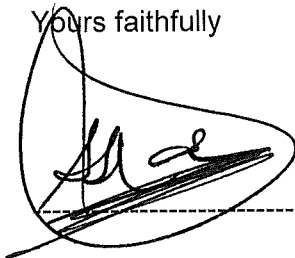

3: SCOPE OF WORK

Namakwa District Municipality requires the services of a suitable, experienced Service Provider for the Procurement of Banking services

1. Scope Of Services:

- 1.1 In terms of regulation 30 of the Local Government: Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations, the Namakwa District Municipality must procure banking services through a competitive bidding process.
- 1.2 Tenders are hereby invited from institutions registered as a bank in terms of the Banks Act, 1990 (Act No 94 of 1990) in the Republic of South Africa to meet the banking needs of the Municipality for a period ending 30 June 2032.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1.1 In terms of the Local Government: Municipal Financial Management Act (MFMA), 2003 (Act No 56 of 2003), a municipality must have a primary bank account and section 8(2) stipulates that the following moneys must be paid into a municipality's primary bank account:
 - 2.1.2 All allocations to the municipality, including other external mechanism assisting the municipality in the performance of its functions;
 - 2.1.3 All income received by the municipality on its investments;
 - 2.1.4 All money collected by a municipal or other external mechanism on behalf of the municipality; and
 - 2.1.5 Any other moneys as may be prescribed.
- 2.1.6 The District Municipality operates one primary bank account for all day-to-day operational activity requirements.
- 2.1.7 The Namakwa District Municipality's investment activities fall outside of this tender as investments would be carried out in accordance with the Cash Management and Investment policy of the District Municipality.

3. SCOPE OF WORK AND MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

3.1. TRANSACTIONAL BANKING REQUIREMENTS

3.1.1 REQUIREMENTS IN RESPECT OF BANKING FACILITIES FOR THE NAMAKWA DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY.

The Namakwa District Municipality requires the following banking facilities:

3.1.1.1 Expenditure Management

- (a) That all payments to creditors are effected by means of Electronic Fund Transfers (EFT);
- (b) The ability to make use of a batch same day service;
- (c) That the banking institution clearly indicates the daily cut-off times for electronic transfer payments to be made;
- (d) That the banking institution provides immediate notification of upfront rejections;
- (e) That the banking institution provides payment facility of third-party accounts via electronic banking (debit orders, batch electronic payments, single electronic payments); and
- (f) That all Investments made be processed via electronic transfers through the main bank account.

3.1.1.2 Salary related payments

That the banking institution has the ability to pay salaries directly into the employee's and political office bearers' bank accounts, taking into account –

- (a) That the vast majority of such payments are processed electronically via Electronic Fund Transfers (EFT) using a "Bulk transactional file exchange system";
- (b) That all transactions debited must contain effective referencing for clear identification. In such instances the EFT batch number should be quoted in the text field. The same procedure is required for "Unpaid" EFT amounts relating to an individual employee payment;
- (c) That the bulk transactional file must accommodate the thirteen-digit bond account numbers relating to third party payments, without manual intervention from the District Municipality; and
- (d) That all Automated Clearing Bureau (ACB) / EFT transactions not completed by due date must be returned to the main bank account within an agreed timeframe of such due date.

3.1.1.3 Revenue management

- (a) Deposits
 - (i) That the banking institution has the ability to receive payments via electronic banking (payments of clients directly into the District Municipality's bank account);
 - (ii) That the banking solution must make provision for online account enquiries;
 - (iii) The ability to identify direct deposits and other transactions/transfers online;
 - (iv) The ability to download deposits in an acceptable and compatible format to enable receipting of deposits in the District Municipality's financial system;
 - (v) That on request, the banking institution provide deposit information for direct deposits by clientele into the bank account of the District Municipality;
 - (vi) The ability to image deposit slips and that it be made available electronically; and
 - (vii) That unpaid items be debited individually on the bank statements and have the same unique identifier reference as the original deposit.

- (b) Automated Clearing Bureau (ACB) collection

- (i) The ACB collection of money from the municipal debtors account, as per the due date provided by the District Municipality;
 - (ii) The debtors account reference be reflected on the ACB file, that is uploaded in bulk onto the banking system, for the collection of funds;
 - (iii) The unpaid ACB transactions reflect the debtors account reference number and the date format on the day that the rejection occurred; and
 - (iv) That proper references be provided for unpaid ACB collections indicating the reason for non-collection. Other

- (a) Bank charges and interest**

- (i) That bank charges and interest for all of the bank accounts in the name of the Namakwa District Municipality must be transferred to the main bank account;
 - (ii) Indicate the interest rate on balances in the current account;
 - (iii) That a monthly tax invoice for all banking charges should be send to the District Municipality electronically.

- (b) Bank statements and reconciliations**

- (i) That the bank statements be sent electronically in the format generally used by the banking sector on a monthly basis;
 - (ii) To download bank statements daily from the online banking solutions, in the file layout format required by the financial systems vendor and uploaded into the bank reconciliation system using the transaction identifier /reference number on the statement to determine the type of transaction;

- (iii) That all bank statement transactions be available to import into the District Municipality's financial system the following business day;
- (iv) That all transactions are clearly and correctly referenced, in an agreed manner to facilitate the bank reconciliation process; and
- (v) That a unique transaction code be allocated to the various transaction types.

(c) Segregation of Duties

- (i) To accommodate the District Municipality's system of delegation whereby provision for different signatories in accordance with the Cash Management and Investment policy that are authorised to release payments;
- (ii) That each EFT be authorized by duly delegated employees of the District Municipality and a list of the said delegated employees will be provided to the Banking institution;
- (iii) To accommodate the segregation of duties between capture and approval of a transaction before processing; and
- (iv) That the internet banking profile also has administrators that can –
 - (aa) add users;
 - (bb) remove users; and
 - (cc) reset users' passwords.

3.1.2 Requirements in respect of information technology (IT)/financial systems for Namakwa District Municipality.

The Namakwa District Municipality requires the following IT / financial systems interface facilities:

3.1.2.1 Bulk Transaction file exchange:

- (a) That a secure solution be provided enabling the District Municipality's financial systems vendor to transfer transactional files to the banking institution's "staging area" directly for processing. The banking institution in turn be able to transfer files (bank statements/rejection files/ redirects etc.) as well as messages (accepted/rejected etc.) to the District Municipality's staging area directly or make files available in its staging area for collection by the District Municipality;
- (b) That the banking institution documents their preferred end-to-end secure solution;

- (c) That all data is transmitted in a secure and encrypted form. The banking institution be able to encrypt files for transmission and decrypt files received from the District Municipality;
- (d) That the format of the files be in the format that can be created in the financial systems vendor programming environment. The banking institution be able to provide the source code for this, if it is not already part of the District Municipality's solution;
- (e) That the banking institution's system be able to accommodate transactions of varying values in a single file per transaction;
- (f) That the banking institution's system be able to accommodate more than one payment file per day (no overwriting of previously sent file);
- (g) That the banking institution's system be able to accommodate payments to all banks in one file;
- (h) That the banking institution's system includes the use of control totals to ensure the integrity and completeness of each file's content; and
- (i) That the bank statement files produced by the banking institution be in a format that must be easily converted in the financial systems vendor programming environment. The banking institution be able to provide the source code for this if it is not already part of the District Municipality's solution.

3.1.2.2 Single transaction file

- (a) That an online solution (utilising modems or the internet as a communication medium) be provided for ad hoc payments of small volumes of manually captured transactions;
- (b) That the online solution has a built-in segregation of duties in capturing and approval of transactions before processing; and
- (c) That the online solution has the ability to be used as the backup solution to the bulk transaction file exchange solution described above.

3.1.2.3 Requirements for both the bulk as well as the single transaction file solution

- (a) That a message(s) indicating rejected / unpaid transactions be returned within a reasonable time period;
- (b) That all rejected transaction(s) be returned along with the reference fields provided in the original transaction(s);
- (c) That the banking institution be able to process payments to banking institution's using universal branch codes;

- (d) That branch code verifications as well as electronic reference validations are to occur immediately after any transactions are sent;
- (e) That normal internet e-mail is not acceptable as a mode of instruction for transmission between the District Municipality and the banking institution;
- (f) That the bulk transaction file exchange system and the single transaction file solution be able to accept transactions between the normal business hours on workdays (as long as the District Municipality keeps within the cut-off times for the specific service);
- (g) That bank charges and interest be separately and uniquely coded by the banking institution. Any subsequent adjustments to these entries have the same reference number on the bank statements as the original entry; and
- (h) That the system provides same day, one day and two-day services.

3.1.2.4 Testing Requirements

- (a) That the banking institution provides a testing environment / testing facility at least one month before the start of the contract period or at a mutually agreed upon date; and
- (b) That the banking institution assign staff during the District Municipality's testing process.

3.1.2.5 Implementation and training

- (a) That the banking institution manages a seamless phased-in implementation of the conversion interface;
- (b) That the banking institution provides sufficient time frames for implementation of the different solutions. Identify training requirements and time frames for the implementation of solutions;
- (c) That the banking institution ensures an implementation team is appointed to facilitate smooth transition of banking services to the District Municipality;
- (d) That requires any additional computer hardware or software (and it's cost to the District Municipality, if applicable) that the District Municipality must acquire in order for the proposed banking systems to interface with the financial systems vendor programming environment and / or to operate at the required level of efficiency needs to be communicated to the District Municipality within a reasonable timeframe;
- (e) That the training requirements (and it's cost to the District Municipality, if applicable) that the District Municipality's staff might need to use the proposed banking systems needs to be communicated within a reasonable timeframe; and

- (f) That the banking institution provides the District Municipality with user manuals (if applicable) for the banking system.

3.1.3 OTHER BANK FACILITIES

In addition to the above, the Namakwa District Municipality requires the following banking facilities/services:

- (a) Overdraft Facility (if council resolution is given during tenure of tender)
- (b) Call account facility
- (c) Forward cover
- (d) Foreign currency
- (e) Economic advice/forecasting

3.2 PROTECTION AGAINST FRAUD

3.2.1 The Namakwa District Municipality requires to be protected against all forms of fraud relating to the receipt and payment of cash, and the processing of banking transactions. Such measures should include, but not limited to –

- (a) authorisation of EFT's;
- (b) password control;
- (c) payment mandates;
- (d) security of data;
- (e) credit/debit transactions; and
- (f) full audit trail, etc.

3.2.2 The banking institution's ability to assist the District Municipality in identifying irregularities (fraud) must be indicated.

3.3 EXIT STRATEGY

3.3.1 Should the service provider secured under this contract, not be appointed as the new successful service provider at the end of the contract period, it will be required that they continue providing services at the same terms and conditions until the successful take-over and implementation.

 - 1.10 “Delivery into consignees store or to his site” means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
 - 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
 - 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable.

Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

- 1.13 “Fraudulent practice” means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 “GCC” means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 “Goods” means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 “Imported content” means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 “Local content” means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 “Manufacture” means the production of products in a factory using labor, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 “Order” means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 “Project site,” where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 “Purchaser” means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 “Republic” means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 “SCC” means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 “Services” means that functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 “Written” or “in writing” means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

- 2. Application**
- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.
- 3. General**
- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za
- 4. Standards**
- 4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.
- 5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.**
- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.
- 6. Patent rights**
- 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.
- 7. Performance security**
- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.

- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with

supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

- 11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

- 12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
- (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and

- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

14.1 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.

15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.

15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.

15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

- 16. Payment**
- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.
- 17. Prices**
- 17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.
- 18. Contract amendments**
- 18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.
- 19. Assignment**
- 19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.
- 20. Subcontracts**
- 20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.
- 21. Delays in the supplier's performance**
- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

- 21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause

21.2 without the application of penalties.

- 21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

- 22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

- 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
- (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
 - (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard

the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.

23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

- (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
- (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
- (iii) the period of restriction; and
- (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favorable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security,

damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26.Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27.Settlement of Disputes

27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.

27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,

(a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and

(b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28.Limitation of liability

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

(a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

(b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing language

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

31. Notices

31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice

31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.

32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.

33. National Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme

The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.
