Overberg Water is a Schedule 3B Public Entity established in terms accordance with the Water Services Act, Act No 108 of 1997 and owns several Water treatment schemes within the Overberg Region covering the areas of Caledon, Swelledam, Heildelberg and Head Office which is situated in Somerset West.

INVITATION AND SCOPE OF SERVICES

Overberg Water (OW) is inviting Professional Service Providers for the provision of Employee Health and Wellness services on an as-and-when-required basis for a thirty-six (36) months contract period.

CONDITIONS

- (a) Preference will be given to respondents who comply with the Overberg Water Supply Chain Management Policy & Procedures.
- (b) Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) principles and its Regulations, as updated, shall apply, whereby submissions will be evaluated according to the provisions of that Act, its Regulations and the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA).
- (c) Bidders must submit a valid BBBEE Verification Certificate from SANAS Accredited Verification Agency in order to be eligible for empowerment points. The Exempted Micro Enterprises (EME) may submit a sworn affidavit from the Commissioner of Oath confirming its and turnover and black shareholding.
- (d) The following scores will be applied:

(e) Price - 80,

(f) Specific Goals - 20.

1 BACKGROUND

The Overberg Water was established in 1993 with the amalgamation of Duivenhoks and Ruensveld water boards. The Overberg Water is one of the national water public entities under the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS). It exists to complement the work of the department and primarily supports the Minister as the shareholder. It is a water board providing bulk water services in terms of the Water Services Act 108 of 1997 and is subjected to a number of applicable laws such as the Constitution, the National Water Act 36 of 1998, Public Finance Management Act 1 of 1999. Overberg Water discharges its services by placing its customers ahead of the delivery menu. It has a long history of service delivery and placing customers in the forefront since its inception. Overberg Water has been a pillar of hope to its customers in terms of the quality of drinking water. The Head Office of OW is situated in Somerset West which is approximately 40 km from the Cape Town CDB and 30 km from Cape Town International Airport. It also has three water schemes functioning as satellite offices and these are Ruensveld West, Caledon; Reunesveld East Swellendam and Duivenhoks in Heildeberg.

The Overberg Water's area of jurisdiction is the south-western Cape in the west to the Heildeberg/Riversdale districts in the east and bounded by the Langeberg Mountains in the north and by the Indian Ocean in the south. Its area includes the following towns: Caledon, Napier, Bredasdorp, Riviersonderend, Swellendam, Heildeberg, Riversdale and a number of other smaller areas. It is situated in one of the water management areas, namely, the Breede-Olifant Water Management Area (BOCMA). The BOCMA is the sole water resource authority in the catchment. The BOCMA "gives effect to its function to investigate and advise water users on the protection, conservation, management and control of water resources in a cooperative manner".

The Water Board is also responsible for the wastewater treatment plant for the various prisons in the Western Cape.

2.PURPOSE

The primary function of Overberg Water is mainly the provision of bulk drinking water to its customers. Viewing the location of OW schemes within the BOCMA area of jurisdiction naturally creates a symbiotic relation with the BOCMA in managing the water use.

3.VISION

To become the leading regional water utility providing sustainable and competitive water and sanitation services for the region

4.MISSION

To supply and maintain reliable, affordable and good quality water and sanitation services for the region.

5. SCOPE OF THE REQUIRED SERVICE

- a) The role of the Service Provider is to assist Overberg Water (Entity) with Employee Health and Wellness Services as per the expected deliverable/ outcome.
- b) The service is required for the period of thirty-six (36) months to be provided to all offices of the Entity.
- c) Minimum performance requirements during the rendering of such services:
 - The service provider should have specialists, Clinical Psychologists, Counselling Psychologist and/or Social Worker rendering such services
 - The service provider must render professional services to the Entity's employees. The service provider will provide a progress report for individual or group counselling in case of managerial and trauma debrief referrals.
 - The counseling services must be available in the language of choice and must be accommodating for people with disabilities.
 - Critical incident stress/ trauma debriefing must be provided to affected employees between twenty-four (24) and seventy-two (72) hours from the time of request.
 - The service provider must be able to render emergency/ crisis counselling interventions within twenty-four (24) hours upon request.
 - The service provider must assign a Dedicated Client Relations Manager to the Entity.

6. OBJECTIVES

- 1) The objectives of the outsourced Employee Health and Wellness programme are:
 - a) Assist employees in seeking professional help to deal with the challenges that impact on their personal and interpersonal work relationships and/or work-related problems.
 - b) Provide life skills, awareness, and education programme to promote healthy lifestyle choices and coping skills.
 - c) Integrate the various services into the existing Employee Health and Wellness in the Entity in a manner that complements the various support services.
 - d) Build capacity for managers to use the services as well. To identify distressed employees and refer them to appropriate resources.
 - e) Address organizational risk factors that impact employee wellness.

7.ESTIMATED QUANTITIES

The tender will be rates based. The quantities of services given are the best estimate but must not be considered as binding. Overberg Water reserves the right to either increase or decrease the quantities of service ordered.

7.11. Overall Wellness requirement

Develop and implement interventions around, **but not limited to**, the following pillars of Wellness with a focus on providing Counselling Services (including Trauma intervention for issues of Gender-based Violence, abuse and coping with loss amongst others); Life Management Services; Awareness interventions; and Event and programme management for the PIC staff and their dependents:

a) Mental Wellness:

- Stress Management: educating colleagues on techniques such as mindfulness, meditation, and relaxation exercises to help staff reduce stress levels and promote mental well-being within the organisation.
- Emotional Intelligence: helping colleagues to be aware of and manage emotions and empathizing with others' feelings so that it contributes to healthy work relationships and personal growth.
- Self-Care: enabling colleagues to engage in self-care activities, such as pursuing hobbies, practising self-compassion, and prioritizing personal needs which all support mental well-being.
- Positive Thinking: assisting colleagues to cultivate positive thoughts and perspectives so that it promotes optimism, resilience, and a healthy mindset.
- Seeking Help: recognizing when additional support is needed and then assisting colleagues to reach out to mental health professionals or support networks for addressing mental health concerns and maintaining overall wellness.

b) Physical Wellness:

- Regular Exercise: assisting to arrange, engaging and fun physical activity
 events throughout the year, such as Step-challenges, park runs and flexibility
 exercises, and helping to increase the overall fitness level of the corporation.
- Balanced Nutrition: encouraging employees to consume a well-balanced diet including a variety of nutrients, vitamins, and minerals which promote overall health, energy levels, and disease prevention.

- Adequate Sleep: Educate colleagues on the importance of getting enough quality sleep as it is essential for physical and mental restoration, which supports cognitive function, immune system health, and overall well-being.
- Preventive Healthcare: engaging colleagues with routine medical check-ups, screenings, and vaccinations that help prevent illnesses, detect potential health issues early, and maintain optimal health.
- Stress Reduction: Educate colleagues about managing stress through physical activities, relaxation techniques, and adequate rest as they are important for reducing the negative impact of stress on physical well-being.

c) Financial Wellness:

- Budgeting: Assisting employees to create a budget that helps individuals track their income and expenses, enabling them to allocate their money wisely and avoid financial stress.
- Saving and Investing: Helping employees understand smart investment decisions and how they contribute to long-term financial security and future goals.
- Debt Management: Guiding employees with managing debt with strategies like prioritizing high-interest debt repayment, negotiating favourable terms, and avoiding excessive borrowing.
- Financial Literacy: Empowering employees with knowledge and understanding of financial concepts, such as interest rates, credit scores, and investment options, empowers individuals to make informed financial choices
- Legal advice: Able to provide free legal advice when required to employees
- Emergency Preparedness: Guiding employees in creating an emergency fund that can provide a safety net during unexpected events, such as job loss or medical emergencies.

d) Social Wellness:

- Communication Skills: Educating colleagues on effective communication to enable individuals to build healthy and meaningful relationships, fostering understanding, empathy, and conflict resolution.
- Supportive Relationships: Helping colleagues to nurture relationships with friends, family, and colleagues contribute to a sense of belonging, emotional support, and overall well-being. Special training must be available for parents.
- Boundaries and Assertiveness: Educating on setting boundaries and

- expressing oneself assertively allows individuals to maintain healthy relationships while respecting their own needs and values.
- Social Engagement: Assisting with social activities, encouraging participation in group events, and joining communities of shared interests help individuals establish connections and expand their social network.
- Diversity and Inclusion: Empowering colleagues to embrace diversity, promoting inclusivity, and respecting different perspectives by enhancing social wellness and fostering a sense of acceptance and belonging for all. Special management training will be required for managers in this regard.
- Personal Development: Assisting colleagues with understanding and developing plans to assist their personal growth.

8.11 General

- 1.1.1.2. This service must be available for employees and their dependents. It should also be available in all official languages in South Africa and must cater for all mediums of communication:

7. Period of Performance

The service provider will be appointed for a period of thirty-six (36) months. The contract shall commence after signing the contract agreement (Service Level Agreement)/ (Memorandum of Agreement) by both parties and an official purchase order issued to the service provider.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

The 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022 pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, (ACT No. 5 OF 2000) (PPPFA) will be applied to evaluate this bid. The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price and a maximum of 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status Level of Contribution. Bids received will be evaluated on the three (3) phases namely **Mandatory Requirements**, **Functionality Evaluation** and **Price and Preference**.

Phase 2: Technical Functionality Compliance.

Bidders must score at least 75 out of 100 in respect of functionality in order to qualify for advancement to Phase 3. A bidder that scores less than 65 out of 100 will be regarded as submitting a non-responsive bid and will be disqualified. Bidders who fail to obtain a minimum score for each criterion will be disqualified. OW reserves the right to conduct verification. The weight that will be allocated to each functionality criterion is as follows:

1 = poor, 2 = average, 3 = good, 4 = very good, and 5 = excellent

A bidder must meet 75 out of 100 technical mandatory requirements.

- 2. Overberg Water reserves the right to accept the whole quotation or part thereof, or any item or part of any item, or to accept more than one quotation (in the event of a number of items being offered).
- 3. Overberg Water reserves the right to accept an RFP which is not substantially or materially different from the Specification.
- 4. Overberg Water is not obliged to accept the lowest or any RFP
- 5. Overberg Water shall not consider RFP's which are received after the closing date and time for such RFP's.
- 6. Overberg Water will not be held responsible for any expenses incurred by manufacturers in preparing and submitting RFP's.
- 7. - 8. Any RFP submitted shall remain valid, irrevocable and open for acceptance by Overberg Water for a period of 120 days from the closing date.
- 9. A Supplier(s) may request in writing, and after the closing date, that his or her RFP be withdrawn, which withdrawal will be permitted or refused at the sole discretion of Overberg Water after consideration of the reasons for the withdrawal, which shall be set out by the Supplier(s) in such a written request for withdrawal.
- 10. All manufacturers submitting quotations must be registered on National Treasury Central Supplier(s) Database (CSD) as Overberg Water will not award any bid for price quotation to a bidder(s) not registered on the CSD. 1. Acceptance/Contract Commencement and purchase orders

The supplier's offer will be accepted by Overberg Water when a purchase order and/or letter of appointment is issued to the supplier. The date of issue of the purchase order and/or letter of appointment shall be the commencement date of the contract. The supplier undertakes work and incurs expenses prior to the issuing of a purchase order and/or letter of appointment entirely at its own risk. Overberg Water shall only incur liability for payment in terms of this contract if a valid purchase order and/or letter of appointment has been issued to the supplier.

2. Standards

Failure to comply with the Specification and standards as set out in the quotation document shall constitute a material breach, and Overberg Water reserves the right to cancel the contract in terms of Clause 23 of the GCC.

3. Payment- Clause 16 of the GCC

- 3.1 A monthly payment cycle will be the norm. All invoices received for goods and services dated on or before the 20th of a particular month will typically be paid between the 23rd and the 26th of the ensuing month.
- 3.2 More frequent payment to suppliers is not a right.Requests for such payments will be considered at the sole discretion of Overberg Water.
- 3.3 In order to give effect to a more frequent payment cycle (if approved), an additional mid-month payment run will be effected as necessary. The additional payment run dates will be between the 10th and the 13th of the month.
- 3.4 The actual payment run dates will be dependent on the number of days of the month and the influence of public holidays. Suppliers on a 14-day cycle who submit invoices by the 25th of a particular month will be paid between the 10th and the 13th of the next month.

4. Applicable Law - Clause 30 of GCC

4.1 The supplier must comply with the Basic Conditions of Employment Act, Act 75 of 1997 and Amendments including all laws relating to wages and conditions governing the employment of labour and Bargaining Council agreements.

5. Insurance - Clause 11 of GCC

- 5.1 Without limiting the obligations of the supplier in terms of this contract, the supplier shall effect and maintain the following insurances:
- a) Any goods supplied to Overberg Water by the supplier in terms of this Agreement shall be fully and adequately insured by the supplier against any loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery.
- 5.2 The supplier shall be obliged to furnish Overberg Water with proof of such insurance.
