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SECTION 1: TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. The South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) is a juristic person under the National Qualifications Framework Act, 67 of 2008 (NQF Act) and a schedule 3(A) national public entity under the Public Finance Management Act, 1 of 1999. SAQA performs its statutory functions subject to the NQF Act and is responsible for overseeing the implementation and further development of the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) and ensuring the achievement of its objectives.
- 1.2. The objectives of the NQF are to –
 - 1.2.1. create a single integrated national framework for learning achievements.
 - 1.2.2. facilitate access to, and mobility and progression within, education, training and career paths.
 - 1.2.3. enhance the quality of education and training; and
 - 1.2.4. accelerate the redress of past unfair discrimination in education, training, and employment opportunities.
- 1.3. The NQF consists of three qualifications sub-frameworks (for [a] General and Further Education and Training, [b] Higher Education and [c] Trades and Occupations) and its objectives are designed to contribute to the full personal development of each learner and the social and economic development of the nation at large.
- 1.4. SAQA is the custodian of the NQF, co-ordinates the three qualifications sub-frameworks and plays a pivotal role in the entire education and training sector.

2. SAQA'S CURRENT INFRASTRUCTURE AND PROCESSES

SAQA's current infrastructure and processes include the following:

- 2.1. Workflow system (online and admin modules) for the evaluation of foreign qualifications (JAVA platform).
- 2.2. Electronic SAQA Certificate of Evaluations (eSCoE) for the issuing of evaluation certificates in real-time (AWS).
- 2.3. Verification System (MS Database) for the verification of South African qualifications.

- 2.4. VeriSearch (. XSS- cross-site scripting & C sharp); online Searchable database for qualifications and part-qualifications registered on the NQF (National Learners' Records Database - Oracle).
- 2.5. Registers for Fraudulent and Misrepresented Qualifications (Ms Excel).
- 2.6. Recruitment website, intranet, and the SAQA website (DRUPAL).
- 2.7. Online workflow tracking system for Qualifications and Part-Qualifications (in development- Microsoft.Net)
- 2.8. Risk tool (Development- (PHP).

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUIRED

The implementation of the Chatbot connected to the website, WhatsApp and social media platforms including Facebook, LinkedIn, and Twitter for SAQA's Authentication Services that consists of verification of South African qualifications and evaluation of foreign qualifications will include but not limited to the following:

- 3.1 Ensuring that SAQA's national verification and foreign evaluation clients can follow-up on the progress of their applications;
- 3.2 Ensuring that SAQA's national verification and foreign evaluation clients get responses to Frequently Asked Questions;
- 3.3 Ensuring that communication between SAQA and its national verification and foreign evaluation clients remain private with end-to-end encryption and multi-factor authentication; and
- 3.4 Any other enhancements to the system/tool.
- 3.5 The required solution/service must:
 - 3.5.1 Cater for approximately 10 000 users per month;
 - 3.5.2 Integrate with SAQA systems in realtime using API for processing of client enquiries;

3.5.3 Interact with SAQA clients on social media platforms such as Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter and SAQA website; and

3.5.4 The solution/system must be resilient and ensure service operations continuity.

4. **DURATION OF CONTRACT**

4.1. SAQA will enter into a twenty-four (24) months contract (SLA/PO) with the recommended service provider.

5. **EVALUATION OF BID**

5.1. The bid will be evaluated in 5 stages:

5.1.1. Stage 1: Administrative compliance

5.1.2. Stage 2: Mandatory requirements

5.1.3. Stage 3: Functionality evaluation

5.1.4. Stage 4: Price and B-BBEE

5.2. **Stage 1: Administrative compliance**

5.2.1. Bids will be screened to ensure compliance with all administrative requirements.

5.2.2. Bidders must ensure that they complete and sign all bid documents and that they attach all required documents, including the Central Supplier Database details and information required by the RFQ.

5.2.3. Bids that do not comply with administrative compliance may be disqualified by SAQA.

5.3. Stage 2: Mandatory requirements

- 5.3.1. Bids will be evaluated to ensure compliance with all mandatory requirements in order to advance to Stage 3: Functionality Evaluation.
- 5.3.2. Bidders must provide proof of partner accreditation/s or reseller letter regarding the solution/platform they are proposing.
- 5.3.3. Bids that do not comply with the mandatory requirements will be disqualified.

5.4. Stage 3: Functionality evaluation

- 5.4.1. Bids will be evaluated and scored against the evaluation criteria set out below. A bid will be disqualified if it does not meet a “minimum rating to qualify” indicated for a criterion.

5.4.2. A bidder must obtain a minimum of 80 points for functionality to qualify for evaluation on Price and B-BBEE. Bids scoring less than 80 points for functionality will be disqualified.

5.5. Stage 4: Price and B-BBEE

5.5.1. Bidders must complete the pricing schedule SBD 3.1 and submit it in a separate envelope.

5.5.2. Only qualifying bids will be evaluated in accordance with the 80/20 preference point system, as contemplated by the Preferential Procurement Framework Act 5 of 2000 and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017.

- 5.5.3. Preference points will be awarded as contemplated by Regulations 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017 for attaining the B-BBEE status level in accordance with the table below:

- 1.1 The maximum penalties will be limited to 20% per month of the total monthly service delivery costs.
- 1.2 Should SAQA issue a service deficiency notice to the Service Provider more than twice in any rolling 6-month period, SAQA shall be entitled, but not obliged, to immediately terminate the contract in writing.
- 1.3 SAQA shall be entitled to deduct from any monies payable to the Service Provider, an amount equivalent to the value of any substandard performance or non-performance of any or all of the Services by the Service Provider. SAQA, acting reasonably, shall in its discretion determine the amount of the deduction.
- 1.4 Without detracting from any other obligations of the Service Provider, the Service Provider shall render the Services in accordance with the service levels, timeframes and subject to the penalties set out above.
- 1.5 The Service Provider shall not be entitled to any service credits should the Services be delivered within or ahead of target timeframes.
- 1.6 The deduction of a penalty by SAQA does not exempt the Service Provider from resolving the performance deficiency timeously, nor does it prevent SAQA from deducting further penalties until the performance deficiency is resolved by the Service Provider to SAQA's satisfaction.

1.7 SAQA reserves the right to enter into Service Disputes at any point in time with the view of contract cancellation, should the deliverables not be met on time during a Service Dispute, the service provider shall continue to render services per these service levels.

1.6 The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

- (c) “**bid**” means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (d) “**Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act**” means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);

- 2 It serves as a declaration to be used by institutions in ensuring that when goods and services are being procured, all reasonable steps are taken to combat the abuse of the supply chain management system.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
- 3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:
 - a. disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors have abused the institution's supply chain management system and or committed fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such system.
