Bidders must ensure that bids are delivered timeously to the correct address. If the bid is late, it will not be accepted for consideration. Bidders must ensure that they sign off the submission register at the SIU's reception when delivering their proposal. Failure to sign the bid may result in the bid being disqualified/disadvantaged. Bidders must advise their respective couriers/drivers of the above instruction(s) to avoid misplacement of bid.

For those that prefer to use post office, they are required to follow up and to make sure that the bid is received and deposited in the tender box on or before the closing date and time.

Bidders are required to deliver their bid to the correct address timeously for the SIU to consider it. The SIU will not consider the bids received later than stipulated closing date and time.

Late bids will be returned to the bidder/not accepted at all.

Bidders must submit their bid response on the official bid invitation forms (NOT TO BE RE- TYPED) with additional information provided on attached supporting schedules. The SIU provides the checklist "Returnable Documents" at the end of the bid invitation of all required documentation with certain documentation mandatory for entering the evaluation phase.

Non-submission of these marked documents on Table B will lead to disqualification of the bidder.

#### **Bid Opening Procedure**

There will be a public bid opening of the bids received on Bid Box after the closing time, 11h00am. The bidder's name and B-BBEE status level will be read out to those who are present and, same information will be published on the SIU website (<a href="www.siu.org.za">www.siu.org.za</a>).

The bidders' proposal should be marked with the Bid number, Project name and Bidder's name. The financial offer will not be part of the bid opening.

#### **Rejection of Bids**

SIU reserves the right to reject submitted proposal if deemed necessary. Should it be discovered by the SIU that the bidder did not act in good faith and/or has provided incorrect/false information and/or has in general declared incorrectly/falsely, SIU reserves the right to disqualify or reject the bid and to take any further action deemed necessary in such circumstances.

- The SIU reserves the right to disqualify a bid proposal if the bidders' proposal is not compliant with the scope of work/terms of reference,
- The bidder is subjected to due-diligence process which includes, screening, vetting, and/or any best practice that may subject SIU to comply including its Policies and Procedures.
- The SIU reserves the right to disqualify a bid if the bidder fails to provide reasonable request (s) within reasonable timelines this includes the set deadline per request,
- Bid rigging/collusive behaviour by the bidder will result in disqualification. A bidder is not permitted to submit proposal from more than one registered company with a common director/shareholder.
- This bid is subject to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act and the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022.
- This bid is subject to the general Conditions Contract and Special Conditions of Contract as stipulated in this invitation.

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# **Stage 1: Administrative Compliant documentation**

#### THE BIDDING PROCESS

#### This bid is evaluated through a three (3) stage process

# **Stage 1 - Compliance to Administrative Requirements**

Bidders warrant that their proposal document has, as a minimum, the specified documents required for evaluating their proposals as per Table A above.

The SIU evaluates only bids responses that are 100% acceptable, in terms of the Returnable Document List. The SIU will disqualify bidders that are not compliant with the mandatory checklist, as such they will not proceed for further evaluation.

# Stage 2 - Mandatory Requirements.

The bidders will be evaluated as per the mandatory requirements under Table B above. The SIU evaluates only bids responses that are 100% acceptable.

FAILURE TO PROVIDE OR MEET ALL THE MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION AND THE BID WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR FURTHER EVALUATION.

# Stage 3 - Functionality Desktop Evaluation

The SIU evaluates each bidder's response to the specifications issued in accordance to published evaluation criteria and the associated scoring set outlined in this bid invitation.

The SIU will, where circumstances justify, request evaluation sessions such as interviews/presentations/site-visit/pitching sessions/proof of functionality sessions with short- listed bidders before concluding the evaluation. These sessions will form part of the evaluation and will by no means be an indication that the bidder is officially appointed.

Only bidders who achieved the minimum predefined functionality/quality threshold of **42 out of 60 points** on **desktop evaluation** will proceed to Stage 4 (Presentation evaluation). Bidders who score below minimum threshold of **42 out of 60 points** on desktop evaluatio will be disqualified from further evaluation/consideration.

#### Stage 4: Presentation evaluation

This stage will only be conducted to the bidder(s) who scored minimum of **42 out of 60 points**. Bidders must achieve a minimum of **30 out of 40 points** under Presentation Stage to progress to Price and preference (Specific Goals) points (**Stage 5**).

### Stage 5 - Price and Preference (Specific Goals)

Bidders who score a minimum quality threshold of <u>30 out of 40 points on Presentation</u> will proceed to be evaluated on Price and Preferences (Specific Goals).

#### **Bid Procedure Conditions:**

#### **Counter Conditions**

The SIU draws the bidders' attention that amendments to any of the Bid Conditions or setting of counter conditions by bidders will result in the invalidation of such bids.

#### **Award Criteria**

- Bid will only be awarded to the bidder who passes SIU's Internal Integrity Unit screening and/or State
  Security Agency vetting; failure to pass could result in SIU not awarding the bid to a bidder irrespective
  of the points scored after the final evaluation.
- The SIU reserves the right not to award a bid if the bidding entity's financial statements and/or supporting financial information creates doubt to the SIU, in its sole discretion, that the bidder would not be able to meet its short- and longer-term financial commitments.
- SIU reserves the right to screen the bidder in terms of its own Internal Integrity Unit (IIU) before appointment, should such screening results have a negative outcome, the SIU reserves the right not to award the bid to the subjected/recommended/highest scoring bidder.
- The SIU reserve a right not to award a bid to the highest scoring bidder but to award to a service provider who meet the requirement fully.
- SIU reserve a right to conduct due diligence to confirm the contactable reference letters / reference
  documents provided. The due diligence method will be determined by the SIU which may include
  requesting reference letters from the referee.
- In terms of SIU's procedures, SIU will subject the prospective bidder to vetting process in terms of State Security Agency (SSA), should such vetting results have a negative outcome as per SSA and SIU procedures, SIU reserves the right not to award the bid to the subjected/recommended/highest scoring bidder.

### Project team requirements:

- Bidders should provide CV for the Proposed Project Manager' Experience
- Proposed Project Manager Qualification, Account Manager should at least have a qualification in Psychology or Social Work
- Technology (Smartphone app/portal) Bidders should provide a methodology demonstrating how the app will work or pictures narrating how the app will work.
- Provide at least Three (3) Contactable Reference letters demonstrating the experience in Public or Private Sector in Employee Wellness services.

Reference letters to be provided must be on the letterhead of the clients, signed by the client
and must include contact person, phone number, email address, delivered audit service and
appointment period/date.

### **Response Preparation Costs**

The SIU is NOT liable for any costs incurred by a bidder in the process of responding to this Bid Invitation, including on-site visits/presentations.

# **Cancellation Prior to Awarding**

The SIU reserves the right to withdraw and cancel the Bid Invitation at any time, prior to the delegated official making an award.

# **Collusion, Fraud and/or Corruption**

Any effort by Bidder(s) to influence the evaluation, comparisons, or award decisions in any manner will result in the rejection and disqualification of the bidder concerned.

# **Fronting**

The SIU, in ensuring that bidders conduct themselves in an honest manner will, as part of the bid evaluation processes and where applicable, conduct or initiate the necessary enquiries/investigation, to determine the accuracy of the representation made in the bid documents. Should any of the fronting indicators as contained in the "Guidelines on complex Structures and Transactions and Fronting", issued by the Department of Trade and Industry, be established during such inquiry/investigation, the onus will be on the bidder to prove that fronting does not exist. Failure to do so within a period of 7 days from date of notification will invalidate the bid/contract and may also result in the restriction of the bidder to conduct business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years, in addition to any other remedies the SIU may have against the bidder concerned.

# **Confidentiality**

The successful Bidder agrees to sign a general confidentiality agreement with the SIU.

#### **Sub-contracting Direct**

The SIU does not enter any separate contracts with a sub-contractor whom an appointed supplier would wish to work with. Bidders are required to indicate on their proposal if they have any intention to sub-contract. Failure to disclose that, may lead to disqualifications/withdrawal of the contract.

#### INTRODUCTION TO THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATING UNIT ("SIU")

The SIU is an independent statutory body established by proclamation R.118 of 31 July 2001, issued in terms of the Special Investigating Units and Special Tribunals Act No. 74 of 1996 as amended ("the SIU Act"). The purpose of the SIU is to investigate serious malpractices, maladministration, and corruption in connection with the administration of State Institutions, state assets and public money as well as any conduct, which may seriously harm the interest of the public. Furthermore, the purpose of the SIU is to institute and conduct civil proceedings in any court of law or a Special Tribunal in its own name or on behalf of State Institutions.

#### **OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT**

The SIU invites suitably qualified and experienced service providers to submit proposals for the Provision of Employee Wellness Programme ("EWP") for a period of three (3) years with an option to extend the contract, at the SIU's sole discretion, and subject to acceptable performance levels of the appointed service provider, by a period of two (02) years.

The programme would be a confidential referral service with a certified employee assistance provider. The service provider should be suitably experienced in the field of employee wellness with at least three (3) years' experience on a range of issues, including but not limited to; counselling on social, legal and financial matters, as well as health management issues.

The SIU structural design supports provincially based model and so the Service Provider will be expected to render services for at least **761** employees across all Provincial offices and all divisions based at the Head Office;

#### **CONTRACT PERIOD**

The contract duration is for three (3) years with an option to extend the contract, at the Special Investigating Unit's ("SIU") sole discretion, and subject to acceptable performance levels of the appointed service provider, by a period of two (02) years.

#### 1. SCOPE OF WORK (TERM OF REFERENCE)

PROVISION OF EMPLOYEE WELLNESS PROGRAMME ("EWP") FOR A PERIOD OF THREE (3) YEARS WITH AN OPTION TO EXTEND THE CONTRACT, AT THE SIU'S SOLE DISCRETION, AND SUBJECT TO ACCEPTABLE PERFORMANCE LEVELS OF THE APPOINTED SERVICE PROVIDER, BY A PERIOD OF TWO (02) YEARS.

The appointed service provider will be responsible for the following:

The project entails the design, implementation and management of a Employee Wellness Programme (EWP). The programme is aimed at all SIU employees and their immediate families (i.e. partner/ spouse/ children/ anyone who live in the same household and anyone who is financially dependent on the employee).

# It is intended to serve the following purpose:

- a) Assisting individual staff members and their immediate families in overcoming personal and work related problems that are likely to affect their performance.
- b) Create a caring and healthy working environment in which individual staff members feel valued.
- c) Promote a healthy living of employees and by extension, their immediate family members.
- d) Improve organizational performance by ensuring that staff members have the necessary support system in place, which will enable them to reach their maximum potential.

N.B The implementation for the below deliverables must not take longer than one (1) month for execution from the date of the award

#### Deliverables as per the scope

The proposed Employee Wellness programmes must address the following:

# a) PHYSICAL WELLNESS

Provide a programme that promotes healthy lifestyle for employees and enhances productivity through:

- Physical Activity
- Good Nutrition
- Healthy Sleep
- Management of Tobacco

#### b) PSYCHO-SOCIAL WELLNESS

Provide a programme that promotes healthy lifestyle for employees and enhances productivity through:

- Management of stress
- Management of economic stress
- Management of alcohol and drugs abuse
- Provisioning of 24/7 counselling services to all employees Audit comments
- Management of mental health
- Management of bereavements

#### c) ORGANIZATIONAL WELLNESS

Provide programmes that enhances effectiveness and efficiency of individuals, teams and the organization through:

- Management of change this will include workshops, training sessions, team buildings on topics such as emotional intelligence, conflict management, assertiveness training, diversity management etc (50 sessions per annum)
- Leadership coaching this is mentor coach programme for senior management. Maximum 8 coaching sessions per person (estimated number of managers 20)
- Providing timely wellness communication as per annual wellness calendar

#### d) WORK-LIFE BALANCE

Provide a programme that promotes healthy lifestyle for employees and enhances productivity through:

Management of retirement planning

#### e) HIV/AIDS & OTHER DREADED DISIEASES

- Develop an annual programme with all relevant marketing material, speakers, health professionals etc, aimed at creating the necessary awareness. This must include the commemoration of world aid day.
- Conduct HIV/AIDS awareness programmes and be able to provide basic awareness, peer educator and coordinator training.
- Conducting HIV/AIDS Survey to ascertain level of awareness and behavior patterns and other related issues.
- Developing HIV/AIDS training programmes, manuals and materials
- Providing information regarding the existence of problems of HIV and be able to outline the consequences of transmission of HIV to or from others.

#### Other requirements include:

#### I. EWP SERVICE PROVIDER GENERAL SERVICES

The service provider must:

- Launch of the wellness program to SIU staff members in all SIU Provincial offices.
- Develop and supply employee wellness cards and pamphlets with SIU Logo.
- Conduct monthly induction for new staff where required.
- Assist with the development and review of Employee Wellness related policies and procedures when required.
- Induct Managers and HC Personnel on the Employee Wellness offerings.
- Provide individual Managerial Consultancy for managers. This is a flexible response service to give in-depth support to managers' existing relationship with employees. The service includes a formal managerial referral service for employees whose performance is impaired by personal problems as well as the provision of conflict resolution and mediation services.

#### II. 24/7 COUNSELING SERVICES

The service provider must: Provide confidential counselling services on any of the following areas;

- bereavement and loss
- family and relationship problems
- marital problems
- divorce
- physical and emotional abuse
- work related issues
- anxiety, depression and suicidal tendencies
- financial planning and difficulties
- interpersonal communication
- alcohol, gambling and substance abuse etc
- Group trauma
- Provide a muximum of 8 counselling sessions per person, per condition, per year and per family member.
- Provide confidential, unlimited access and 24 hour, 7 days a week counselling services in all South African official languages.
- Only professionally qualified, registered clinicians and specialist will render the services.
- Respond within 3 5 hours on critical incidents (life threatening).
- Recommend intervention that will address prevalent issues based on the reports and or trends in the industry.

- Provide immediate feedback on issues that are of high risk and have potential to bear negative impact towards the organization.
- Provide a 24-hour call back service The service must keep a record of the date and time a call back message
  was received as well as the date and time when the service provider returned the call back message.
- Provide a report on employee complaints received The service provider must provide a report on complaints
  received and how the complaints were resolved where applicable as well as how similar complaint may be
  avoided in the future.

#### III. FINANCIAL AND PHYSICAL WELLNESS GROUP SCHEME

In line with SIU broad wellness strategy and the enhancement of SIU Employee Value Proposition, the SIU may from time to time require Financial and Wellness companies to offer SIU with their various group financial and wellness services at preferential group / company rate to SIU employees. Employees would normally secure these services for themselves at a higher rate as compared to a negotiated group discount e.g. group funeral cover will normally be cheaper as compared to an individual cover sourced directly by an individual.

The EWP service provider will be required from time to time to identify and recommend to SIU say 3 financial or physical wellness service providers that the SIU may select to have a group scheme with.

#### IV. ON SITE PSYCHOLOGIST

Over and above the normal counselling services we require the service provider to provide a Psychologist on site for 4 hours:

Six (6) Small offices – once every month; Three (3) big offices – twice a month; and Head office -once a week.

The programme must includes executives medical checks. This program should help create a comprehensive wellness program that supports the overall well-being of executives and enhances their productivity and job satisfaction.

  - Individual and personalized wellness profile (portal) web log in or smartphone app
- B. Reporting
  - Prepare and provide SIU management with quarterly and annual reports ending on the 31 March of each year
     in a format to be agreed upon between the SIU and the appointed service provider
  - Provide feedback on issues that are of high risk and have potential to impact negatively on the organization and make appropriate recommendations.

Best value incorporates the expertise, experience and technical proposal of the organization and individuals who will be providing the service and the organizational capacity supporting the project team.

SIU is committed to achieving the government's transformation objectives in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) and Preferential Regulation 2022, SIU's Supply Chain Management Policies and National Treasury Practice and instruction note (s).
