This notice is issued in terms of **Clause 3.2.1 of the Conditions of Tender**, which allows the Cape Town Stadium (RF) SOC Limited (CTS) to issue notices that amend the tender documents.

1. Briefing Session Summary

A non-compulsory briefing session was held on **23 October 2025** at DHL Stadium. The following documents are attached to this notice:

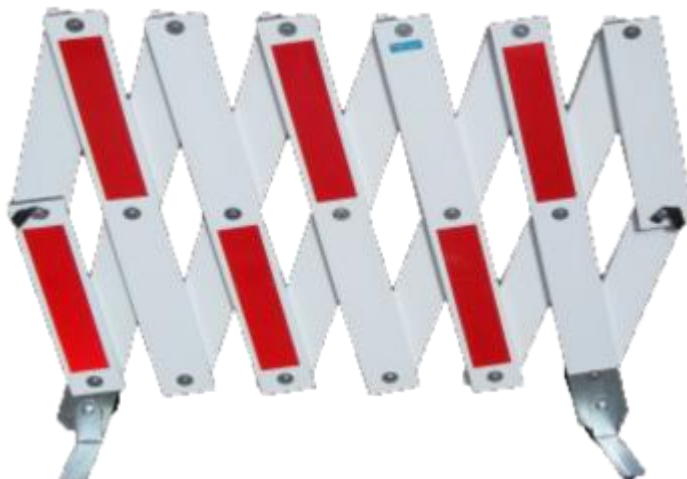
Tenderers are reminded to acknowledge receipt of this notice and insert it into their tender submission in accordance with **Clause 2.6.1 of the Conditions of Tender**.

2. Responses to Questions

The following clarifications are provided in response to questions received from bidders:

- Q1: Two-way Radio – What type of radios are required?
A1: Handheld digital radios are required. A repeater must be installed in the roof to ensure coverage.
- Q2: Portable GPRS/GPS Communications – What does this refer to?
A2: This refers to a Security Officer Tracking Device.
- Q3: Tagging System (Monitoring Patrols on Foot) – Please clarify.
A3: CTS currently uses the Bloodhound System for patrol monitoring.
- Q4: Hand-held Metal Detector – Are Garrett devices required or are cheaper alternatives acceptable?
A4: Garrett devices are preferred, but alternatives may be considered if they meet operational requirements. Where bidders intend on providing an alternative, please provide the specifications/technical sheets for the proposed alternative.

- Q5: Walk-Through Metal Detector – Can we get a specification sheet?
A5: The below are examples of the type of equipment, but is not prescriptive as bidders are allowed to tender on alternative brands/products:
a) ZKTECO D1065S – 6 Zone Security Walk Through Metal Detector
- Q6: X-Ray Belt Scanner – Can we get a specification sheet?
A6: The below are examples of the type of equipment, but is not prescriptive as bidders are allowed to tender on alternative brands/products:
a) ZKTECO ZKX5030A – X-ray Inspection System. The unit must be mobile and not fixed.
- Q7: Base Radio – What type is required?
A7: Two base stations are required (one in the VOC and one in the Control Room). They must be compatible with the handheld radios deployed.
- Q8: Online (Electronic Occurrence Book) – Can we use our own system?
A8: Yes, suppliers may use their own in-house system, provided it can send email notifications.
- Q9: Golf Carts – How many seaters and are weather enclosures needed?
A9: Two 4-seater golf carts are required. No weather enclosures are needed.
- Q10: Emergency Evacuation Chair – Can we get a specification?
A10: A basic emergency evacuation chair is required. The below are examples of the type of equipment, but is not prescriptive as bidders are allowed to tender on alternative brands/products:
a) Evac Chair 300H.
- Q11: Traffic Cones – How many should be included?
A11: Bidders are to provide a rate per cone, as the amount used can fluctuate depending on operational requirements. On average CTS deploys around 50 cones at a time.
- Q12: Traffic Barrier – What specifications should we use?
A12: The barrier must be:
a) Extendable
b) Minimum size: 1m x 3m
c) Reflective red & white
d) Resistant to high winds



Q13: Anemometer – Can we get a specification sheet?

A13: Minimum specifications include:

- a) Digital display
- b) Minimum wind speed measurement: 40 m/s
- c) Mobile/handheld

Q14: Noise Level Meter – Can we get a specification sheet?

A14: Minimum specifications include:

- a) Digital display
- b) Measurement range: 30 dB to 130 dB
- c) Mobile/handheld
- d) Battery operated

Q15: Light Meter – Can we get a specification sheet?

A15: The below are examples of the type of equipment, but is not prescriptive as bidders are allowed to tender on alternative brands/products:

- a) Major Tech MT943.

Q16: Could you please confirm the contract inception date, as the fees for the first 12 months are fixed?

A16: The contract will commence on 01 July 2026.

CTS is aware of the PSIRA increases which will come into effect after the closing date and prior to the contract implementation. Bidders are referred to Point 6 of the Pricing Instructions in this regard.

Q17: I have submitted tenders previously and therefore should be registered on the Stadium supplier database. Can you please confirm my supplier registration number?

A17: CTS does not have its own supplier database. Bidders are to ensure that they are registered on the City of Cape Town supplier database. Bidders are therefore referred to the City's official website in this regards: <https://www.capetown.gov.za/City-Connect/Register/Business-and-trade/Register-as-a-supplier>.
