 Minimum water carrying capacity of 2500L
- 4.10 Fitted with a programmable fire retardant or foam system with 70L of foam with the capacity to dispense the wetting agent/fire retardant.
- 4.11 Fitted with a programmable bombing computer to maximize effectiveness of loads on different types of fuels. Computer allows a more or less dense drop to be carried out according to IC's request
- 4.12 Reaction time of less than 5 minutes from start-up to take-off.

- 4.13 The flight endurance of 2.5 hours plus reserves.
- 4.14 Operation temperatures of up to 48°C.
- 4.15 Ability to operate in wind conditions of up to 55 kts.

Qualification Threshold – Bidders must achieve 80% per the criteria for consideration to the next phase. Bidders who fail to comply with the set minimum threshold of 80% per the technical requirements <u>will</u> be eliminated.

TERMS OF REFERENCE – APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO RENDER AERIAL FIRE FIGHTING SUPPORT SERVICES IN THE CAPE REGION (TABLE MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK; WEST COAST NATIONAL PARK; TANKWA NATIONAL PARK; BONTEBOK NATIONAL PARK; AGULHAS NATIONAL PARK)

INTRODUCTION TO SANPARKS

SANParks was initially established in terms of the now repealed National Parks Act, 57 of 1976 and continue to exist in terms of the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 57 of 2003; with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: 25 public entity.

Our vision is to have a world class system of sustainable National Parks reconnecting and inspiring society.

Our mandate is to deliver of Conservation Mandate by Excelling in the Management of a National Park System

Our mission is to develop, expand, manage and promote a system of sustainable national parks that represents biodiversity and heritage assets, through innovation and best practice for the just and equitable benefit of current and future generations.

The Parks under the management of SANParks are divided into 6 regions:

Furthermore, SANParks oversees the management of the parks and provide strategic guidance and support from its Head Office in Pretoria.

BUSINESS UNIT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE BID

The Fire Management Department of Table Mountain National Park (TMNP) is situated at the Newlands Fire Base and is responsible for Integrated Fire Management within the Park. The Fire Management Department supervises the employment of approximately 90 contract fire-fighters and also makes use of dedicated fire-fighting vehicles, not only for fire suppression, but also for prescribed burning and fuel reduction burns. The Park attends to anything between 80 – 130 fire incidents on an annual basis with the use of helicopters to assist trained ground crews becoming more important given the increase in the urban wildland interface and the visitor use in the Table Mountain and other parks in the Cape Region.

CONTEXT OF THIS PROCUREMENT

National Parks within the Cape Region is situated within a natural fire prone ecosystem and faces an annual challenge of dealing with devastating and costly wildland fires. The outcome of this Bid is to ensure that adequate aerial fire-fighting capability exists throughout the Cape Region to assist National Parks when dealing with wildland fires, especially on the Wildland Urban Interface (WUI).

In light of the above, SANParks intends to appoint a SERVICE PROVIDER to provide Aerial Fire Fighting Support Services as per the below Contract Period.

The successful SERVICE PROVIDER must be an accredited aerial support service provider fully registered with the South African Civil Aviation Authority (SACAA) as a licenced operator to perform *G8 Fire Spotting, Control and Fighting and G15 Under Sling and Winching services (Air Service Licensing Act, 1990 – Act No 115 of 1990).* The Aircraft Operators Certificate (AOC) must be in the name of the Bidder, **failure to submit the AOC will result in the disqualification of the Bid.**

SANParks requires the services of one (1) helicopter and one (1) spotter for the high fire season for the duration of the contract period on a standby basis:

CONTRACT PERIOD

The hiring of the Aircraft will be for a period of five (5) years.

The service provider will be expected to render a service within 2 weeks of appointment however the normal annual fire season standby service will be indicated below.

The service provider will be requested to make the Aircraft available to SANParks between the 10th November and 30th April (with the possibility of extending the services until the 10th May) of each year.

SPECIFICATIONS/SCOPE OF WORK

1. DUTIES OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

- 1.1. The SERVICE PROVIDER must be able to provide SANParks with 1 (one) Type 2 helicopter with at least 1200L capacity as well as fixed wing command and control aircraft (spotter). The SERVICE PROVIDER must ensure that 1 (one) Type 2 helicopter is available on standby (immediate dispatch) with flight crew between the 10th of November to 30th April daily including public holidays for the duration of the period of the contract.
- 1.2. The SERVICE PROVIDER must on request from SANParks be able to make available additional aircraft (helicopters) on a Call When Needed Basis including (one) Type 1 Chopper and maintain aerial suppression operations on multi day fires events without interruption.
- 1.3. Throughout the Hiring Periods the SERVICE PROVIDER shall ensure that the Aircraft is properly maintained and that the same is serviced and overhauled in accordance with the Civil Aviation maintenance schedules as approved by the Civil Aviation Authority in the Aircraft's country of origin and as approved by the Commissioner for Civil Aviation of the

- Republic of South Africa at the SERVICE PROVIDER's own expense. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide SANParks with satisfactory proof of this on request.
- 1.4. SANParks shall afford the SERVICE PROVIDER or his agent an opportunity to inspect all parking and landing facilities employed by SANParks for the Air Services and to satisfy itself that they meet the operational and safety requirements as stipulated by the Commissioner for Civil Aviation. If the SERVICE PROVIDER is not so satisfied then SANParks shall rectify the shortcomings prior to the commencement date of any Agreement entered into between SANParks and the SERVICE PROVIDER.
- 1.5. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall at its own cost and expense provide the necessary competent flight crew (as per flight manual) required for the Aircraft in order to fulfil its obligations in supplying the Air Service to SANParks. The SERVICE PROVIDER hereby warrants that it is aware of the qualifications required of the pilots flying the Aircraft and that the pilots and flight crew employed by it to render the Air Services to SANParks as required in terms of this Bid possess such qualifications, are properly trained, licensed and qualified to render the said Services.
- 1.6. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall remain the general employer of the flight crew members and no obligation shall be placed upon SANParks to observe the provisions of any statutory laws regulating the relationship between the SERVICE PROVIDER and the flight crew members.
- 1.7. The costs pertaining to the landing and parking fees for the Aircraft, where applicable, for the duration of the Hiring Periods shall be borne by SANParks. During the Hiring Periods the Aircraft shall be parked, while awaiting call outs, on the helipad at Newlands Fire Base, Union Avenue, Newlands, Cape Town, or at any other location identified by SANParks.
- 1.8. If for any reason the helicopter is out of service, the SERVICE PROVIDER must provide an equivalent replacement helicopter for the duration of this period at the approved tariff.
- 1.9. The SERVICE PROVIDER must ensure that enough fuel is available for incidents and an Aerial Support Vehicle must be available to accompany helicopter if necessary.
- 1.10. SANParks shall pay no ferry fees whether to or from the Western Cape to the SERVICE PROVIDER for the duration of the services.
- 1.11. SANParks shall provide accommodation to the SERVICE PROVIDER at no cost on condition that the SERVICE PROVIDER makes available 4 (four) hours of flying time for training purposes to SANParks during each Hiring Period.

2. CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE USE OF THE AIRCRAFT

- 2.1. The SERVICE PROVIDER or its flight crew shall have the sole discretion as to whether or not conditions relating to the operation of the Aircraft are favourable or not. Should the SERVICE PROVIDER or its employees decide that conditions relating to weather or light and the like are unfavourable or dangerous, they may decide in their own discretion not to operate the Aircraft aforesaid.
- 2.2. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall begin operating the Air Service on the commencement date of the above mentioned Hiring Period.
- 2.3. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall only allow competent and properly trained and licensed pilots to operate the Aircraft for the purpose of conducting the Air Service.
- 2.4. The SERVICE PROVIDER undertakes to keep up-to-date all log books and other records in connection with the Aircraft so leased which are required by Statute or official regulations in force from time to time.
- 2.5. It is specifically recorded that SANParks will co-ordinate all requests for the use of the Aircraft for firefighting and that all such requests be documented in a "Captains Log Book" and signed by the Captain of the Aircraft and the Incident Commander of SANParks on duty.
- 2.6. The SERVICE PROVIDER's Aircraft flight crews will be responsible to ensure that the quality of the fuel is in accordance with the requirements of the Aircraft operating manual, and that all fuel issues and replenishment are properly recorded and accounted for. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall be liable for all costs of fuel required to operate the Aircraft for the purpose of providing the Aircraft Services.
- 2.7. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall ensure that the Aircraft is fitted with the necessary equipment to allow the Aircraft to be used for Fast Roping (Fast Rope Insertion Extraction System FRIES). The Fast Roping equipment (gantry, ropes, etc.) will be supplied by SANParks. Such equipment shall only be installed and utilized once all the technical installation and operational requirements have been met, as per the requirements of South African Civil Aviation Authority.
- 2.8. The helicopter must have a suitable chemical tank on board to supply chemicals to the bambi bucket. Furthermore a spare bucket needs to be available as a back up.
- 2.9. From time to time the helicopter will also be used for trooping or reconnaissance and must be able to accommodate a minimum of six (6) fire-fighters/personnel at any time.

2.10. The SERVICE Provider on request from SANParks will also make available additional aircraft on a "Call When Needed Basis." The "Call When Needed Basis" will include Type 3 Helicopters (Small Helicopters such as the Bolkow 105 Messerschmitt or similar); additional Type 2 Helicopters (Medium Size helicopters such as the Bell 205 UH-1H HUEY helicopter) and Type 1 Helicopters (Large Helicopters such as the Blackhawk) or similar/equivalent helicopters as per the Typing listed in this document.

3. CREW STANDBY REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 The SERVICE PROVIDER shall at all times ensure that the following standby requirements are met:
- 3.1.1 Standby by the Aircraft flight crew will be determined by the daily Fire Danger Index (FDI) forecasts which will be provided twice a day by the TMNP Newlands Dispatch Centre.
- 3.1.2 The Aircraft flight crew will be on standby on a daily basis as follows:
- 3.1.2.1 Forecast FDI CODE BLUE: Crew will be deemed to be off duty
- 3.1.2.2 Forecast FDI CODE GREEN: Crew on one (1) hour call
- 3.1.2.3 Forecast FDI CODE YELLOW and above: Helicopter crew shall be on standby at Newlands Quarters as requested by SANParks Incident Commander and in terms of regulations governing aircrew flight and duty periods.
- 3.1.2.4 The Incident Commander, should it deem it necessary, may request that the Aircraft remains on standby at a location other than Newlands Fire Base.

4 DISPATCH AND COORDINATION

- 4.1 SANParks will provide the necessary infrastructure in terms of a desk top computer, trunking radios, air band radios, telephone, copier/scanner facilities as well as Internet Access.
- 4.2 The SERVICE PROVIDER will appoint Dispatcher(s) at no additional cost to SANParks.
 Dispatchers will be employed as follows; 2 (two) Dispatchers as from the 01st December 30th
 April and one (1) Dispatcher from 01st May 30 November.
- 4.3 The Newlands Dispatch Centre will dispatch and co-ordinate the movements of all SANParks resources, i.e. not only aerial resources but also crews from TMNP Contract fire-fighters; crews from WoF and the Volunteer Wildfire Services (VWS) during fire suppression activities.
- 4.4 The Dispatcher(s) will be responsible for the following:
- 4.4.1 Dispatch the necessary resources to fight fires within the geographical area of the Cape Region.

- 4.4.2 Request additional resources from other Dispatch Centres at the request of the TMNP Incident Commander.
- 4.4.3 Liaise with the City of Cape Town Fire and Rescue Services Regional Fire Control, regarding reporting of a fire, status of a fire and the deployment of resources at a fire.
- 4.4.4 Keep an events log of the entire operation, complete the necessary fire reports as well as all other reports in terms of the SANParks dispatch procedures.
- 4.4.5 Disseminate daily current weather and FDI weather forecasts to the Aircraft crew.
- 4.4.6 The Newlands Dispatch Centre will be manned from 10h00 to 18h00 daily unless:
- 4.4.6.1 The FDI is Blue then the Dispatch Centre will be closed and the Dispatcher will be on cell phone availability.
- 4.4.6.2 From first light to last light should aerial operations be active.

5 **INSURANCE**

- 5.1 The SERVICE PROVIDER shall ensure that the Aircraft leased to SANParks is insured against all damage however caused to the Aircraft for the duration of the contract period and will indemnifies SANParks against any claim in respect of damages to the Aircraft arising out of an accident or due to any other cause howsoever arising while the Aircraft was stored, maintained, serviced, used or operated in terms of the contract period.
- 5.2 The SERVICE PROVIDER undertakes to provide public liability insurance cover to the reasonable satisfaction of SANParks, but not less than twenty million rand (R20 000 000) covering the SERVICE PROVIDER's liability arising to any third party for any and all damage caused from any cause howsoever arising whilst the Aircraft is on the ground or in flight, taking-off, landing, or otherwise used, stored, maintained, operated in any manner or for any purpose contemplated during the contract period.

6 STORAGE OF AIRCRAFT

6.1 While the Aircraft is parked at the helipad of Newlands Fire Base, Newlands Forest, Union Avenue, Newlands, Cape Town, it shall be at the SERVICE PROVIDER's risk. The SERVICE PROVIDER will waive all claims against SANParks for any loss or damage to the Aircraft whether caused by the negligence or otherwise of the CLIENT or its employees. The provisions of this Clause apply to the Hiring Periods as well as to any other periods of time during which the Aircraft may be parked at the Newlands Fire Base.

Monthly Standing Charge: SANParks shall pay the SERVICE PROVIDER standing charges per month payable in advance on the first working day of the month following presentation of the invoice on the 20th day of the previous month.

Operational Flying Hours: Over and above the aforesaid Monthly Standing Charge, SANParks shall pay an hourly rate (which will be a wet rate where the SERVICE PROVIDER pays the fuel) for the utilization of the Aircraft as shown in Table 2.

Should any additional aerial firefighting resources be required in terms of the Call When Needed Basis, the SERVICE PROVIDER will supply the aircraft to SANParks according to the rates supplied in Table 2.

Flying time is to be measured with a Hobbs meter or similar instrument which is fitted to the aircraft.

SANParks will pay the SERVICE PROVIDER per litre for fire suppressant chemicals supplied by the SERVICE PROVIDER based on a 0.5% concentration per volume of water delivered.

SANParks shall pay the SERVICE PROVIDER per km for the use of the Aerial Support Vehicle (ASV) when used to refuel the aerial resources.

Bidders are required to provide a detailed and comprehensive price proposal i.e. all costs associated with the bidder's proposal must be clearly specified and included in the Total Bid Price.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. - (b) The contracted supplier undertakes to assign in writing to SANParks all contract intellectual property and which may invest in the contracted supplier.

The contracted supplier shall keep the contract intellectual property confidential and shall fulfil its confidentiality obligations as set out in this document.

The contracted supplier shall assist SANParks in obtaining statutory protection for the contract intellectual property at the expense of SANParks wherever SANParks may choose to obtain such protection. The contracted party shall procure where necessary the signatures of its personnel for the assignment of the contract intellectual property to SANParks, or as SANParks may direct, and to support SANParks, or its nominee, in the prosecution and enforcement thereof in any country in the world.

The contracted supplier hereby irrevocably appoints SANParks to be its true and lawful agent in its own name, to do such acts, deeds, and things and to execute deeds, documents, and forms that SANParks, in its absolute discretion, requires in order to give effect to the terms of this clause.

The rights and obligations set out in this clause shall service termination of this contract indefinitely.

Confidentiality

The recipient of confidential information shall be careful and diligent as not to cause any unauthorised disclosure or use of the confidential information, in particular, during its involvement with SANParks and after termination of its involvement with SANParks, the recipient shall not:

- (a) Disclose the confidential information, directly or indirectly, to any person or entity, without SANParks' prior written consent.
- (b) Use, exploit or in any other manner whatsoever apply the confidential information for any other purpose whatsoever, other than for the execution of the contract and the delivery of the deliverables or
- (c) Copy, reproduce, or otherwise publish confidentiality information except as strictly required for the execution of the contract.

The recipient shall ensure that any employees, agents, directors, contractors, service providers, and associates which may gain access to the confidential information are bound by agreement with the recipient both during the term of their associations with the recipient and after termination of their respective associations with the recipient, not to

- (a) Disclose the confidential information to any third party, or
- (b) Use the confidential information otherwise than as may be strictly necessary for the execution of the contract,

The recipient shall take all such steps as may be reasonably necessary to prevent the confidential information from falling into the hands of any unauthorised third party.

The undertakings set out in this clause shall not apply to confidential information, which the recipient is able to prove:

- (a) Was independently developed by the recipient prior to its involvement with SANParks or in the possession of the recipient prior to its involvement with SANParks;
- (b) Is now or hereafter comes into the public domain other than by breach of this contract by the recipient;
- (c) Was lawfully received by the recipient from a third party acting in good faith having a right of further disclosure and who do not derive the same directly or indirectly from SANParks, or
- (d) Is required by law to be disclosed by the recipient, but only to the extent of such order and the recipient shall inform SANParks of such requirement prior to any disclosure.

The recipient shall within one (1) month of receipt of a written request from SANParks to do so, return to SANParks all material embodiments, whether in documentary or electronic form, of the confidential information including but not limited to:

- (a) All written disclosures received from SANParks;
- (b) All written transcripts of confidential information disclosed verbally by the SANParks; and
- (c) All material embodiments of the contract intellectual property.

The recipient acknowledges that the confidential information made available solely for the execution of the contract and for no other purpose whatsoever and that the confidential information would not have been made available to the recipient, but for the obligations of confidentiality agreed to herein. Except as expressly herein provided, this contract shall not be construed as granting or confirming, either expressly or impliedly any rights, licences or relationships by furnishing of confidential information by either party pursuant to this contract.
