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A4. TERMS OF REFERENCE AND SCOPE OF WORK

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Mandate

The Automotive Industry Development Centre (AIDC) serves to develop the automotive manufacturing sector to globally competitive standards of excellence, through a world-class value proposition that enables effective and sustainable socio-economic growth. The organization was established as a government support centre, to increase the local automotive industry's global competitiveness and to promote Gauteng as the automotive industry investment destination of choice.

The organization is the dedicated developmental agency of the Gauteng Growth and Development Agency (GGDA) in relation to the specific industrial, infrastructure and training needs required by the automotive and allied sector - in particular those based in the Gauteng province.

The AIDC is thus tasked by GGDA with special developmental-oriented projects aimed at retaining and attracting investments in the automotive and allied-related sector with a focus on enterprise development; supporting BBBEE SMME development, skills development and limited logistical infrastructure in line with the Gauteng provincial government's objectives of transformation, modernization and re-industrialization (TMR). The AIDC also undertakes projects related to the transport and energy sectors, as well as the development of the Auto City in the Northern Corridor.

1.2. Vision

To be the automotive industry's thought leader and centre of excellence that promotes industry sustainability and global competitiveness.

1.3. Mission

Navigating the automotive industry's journey towards being an innovative and transformed sector, by providing. agile, reliable, and responsive industry solutions.

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3. BACKGROUND TO THE TENDER

3.1. INTRODUCTION

The Automotive Supplier Park (ASP) is an industrial park based in Rosslyn, the park houses a pool of tenants comprising mainly of component manufacturers and suppliers to Original Equipment Manufacturers. The AIDC develops factories to tenant specification on a long-term lease basis.

The Ford Incubation Centre (FIC) in Silverton plant has established and mentored 10 BBBEE businesses since its inception in 2011. Black business owners are upskilled, coached, and mentored by AIDC growing their businesses through the supply of commodities to the Ford production line for assembly of the Ranger, Everest, and Raptor models.

The Gauteng Automotive Learning Centre (GALC) in Rossyln is a state-of -art facility for skills and development training within the automotive sector. It was launched in 2014 as part of the Gauteng Provincial Government's commitment to skills development. The Learning Centre is part of the Nissan SA Investment Support Programme and is the result of a partnership between Nissan SA and the Automotive Industry Development Centre. The Learning Centre offers training in the latest technologies which match the latest vehicle models.

The Winterveld Enterprise Hub (WEH) in Winterveld; due to its location, it serves to upskill the previously disadvantaged community with informal automotive artisans with little or no skills development or training. The Hub serves to up-skill and support the growth of automotive SMMEs in the Winterveld region.

The critical and expensive equipment in the above-mentioned locations necessitates the need to have control on access and the ability to record movement in the various workspaces. It is therefore critical to install equipment which will support the places in straightening the security of the various investments made. The access control equipment should be able to deliver secure and timely information that leads to greater safety and improved situational awareness of security and operational environments.

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3.2. BRIEF OF THE CURRENT INSTALLATIONS

The biometrics system connects to the host machine located at the Automotive Supplier Park (ASP) in Rosslyn running application server and SQL server that stores unique users' information which generates users reports on the transaction made when they enter and exit the facility.

The current biometric readers are Idemia Morpho Access card and fingerprint readers of make/OEM. There system is integrated through door and cluster controllers. There is also no touch buttons installed. The applications that are running on the host are Morpho Impro, Jarrison, Time and Attendance software. Jarrison time and attendance once off renewal annual license 500 employees, 10 admin users.

The suppliers are to take note of the above for the replacement of software and hardware equipment.

3.2.1. The Gauteng Automotive Learning Centre (GALC).

At GALC, the main clients are the students, who must also be enrolled on the system for time and attendance. The site also has a registration office where all users are enrolled, activate, and deactivated on site by the security office.

3.2.2. Ford Incubation Centre (FIC).

At FIC, the main clients are the incubates, who must also be enrolled on the system for time and attendance. The site also has a registration office where all users are enrolled, activate, and deactivated on site by the security office.

The biometric access control system for FIC was upgraded to Impro Access Portal Pro software.

during August 2023. Detail of the Bill of Material for FIC is provided below on SBD3.

The application server with SQL database, Morpho Impro application is installed at AIDC offices, Rosslyn.

This installation is to be expanded to integrate GALC, ASP and WEH.

The Jarrison Time and Attendance software is installed in the server room at the Ford Incubation Centre offices. The software needs to be migrated to the server at the AIDC offices, Rosslyn. All the necessary equipment and data migration services must be quoted for.

3.2.3. Automotive Supplier Park (ASP).

The AIDC has a biometric system that permits/denies access to Automotive Supplier Park (ASP) and all its sites. The users are utilizing boom gates and turnstiles for routine access to the facilities.

The ASP is the main site that hosts about ± 3000 employees of various tenants who are using the access control system to access the main entrance of the park. At any time, the

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AIDC must be able to print access report of every user for entry and exit. All registration of new users are done at the security main entrance including deactivating of users who are no longer working within the park.

3.2.4. Winterveld Enterprise Hub (WEH).

The WEH is the smallest site with only 5 readers installed within the facility. The users are registered on site.

3.3. THE INSTALLATIONS AT THE VARIOUS SITES.









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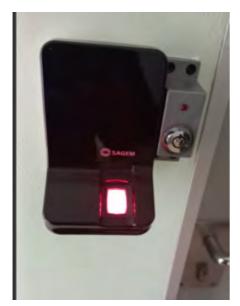
















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3.4. SYSTEM OBJECTIVES

The installation of the biometric access control system is to:

- a) Provide accurate recording of time and attendance,
- b) Production of reports for payment of salaries,
- c) Operational entry point equipment such as boom gates and turnstiles to facilitate quick and exit of various staff, especially those who work in factories,

3.5. SCOPE OF WORK

The AIDC hereby invites competent and experienced bidders to tender on the supply, delivery, installation & commissioning of a fully operational biometric access control system.

The tender is not for a complete refresh of the biometric access control equipment but to replace the faulty equipment and add additional equipment at the identified locations.

The scope of work includes the supply, delivery, installation, and commissioning of a fully operational biometric access control system at the 4 AIDC sites to replace the faulty equipment and add additional equipment at the identified locations.

The biometric access control system at Ford Incubation Centre was upgraded during August 2023. Support and maintenance are required for the equipment for a period of 24 months. Detail of the bill of material is provided below on SBD3.

Support and maintenance will also be required for the existing equipment. Quantities and model of the existing equipment is provided on SBD3.

A single server with a database is to be installed at the AIDC offices.

Database and application software backups are to be scheduled for disaster recovery and business continuity requirements.

The contractors are required to replace faulty biometric access control equipment and related equipment such as:

- Power supply units, door magnets, door retracting arms.
- Door magnetic locks.
- No touch buttons.
- Biometric readers at various doors and turnstiles are to be replaced.
- Identified boom gates, their motors and biometric readers are to be replaced.
- All outdoor biometric readers are to have rain shield protection casings.
- Enrolment desktop to be provided for the AIDC visitor's entrance.

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- Tag and finger registration reader.

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D1. UNDERTAKINGS BY SERVICE PROVIDER IN RESPECT OF THIS BID

1. Definitions:

- 1.1 "The Board" means the accounting authority of AIDC appointed by the Shareholder, GGDA.
- 1.2 "Chief Executive Officer" ["CEO"] means the CEO of AIDC or her/his duly authorized representative as appointed by the Board in concurrence with GGDA.
- 1.3 **"Contract**" shall include any schedule, drawings, patterns, samples attached, any agreement entered into, and all other schedules attached hereto.
- 1.4 "Contractor(s)" means service provider/s whose bid has been accepted by AIDC.
- 1.5 "Cost of materials" means, as and when applicable, the cost of components, parts or materials which are intended for the production, manufacturing or assembling of the goods bid for and which are not produced, manufactured or assembled in the factory where the production, manufacture or assembly of such goods occurs, including freight, landing costs, port charges, import duties and other import costs of such components, parts or materials and all costs in connection with the handling and transport thereof prior to delivery at that factory;
