SECTION 1: PURPOSE

Ingquza Hill Local Municipality intends to plan and survey nine sites in Flagstaff, and Lusikisiki.

SECTION 2: BACKGROUND

The municipality intends to appoint a suitable service provider for the Planning and Survey of nine (9) sites in both Flagstaff and Lusikisiki in line with the Ingquza Hill Spatial Development Framework, Ingquza Hill Land Use Management Scheme, Spatial Planning & Land Use Management By-laws 2016 as well as the Land Survey Act 1997. Three of the subject sites are located within the Lusikisiki commonage and are on the Remainder Erf 49, The Municipality has identified the sites for the following:

- Transfer Station and Pound
- Site adjacent to Erf 166 (5.137m² in extent).

In Flagstaff the subject sites are.

Land-fill site on the remainder of Erf 93 and Erf 142 for the construction of a school, portion of Erf 93 for the Park, Office and a workshop as well as Erf 2644 to create 5 portions for Middle income housing. The municipality requires services of a suitable Service provider to prepare a town planning application, solicit approval, conduct necessary land surveying to obtain approval in the office of the surveyor general.

Proposals are requested from a consortium or team of consultants / service providers who have experience of undertaking activities that will result in the approval by the statutory authorities.

SECTION 3: OBJECTIVES

The main objective of the project is:

- To conduct Planning and Surveying of a site adjacent to Erf 166 used as offices by the Department of Public Works, on the remainder of Erf 49 and Erf 3883 in Lusikisiki to create a portion and Remainder for the creation of a Transfer station and a Pound, the municipality also intends to conduct a Planning and survey of a site identified for the construction of a Land fill site on the Remainder of Erf 93 in Flagstaff, Erf 142 in Flagstaff for the Development of a school, Portion of Erf 93 to create a Park, Offices and a workshop then lastly a portion of Erf 2644 to create 5 portions and a remainder for middle income housing.
- To submit a Land Use Application for approval by the Municipality.
- To conduct pegging and finalize the Draft Surveyor General Diagrams for three (3) sites in Lusikisiki and six (6) site in Flagstaff and submit the draft diagrams to the municipality for the submission to the Office of the Surveyor General.
- Prepare a submission and submit the endorsed draft diagrams to the Surveyor General Office for approval.

SECTION 4: SCOPE OF WORK

The process that is to be followed by the service provider will consist of the following steps:

- Planning and Survey of a portion of Erf 49 in Lusikisiki to create a portion and a remainder of Erf 49 in Lusikisiki.
- Planning and survey of Erf 3883 in Lusikisiki to create Transfer Station and a Pound.
- Planning and Survey of a portion of Erf 93 in Flagstaff to create a Land fill site
- Planning and Survey of Erf 142 in Flagstaff to create a portion and a remainder for the purpose of constructing a school.
- Planning and Survey of a portion of Erf 93 in Flagstaff to create a Park
- Planning and Survey of a portion of Erf 93 in Flagstaff to create Offices
- Planning and Survey of a portion of Erf 93 in Flagstaff to create a Workshop
- Planning and Survey of a portion of Erf 2644 in Flagstaff to create five sites for middle Income residential development
- Pegging of the approved subdivisional plans

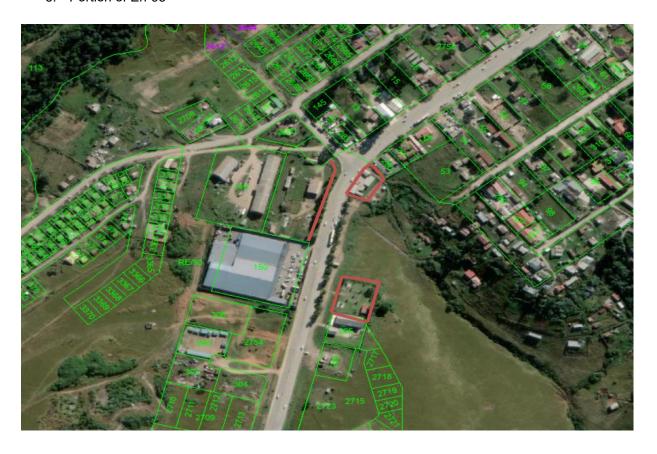

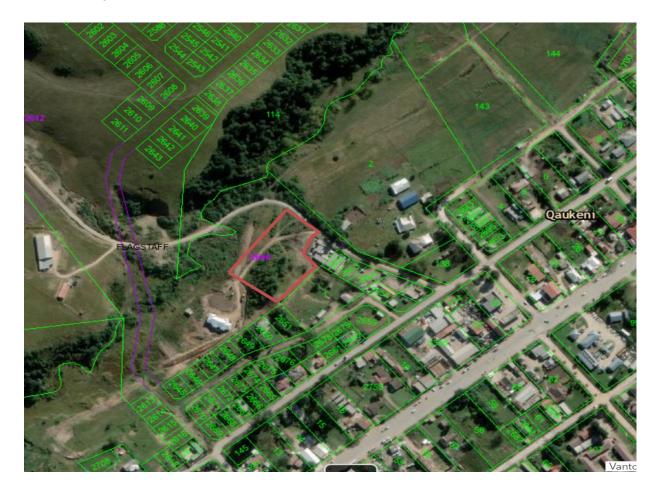
